24 and all respects of transfer fees have  
25 been paid and the license has been

1 properly renewed for the current license  
2 term. Whereas the applicant is qualified  
3 to be licensed according to all standards  
4 established by Title 33 of the New Jersey  
5 statutes, regulations promulgated there  
6 under, as well as pertinent local  
7 ordinances and conditions consistent with

25 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Whereas the

1 township of Nutley continues to develop  
2 projects that will improve access and  
3 maintenance on public roads, and whereas  
4 the township of Nutley's engineering  
5 department has provided plans  
6 specifically designed to address and  
7 improve traffic flow, safety issues, and  
8 maintenance on our roads.

9 Whereas the township of Nutley has  
10 submitted plans (indiscernible) State of  
11 New Jersey, Department of Transportation  
12 for discretionary aid, local  
13 infrastructure, and will continue to do  
14 so in the future.

15 And, whereas the township of Nutley  
16 has identified Chestnut Street between  
17 Whitford Avenue and Passaic Avenue as in  
18 desperate need of emergent funding to  
19 repair deteriorating roadway conditions  
20 due to extreme weather conditions  
21 experienced this winter.

22 Whereas this roadway is identified  
23 as a critical infrastructure roadway and  
24 that emergency vehicles access this road  
25 on a twenty-four hour, seven days a week

1 basis, for emergent, first-responder  
2 purposes and the current condition of the  
3 roadway is such that it could impede  
4 vehicle access whereby putting the health  
5 and safety of our citizens in jeopardy.  
6 Now, therefore be it resolved that mayor  
7 and commissioners of the township of  
8 Nutley in the county of Essex, state of  
9 New Jersey, formally approves this grant  
10 application.

11 Be it further resolved that the  
12 mayor and clerk are hereby authorized to  
13 submit a SA-96 application to the New  
14 Jersey Department of Transportation on  
15 behalf of the township of Nutley.

16 Be it further resolved that the  
17 mayor and clerk are hereby authorized to  
18 sign the grant agreement on behalf of the  
19 township of Nutley and that their  
20 signature constitutes acceptance of the  
21 terms and conditions of the grant  
22 agreement, approves the execution of the  
23 grant agreement. I move the resolution.

19 cost associated with offsite improvements  
20 necessitate by new development or born by  
21 the developer, not the township.

22 And, whereas M&M is in need of water  
23 main extension permit for 57 East Center  
24 Street project for the State of New  
25 Jersey DEP, Bureau of Water Allocation.

1           Whereas the State of New Jersey DEP,  
2           Bureau of Water Allocation will not issue  
3           a water allocation permit to M&M, unless  
4           the township has a geographic information  
5           system of its water network pursuant to  
6           NJAC 710-11.5c6. And whereas the cost  
7           associated with the water geographic  
8           information system is necessitated by the  
9           new developer. And, whereas chapter 700-  
10          114 of the municipal code permits the  
11          township to require the developer to  
12          provide the necessary systems, or pay for  
13          the cost of the systems.

14                 Now, therefore be it resolved that  
15          the township authorizes acceptance of  
16          payment in the amount of \$35,000 for the  
17          cost of developing and implementing the  
18          water geographic information system by  
19          the Department of Public Works, pursuant  
20          to agreement between the township and M&M  
21          and approved by the township attorney. I  
22          move the resolution.

23 Nutley, New Jersey is operated by the  
24 Nutley Historical Society, and whereas  
25 the Nutley museum serves the preservation



1 and dissemination of the historical and  
2 educational and civic needs of the  
3 community, and whereas the property owner  
4 for 61-65 Church Street is the township  
5 of Nutley. Now, therefore be it resolved  
6 by the board of commissioners, township  
7 of Nutley, county of Essex, State of New  
8 Jersey, that the Nutley museum located at  
9 61-65 Church Street, Nutley, New Jersey  
10 being is hereby exempt from water usage  
11 charges. I move the resolution.

11 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiola?

12 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye. That  
13 concludes the regular business portion of  
14 the meeting, is there member of the  
15 public that would like to address the  
16 board this evening? There is -- good  
17 evening, Mr. Magnifico (ph.☐.

18 MR. MAGNIFICO: Al Magnifico, 160  
19 Park Avenue. Commissioners, good  
20 afternoon -- good evening. I really miss  
21 coming here. I'll probably be coming  
22 here much less, so I wanted -- a couple  
23 of things I wanted to -- to ask about,  
24 being as I've been housed, unfortunately,  
25 medically to my house or apartment. I

1 have too much time to watch T.V. -- watch  
2 the United States senate -- watch all the  
3 government facilities that are trying to  
4 redeem our country back to what it was,  
5 which it will never happen unless they  
6 get rid of half of the senators and  
7 congressmen. I was watching the senator  
8 from Oklahoma, Osborne, the  
9 representative of the Oversight  
10 Commission, today, and he put out a case,  
11 I guess -- what's going on with the  
12 spending of our dollars -- tax dollars  
13 that was absolutely unbelievable. I'm  
14 talking about trillions (indiscernible)  
15 worry that I have about our town. Having  
16 come here in 1964 and bought a house and  
17 then bought another one, et cetera, et  
18 cetera, raised seven kids here  
19 (indiscernible) went to school. Thank  
20 God they all got a good education. I  
21 have no problem with them. I don't see  
22 anything wrong with our school system,  
23 except that we don't have too much input  
24 with it like we used to have. It's  
25 really disturbing me, because I see

1 millions of dollars being sent out.  
2 Right now, I understand that they got an  
3 electric sun system, or they're going to  
4 get it going. That's a system that Tucci  
5 and I and other people had worked on for  
6 the whole community, not just for the  
7 school. When I asked somebody in the  
8 school system about it, oh, well, you  
9 know -- and I said no, I don't know.  
10 We're a community of people. We live  
11 here. We pay taxes. I know what paying  
12 taxes is, because I guess I'm one of the  
13 highest -- 72,000 dollars really -- plus  
14 (indiscernible) 6,000 a month is like  
15 sticking a needle in my neck.

16           Anyway, to make a long story short,  
17 is there any chance that we're going to  
18 be able to reconcile that problem with  
19 this board of education and the  
20 (indiscernible) system? Because we, if  
21 you remember, (indiscernible) came up  
22 with about 40,000 dollars of town  
23 property that was using electricity that  
24 would save us money, as well as the  
25 school system. I don't know what's the

1           stumbling block is. I was told  
2           something, but I don't believe it. I  
3           think it behooves us -- we were talking  
4           about this consolidated services  
5           operation. Is it going to happen or  
6           isn't it? I mean, how can we continue to  
7           tax our community and expect to keep  
8           growing? Kids today don't make the  
9           salaries we did, and some of them can't  
10          get the jobs. I held two jobs. People  
11          are lucky if they have a job today. And,  
12          as a result, you're going to lose people  
13          in the community. Now, where are we  
14          going to get the revenue from? I'm  
15          curious to how much revenue we've  
16          increased with 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 -- seven new  
17          housing projects in the last five  
18          years -- four or five years. We got one  
19          going up with 320 -- 320 something or 220  
20          something apartments. That's revenue.  
21          That's money -- tax money. We had  
22          (indiscernible) -- 128 units? Well,  
23          believe it or not, it's better than  
24          nothing. It's revenue. It's our  
25          revenue. Put that revenue to use -- as

1 (indiscernible) said if we consolidating  
2 our operations so that people know what's  
3 going on, and what's going on with their  
4 tax dollars -- not that he's doing ten  
5 dollars and using ten dollars for another  
6 guy and ten dollar -- it's -- use it all  
7 at once. Can anybody give me the  
8 increase in revenue in this town since  
9 1964 on a yearly basis? Because I know  
10 I -- I know every year, except for the  
11 year that you allowed me to pay on the  
12 old tax (indiscernible) I had to fire, I  
13 have gone up like a rabbit. It's unreal.  
14 I don't know how you expect people to  
15 stay here. I'm employing on my building,  
16 as a ninety percent Nutley township  
17 employment. People from Nutley are  
18 employed there. Ninety-five percent, or  
19 ninety-eight percent are owners that rent  
20 space from me are from Nutley. And  
21 they're paying their town taxes and I'm  
22 paying taxes on my building plus  
23 everything else. And, it's choking --  
24 choking. I know you can't do anything  
25 about it. I talked to -- if you can't,

1 fine. I just -- I just -- it's not just  
2 me. I just -- I'm eighty-two. I'm  
3 thinking about all the kids around that  
4 are growing up yourself -- your children  
5 that are growing up in this town, what's  
6 going to happen to them? They just can't  
7 afford to live in the town. And we're  
8 going to lose a lot of them, and we're  
9 going to get people that we don't want in  
10 here, et cetera, et cetera. I'm just  
11 concerned about it. And, the more I sit  
12 home, unfortunately, the more I find out  
13 from the newscast and the government cast  
14 what's going on. And it bothers me. It  
15 bothers me for this town. I can't get  
16 any answers.

17 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER:

18 (Indiscernible) I can't go back to 1964  
19 off the top of my head, because I was  
20 nine years old back then, but I can go  
21 back and I can say since I've been a  
22 commissioner --

23 MR. MAGNIFICO: Yeah.

24 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: All  
25 right, the tax levy, which determines,



1           you know, what the tax rate is and it's  
2           on what we have to collect since I've  
3           been a commissioner, is almost twenty  
4           million dollars. We're over 100 million  
5           dollar tax levy, and that means that's a  
6           net of revenues -- other revenues --  
7           grants and other things that we -- other  
8           sources of revenue, but the net is levy  
9           is over 100 million dollars and it's up  
10          about twenty -- roughly twenty -- twenty-  
11          one million dollars since I've been a  
12          commissioner. (Indiscernible) in  
13          increasing those costs has significantly  
14          been costs associated with people, the  
15          costs associated with sewer, the costs  
16          associated with our garbage removal, and  
17          so on.

18                 MR. MAGNIFICO: Here's a question on  
19                 that garbage removal. Unfortunately,  
20                 maybe because I talk too much, I'm on the  
21                 board (indiscernible) and --

22                 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER:

23                 (Indiscernible)e

24                 MR. MAGNIFICO: You're right. It's  
25                 my fault -- and they asked me about this

1 garbage removal, and the credits for  
2 garbage removal, and I think I talked to  
3 Joseph about it. There is an allowance  
4 for that, right Joseph?

5 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We pay them.

6 MR. MAGNIFICO: (Indiscernible) --  
7 we have to pay. I forget what the  
8 hell -- heck is name is -- but we have to  
9 pay a private collectore

10 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We either have to  
11 pick it up, Jack, like we would do for  
12 everybody, or we will have -- we have to  
13 reimburse them --

14 MR. MAGNIFICO: That's what I'm  
15 asking about. The reimbursement is to  
16 the town, whether --

17 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We --

18 MR. MAGNIFICO: Do we get reimbursed  
19 for what we're paying the garbage man?

20 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We get  
21 reimbursed --

22 MR. MAGNIFICO: We pay taxes. I pay  
23 480 dollars a month in taxes on my -- my  
24 condo -- my apartment.

25 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Right.

1 MR. MAGNIFICO: Right? Those 480  
2 dollars, all right, should be giving me  
3 some service for the town. I don't get  
4 garbage pick up? Not only do I -- I  
5 don't get garbage pick up --

6 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: You get garbage  
7 pick up from the -- a private  
8 contractor --

9 MR. MAGNIFICO: Right, go ahead.

10 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: -- that we have to  
11 pay for.

12 MR. MAGNIFICO: Who does?

13 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: The township. We  
14 have to provide the service, or we have  
15 to pay for it. That's the only unit that  
16 we pay for because the configuration of  
17 how -- and part of that unit is  
18 Bellville, part of it is in Nutley, and  
19 when the garbage company went there, they  
20 were not able to determine exactly which,  
21 you know -- how much garbage is Bellville  
22 garbage or Nutley? They figured out a  
23 formula and we pay them to have it picked  
24 up.

25 MR. MAGNIFICO: You pay the condo

1 association, right? And you pay them for  
2 the plowing.

3 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We pay -- well, I  
4 don't know about the plowing. I'm  
5 just -- I handle the garbage.

6 MR. MAGNIFICO: Well, you would know  
7 this. State law -- we cannot plow our  
8 own property -- not the insurance-wise.  
9 The liability is too much to the -- the  
10 Hutton (ph.)<sup>e</sup> or whatever you want to  
11 call them -- Fannie Mae, will not allow  
12 us to do what we -- we have to have a  
13 (indiscernible) contractor to do it.

14 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: I think you pay  
15 for the --

16 MR. MAGNIFICO: Oh yeah, we pay for  
17 it.

18 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Yeah,  
19 that's private property. So, you have to  
20 pay for the snow plowing. You have to  
21 pay for the snow plow. We reimburse you  
22 for the garbage.

23 MR. MAGNIFICO: But we can't get  
24 reimbursed for the snowplowing?

25 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Well, we

1 plow the street in front of the condo,  
2 but we don't --

3 MR. MAGNIFICO: Do we plow -- do we  
4 not -- do we not plow Cambridge Heights?

5 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER:  
6 Cambridge Heights is dedicated roadways.

7 MR. MAGNIFICO: Huh?

8 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER:  
9 Cambridge Heights is a dedicated  
10 roadways -- the township roadways. Even  
11 though they were installed by the  
12 contractor, they are dedicated roadways.  
13 The township plows them, yes.

14 MR. MAGNIFICO: Well, all right.  
15 They're not going to fight with us about  
16 it, because I don't want to hurt us.  
17 But, something should be done to level  
18 off the field, as far as the communities.  
19 You're going to have another one up --  
20 it's just being rebuilt -- the one we  
21 just talked about up on East Center  
22 Street, and the one across the street  
23 from East Center Street.

24 (Indiscernible) -- they're  
25 beautiful. The revenue in for us, but we

1 have to do the services for them. That's  
2 going to cost us money.

3 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Sure.  
4 Jack, as you look at things that are  
5 being added, you also have to look at  
6 things that are being taken away. So, in  
7 2005, (indiscernible) demolished a  
8 building that cost every taxpayer on  
9 average a (indiscernible) --

10 MR. MAGNIFICO: And according to the  
11 latest news, you're going to lose more  
12 (indiscernible).

13 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: You're  
14 exactly right.

15 MR. MAGNIFICO: Which is not good.  
16 It's not going to help us. I  
17 understand --

18 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: So, the  
19 point is, we're thankful we have the new  
20 development, because it's softening the  
21 blow.

22 MR. MAGNIFICO: Pick up the slack.  
23 Anything happening on the consolidated  
24 services that we've talked about over the  
25 years?

1 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Jack,  
2 what are you talking -- are you speaking  
3 about the solar panels (indiscernible)?

4 MR. MAGNIFICO: (Indiscernible) --  
5 yeah. And the garages and the buses and  
6 all the garbage that we use.

7 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: We -- we  
8 consolidated and we've been sharing  
9 services for years. We've been offering  
10 that to the board of education. As a  
11 matter of fact, we had several meetings  
12 set up that some of the board members  
13 attended, and that others did not quite  
14 make.

15 With the solar stuff, which I  
16 believe you're speaking about, we read  
17 about it pretty much as you read about  
18 it, and the board president was here to  
19 talk about it a bit, and some of the  
20 information that you just read in the  
21 papers is a bit misleading.

22 They're looking to float, from what  
23 I understand, a seven million dollar bond  
24 ordinance. All right, it's going to be a  
25 referendum, all right? And they're

1 allegedly going to get back 500  
2 thousand -- whatever -- or some odd  
3 dollars a year which will not initially  
4 directly go to offset their bills,  
5 because you're anywhere from five to  
6 seven years to pay back the equipment.  
7 The reason the township, which included  
8 the board of education and all of the  
9 buildings -- this body included them  
10 right from the beginning.

11 And, the plan that we were following  
12 was because we felt it was one town, it's  
13 one tax dollar, and it was the smart and  
14 the right thing to do. Unfortunately,  
15 we're not part of that bond issue. I'm  
16 not even sure that that's a good idea at  
17 this point and time with so many people  
18 hurting and us pinching pennies on this  
19 side -- I'm not so sure that that's the  
20 smartest thing to do, although I am a  
21 very (indiscernible) opponent, as are the  
22 other commissioners here of solar energy  
23 and conservation and a coordinated  
24 comprehensive plan.

25 I'm not so sure that what's being



1 proposed is that. All right?

2 MR. MAGNIFICO: Well, if they  
3 produce, and we allow them to produce and  
4 the solar company that works with them,  
5 enough energy, they can sell it to the  
6 town at a reduced price. And, we can  
7 save money.

8 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Well,  
9 actually they sell it back to the energy  
10 company. They get the extra credits on  
11 the S-racks and that would go to  
12 offset -- you're absolutely right. But,  
13 again, that's not going to happen for  
14 anywhere from five to seven years, until  
15 all of the hardware is in fact paid off.  
16 So, it's not like you're going to  
17 receive, you know, a half a million  
18 dollar reduction on the board of  
19 education side immediately.

20 What we've done on this side, okay,  
21 and I'll be sending a letter to the board  
22 of education, is we joined the  
23 sustainable energy meeting, which is a  
24 group similar to what the (indiscernible)  
25 is where a bunch of communities get

1 together and go out in a reverse auction,  
2 all right, to get the best price on  
3 electricity and natural gas.

4 We've gone out already on  
5 electricity, we saved eighty-five  
6 thousand dollars, okay, which was the  
7 projection -- it was eleven percent off  
8 our electrical bills. Gas -- we're going  
9 out again, because the number that came  
10 in wasn't as attractive as it should've  
11 been. We were involved with public  
12 services -- direct energy installment  
13 program. We're retrofitting all of our  
14 buildings. We have two buildings that  
15 have already been done.

16 All right, and we're going to go in  
17 to complete the remainder of the  
18 buildings to save another ten to fifteen  
19 percent off of our energy bills. So,  
20 we're going to save, without putting any  
21 money out right now, in excess of 100  
22 thousand dollars a year, all right, off  
23 of our energy bills.

24 MR. MAGNIFICO: Right.

25 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: All

1 right, and if and when the time comes,  
2 hopefully it's when, not if, that there  
3 will be money available to actually pay  
4 for the hardware to put the solar panels  
5 up and the thermal panels -- at that  
6 point and time, all right, when things  
7 are financially a lot better, I believe  
8 would be the appropriate time to move  
9 forward, all right, and do something in  
10 that area.

11 Not to add any additional expense on  
12 top of what we already know we're going  
13 to -- to see down the line. And again,  
14 without knowing what are A numbers going  
15 to be and, you know, at this point, it's  
16 still projections that the board will get  
17 more money, but we're not exactly sure  
18 what's going to happen and what the cost  
19 associated with just operating both the  
20 district and the township are going to  
21 be.

22 MR. MAGNIFICO: To (indiscernible)  
23 the thing that you said we should let the  
24 people of the town know. Because, like  
25 myself, it's a lot of them are older --

1 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Let the  
2 people know what, Jack, what the board is  
3 doing?

4 MR. MAGNIFICO: Not what the  
5 board -- what we're trying to accomplish  
6 to cut back on the expenses of living in  
7 Nutley -- under the town of Nutley. In  
8 this particular case, it happens to be  
9 the --

10 UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: I think  
11 we've attempted to do that. We speak  
12 about it in public. We put out different  
13 releases and we notify everyone as best  
14 as we can, I mean, through, you know,  
15 electronic information, through the  
16 newspapers. I mean, I don't know what  
17 else we can do. If you have a  
18 suggestion, I'll be happy to entertain  
19 it. I mean --

20 MR. MAGNIFICO: My suggestion, I  
21 guess is a (indiscernible) because I am  
22 going to be housebound for awhile and I  
23 just -- sitting and watching and getting  
24 all this news, and I'm sorry to bring it  
25 up to you and ask you questions, because

1 I'm not as sure of them. And that's what  
2 I'm asking them. You know, I've been  
3 here a long time and I want to see my  
4 grandchildren live here, et cetera, et  
5 cetera. Thank you very, very much. And  
6 thank you very much, commissioner, for  
7 coming to the V.A. -- to the Veteran's  
8 Council meeting --

9 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Welcome.

10 MR. MAGNIFICO: -- and we'll take  
11 care of that. Thank you very much.

12 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you. Before  
13 we close, I did -- was just handed one  
14 more business item -- one more resolution  
15 to read. Whereas raffle applications  
16 have been received from the following  
17 organizations -- from the Nutley Music  
18 Boosters for license number 16-11 and 17e  
19 11 for on-premise merchandise and 50/50  
20 cash raffles on March 26, 2011 and May  
21 26, 2011. Whereas the applications have  
22 been reviewed and approved by the  
23 municipal clerk and the police  
24 department. Therefore, Be it resolved by  
25 the board of commissioners of the

1 township of Nutley, that the licenses are  
2 approved and the municipal clerk is  
3 authorized to issue the licenses. I move  
4 the resolution.

WHEREAS, the Nutley Historical Society restored the “Church Street School” building to house the Nutley Museum; and


WHEREAS, the Nutley Museum located at 61-65 Church Street, Nutley, New Jersey is operated by the Nutley Historical Society; and






