Newark's two police helicopters. While

we are all encouraged by the

revitalization that the City of Newark is

enjoying, this proposed location is

questionable, at best. We certainly

question the risk and reward scenario as

to what benefits this heliplex will

"Helicopter travel doesn' seem to be for the masses, and it certainly wouldn't be for the resident's of our region. As we begin to understand what is at stake here, I would like to share what our four primary concerns are.

potential health issues, clean air
concerns, and, as well, as any type of
environmental issuese In such a
populated air space air pollutant
emissions from these jet fumes sitting on
a pad idling and taking off certainly
need to be analyzed and examined for the
longeterm health of all our residentse

"Finally, the heliplex would create a certain decline in property valuee

Most residents bought in the boom area of the late nineties and early decade. This heliplex would certainly see our homes'

value decline, leading to financial loss for the homeowner.

"We do not believe that any of these issues have been studied or taken into consideration. As a community, we hope to resolve this proposal. However, to be proactive we, as a group, have formed the Coalition Against the Newark Heliplex.

Our group'es focus is to create awareness to our neighbors in all surrounding communities. We have created a petition written with the support of our Congressman, Steve Rothman. This petition represents our uniform challenges against this heliplex."

I'em going to say it againe I love the parke But those rats, I am there every day and every nighte I walk my My children playe My children are doge so upset that I have to come here and tell you to please get rid of the parke I don'et care what'es theree That wood has They are embedded in that parke to goe I could take pictures and videos to show you, as Mr. Wojcik told youe It'es dangerouse This time around I submitted a claim, and they denied mee I don't even care about the moneye I care about the safety of our children.

If your child was in my son's bedroom two months ago, I don's think that park would be there anymores I'ell be honest with you. If you saw the size of that rat, and the babies that I caught, and how sickening I got, and how upset I was, I don's know how you would handle its I really don's. But I had to close that room off for two and a half weeks, and then fumigate it, put a new floor in, a new rug in, buy a new bed,

buy new clothing for my children, and all their friends were afraid to come to my house. Like, what'es my house@

It'es because it'es the rats from the park. They do not go back to the water. They come to our homes. They come to all of our homes. I'em three houses in from the park. Four houses. One, two three, fourth house up. This is not the first time. I can'et afford, number one, to redo anything else in my home. And, number two, I have four children. And their friends are always at my house. I have a very open home. And the kids, they'ere not going to even want to come and play anymore.

So I beg and ask of this town to please, please, do something about the park. I don'et care whatees there. But the rats are dangerous to our home.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Mrs. Hickey, since you seem to be directing some of your comments at me, let me tell you that I'em sentimental about my father and his work. I'em not sentimental about wood that was

built, and I was one of the people that helped to build it. So when you talk about my sentiments, it's about my father and the good that he's done for this community.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: With regard to this playground, and as a mother of a two year old, I wouldn't want to subject my child to any kind of atmosphere that was unsafe. So understand that my sentiments are about my dad, not about the Creative Playground.

MS. HICKEY: Absolutely.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: And the health and safety of everybody, children and parents and the people who live in that area, come before anything else. If what Commissioner Tucci tells us is that there's a serious health and safety concern there, then changes have to be made. And it's a noebrainer. That's what has to happen. I don's think anyone's going to argue with that.

So with respect to some of your comments directed toward me, that's where my sentiments lie about my dad and the things that he did for the Parks and Recreation Department in this community, not about a wooden structure. And that's number one. Number two, have you contacted my office about helping with that abatement, since it seems to be particularly serious around your home? Have you contacted —

MS. HICKEY: No. I have attende-MAYOR COCCHIOLA: You haven't.

MS. HICKEY: I have commented to Mr. Tucci here, and he knows the situation. And, to be honest with you, I do value your sentiments to your father, and all that. And I didn'et mean that in any disrespect.

of Commissioners, the fact that there was a fire in my neighbor's home at 84.

McKinley Street. You might remember it?

It was in the paper last January. One hundred and thirty cats were in the home. The Fire Department effectively fought the fire and brought it under rapid control, and the home is now declared uninhabitable. The home has never been cleaned after the 130 cats were removed. The home continues to have an odor problem, which I detected this morning while standing in my backyard.

I don't know where to go anymore with this problem.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Mr. Story, you sent me a letter and you expressed that there was a rodent problem, and we were out at your property and the property next door, I believe, with Always (ph.) this week, with the rodent control people. Did you see them there?

MR. STORY: I did not see the people, but what I'eve observed in my yard now is an infestation of mice.

92 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: 1 And that was your 2 complaint, and we sent someone out to do some abatement there --3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Mayor? 4 5 Also --6 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: -- within the past 7 two days. 8 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Also, I 9 believe I was at your house and I met 10 your wife. I was with our Deputy Chief of the Fire Department --11 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: 12 Yes. 13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- to see 14 what could be donee So we paid that a 15 visit too, and we'ere working on that as 16 diligently as we can. 17 MR. STORY: You mean you'ere --18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: There'es a 19 lot of legal matters involved with that. 20 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: There'es problems 21 because there's insurance, there's an 22 insurance issue, and there are some legal 23 issues, and we can'et go in and do 2.4 anything to that property other than what

we'ere already done repeatedly with

respect to cleening up the front. We had the grass cut in the past week as well, and we sent someone there to try to take care of the rodent infestation, take a look at it, and bait for that.

Beyond that, at this point in time, I'em not sure what more we could do.

MR. STORY: Frankly, the place has now become a curiosity in the neighborhood. There's many times where I'ell be out in my yard and I see children coming up and down the street. They all pause and call it "the cat house". I'eve watched, this weekend a bunch of teenage boys walked up the street making comments that I overheard my neighbors say on the day when the fire occurred about sating the cates. So it's become a neighborhood curiosity.

I'em afraid that some kid is going to get hurt over there. While you cleened up the front lawn, there are trees, literelly, sprouting this high out of the backyard right now, all scettered about wherever the seeds might have fallen. On

my side of the home and in the backyard the leaves have never been collected for over two years. If a spark ever hits those dry leaves this summer we know what that 's going to do. I have some real public safety concerns.

How that property will eventually be remediated or whatever is with insurance and whatever, but in the meantime there's public safety issues here. There's air quality issues. Your office last year was inspecting that home and detected mold in the home. That was a year ago, before the fire. A lot of water was introduced to that home.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: I never saw a report. I never saw a report from the Health Officer that said that he detected mold in the home, but I'ell go back and check that.

MR. STORY: Go back and look. There was one report where he said mold.

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: I'em pretty familiar with the file.

MR. STORY: And now we'ere introduced

a lot of water to the homee. There was never a proper remediation of that watere. We just closed upe. So whatever water was left in there now is percolating over the summer, along with whatever feces and urine from the cats was left in the homee.

Have we ever done air samples? I know all the firemen's equipment had to be taken out to be professionally cleaned from the firee It couldn'st be just returned to the firehouse and hosed off as would normally be donee

Something has to be done here about the quality of this structure in a residential neighborhoode. It'es akin to what'es going on in this parke

MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We don't have the ability, Mre Story, to go in and touch a residence that's still owned by a private homeownere I'm certain that once she resolves her insurance issue she'ell probably sell the propertye Somebody's going to come in and take that house down and build a new home theree But we can't. We're the Township of Nutleye We

And once I get it in writing, from the prosecutor's office, I'm going to give it to you, because I'em more comfortable having it in writing from them so that there'es no mistaking what the conditions
