the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained, and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Township of Nutley is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. Any grants received by the Township for the purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof are hereby appropriated for said purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof and shall be applicable either to the direct payment of the cost of such purpose or to the payment or reduction of the obligations issued or authorized herein. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Township may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance is 15 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been

filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in the bond ordinance by \$26,006.25 but that the net debt of the Township determined as provided in the Local Bond Law is not increased by this bond ordinance. The obligations authorized herein will be within all net debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$2,375 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ACQUISITION OF WATER METERS, IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$20,580 THEREFOR

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 2 of this ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 2, there is hereby appropriated \$28,580, now available in Water Capital Surplus, as further described in Section 2(a) hereof.

Section 2. (a) The improvement hereby authorized is the acquisition of water meters in the Township of Nutley, including all work, materials and all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto, pursuant to plans and specifications on file with the Township Clerk.

(b) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 3. The capital budget of the Township of Nutley is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local
