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1           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Madam Clerk, could  
2 you please read the Sunshine Notice?

3           MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor. Tuesday,  
4 September 20th, 2011. Pursuant to the  
5 requirements of the Open Public Meeting  
6 Law, Chapter 231, Public Laws 1975,  
7 notice of this meeting was published in  
8 the September 15th, 2011, issues of the  
9 Nutley Sun and the Journal. A copy of  
10 this notice has been posted on the Nutley  
11 Town Hall bulletin board and a copy is on  
12 file in the municipal clerk's office.

13           Commissioner Scarpelli?

14           COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

15           MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

16           COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

17           MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans is  
18 absent/excused.

19           Commissioner Tucci is  
20 absent/excused.

21           Mayor Cocchiola?

22           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Here.

23           MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor,  
24 with the exception of Commissioner Evans  
25 and Commissioner Tucci, who are both

1 absent/excused this evening.

2 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thanks. And we  
3 can move right on to correspondence.

4 MADAM CLERK: Okay, Mayor. The  
5 first item of correspondence I have is  
6 from the Friends of the Nutley Singers  
7 requesting to hold a Sunday raffle on  
8 March 11th, 2012. I need a motion,  
9 please.

10 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: A motion.

11 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Moved.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

13 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner  
14 Scarpelli?

15 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

16 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiola?

19 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye.

20 MADAM CLERK: And the last item of  
21 correspondence I have is an event  
22 application submitted by the Nutley  
23 Rotary Club for their motorcycle run  
24 scheduled for Sunday, October 2nd.  
25 And I --

1 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Moved.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

3 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner

4 Scarpelli?

5 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiola?

9 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: That's all for

11 communications and correspondence, Mayor.

12 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you. So

13 let's move on to payment of bills.

14 MADAM CLERK: Okay. Bill list

24 And that's all for bills, Mayor.

25 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Move the

1 bills.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

3 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner  
4 Scarpelli?

5 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiola?

9 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Okay. Thank you,  
11 Mayor.

12 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay.

13 Commissioner Evans is not here this  
14 evening so on his behalf I'll introduce  
15 this ordinance which is an ordinance to  
16 amend an ordinance to fix the salaries of  
17 certain officers and employees of the  
18 Township of Nutley, effective September  
19 1st, 2011. I move that this ordinance be  
20 passed a second reading and advertised in  
21 the Nutley Sun together with the notice  
22 that is required by law and that further  
23 consideration of the ordinance for final  
24 passage by this board be held on October  
25 18th, 2011. So moved.

1 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Second.

2 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner

3 Scarpelli?

4 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

5 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: (Inaudible).

7 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiola?

8 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye.

9 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: And Commissioner

10 Evans also has a public hearing this  
11 evening on ordinance number 317~~8~~, which  
12 is an ordinance to amend an ordinance  
13 codified in the code of the township  
14 entitled Vehicles and Traffic, special  
15 zones and areas handicapped parking,  
16 which adds the location on Howard Place,  
17 west beginning at 54~~2~~ feet west of  
18 Bloomfield Avenue, north for twenty feet.

19 I'm going to open up the public  
20 hearing and ask if there's any member of  
21 the public that would like to address the  
22 board with respect to this ordinance.

23 MR. SCAPERADA: Phil Scaperada  
24 (ph.), 49 Howard Place.

25 MS. ANDO: Cathy Ando (ph.), 49

1 Howard Place.

2 MR. SCAPERADA: First, I'd like to  
3 just ask a few questions just to be clear  
4 on the process, if you don't mind.

5 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay, Mr.  
6 Scaperada, I'm going to answer your  
7 process questions. I'm just looking over  
8 here to see is there somebody -- here  
9 comes Mr. Barry (ph.ø) from code. Okay.  
10 Go ahead.

11 MR. SCAPERADA: Do all the  
12 commissioners -- they obviously vote to  
13 approve this ordinance for the  
14 handicapped parking on the street, is  
15 that correct?

16 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We will all be  
17 entitled to a vote.

18 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. Who bears the  
19 cost for the signage?

20 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: The township.

21 MR. SCAPERADA: Who performs the  
22 actual inspection of the site?

23 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: That I'm going to  
24 ask Mr. Barry to address as soon as --  
25 you can ask your questions and he'll have



1 to address all points that you raise.

2 MR. SCAPERADA: Would you like him  
3 to address them now before I continue or  
4 just keep going?

5 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Well, let's go on  
6 and then, you know, so that you can go  
7 through your questions and then, Mr.  
8 Barry, just take note of the questions  
9 that you're going to have to answer,  
10 okay?

11 MR. SCAPERADA: Were pictures taken  
12 and submitted to all the commissioners  
13 for review?

14 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: I can tell you  
15 that I don't know if pictures were taken.  
16 We don't have any pictures.

17 MR. SCAPERADA: I can provide each  
18 of you with a set of pictures right now,  
19 if you'd like.

20 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: That would be  
21 great. This address -- so you're  
22 familiar with this address. What  
23 addresses are we talking about on Howard  
24 Place?

25 MR. SCAPERADA: I live at 49 -- this

1 is, I believe, 47, the house next door.

2 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: The house next  
3 door to you. Okay.

4 MR. SCAPERADA: On the application,  
5 can someone please -- I have a copy of  
6 the application dates here. Please  
7 indicate the reason you need a  
8 handicapped parking space on the street.  
9 I am handicapped and need a handicapped  
10 parking space for the following reasons -  
11 - could someone please read their  
12 application and let me know what reasons  
13 were submitted?

14 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We don't have it.  
15 Only Commissioner Evans and the code  
16 enforcement department would have the  
17 application.

18 MR. SCAPERADA: Mr. Barry has that?

19 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: He's on his way.  
20 Okay.

21 MR. SCAPERADA: Next question -- how  
22 is the personal identification card  
23 number verified and who does the  
24 verifying?

25 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: -- Mr. Barry will

1 answer that as well.

2 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. And I'd also  
3 like to find out who the placard for this  
4 personal identification card number was  
5 actually registered to? I have a  
6 question with regards to that.

7 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay.

8 MR. SCAPERADA: Personally, I am  
9 speaking out against this spot for the  
10 people who are truly handicapped, and for  
11 my mother who was paralyzed and confined  
12 to a wheelchair for twenty plus years in  
13 which I was a caregiver. I know what  
14 it's like. I have a pretty good idea  
15 what handicap may truly be, and I know  
16 you have to follow the codes, ordinance  
17 and statutes, whatever you want to call  
18 it.

19 I contest this on the grounds that  
20 in reviewing those pictures, the  
21 individual has the ability to park four  
22 vehicles in an expanded driveway, a fifth  
23 vehicle in the garage. The safest spot  
24 from snow, rain, ice, cold and heat is  
25 right where my neighbor parks, which is

1 in the garage where she enters her house  
2 every day. This is what she used to do  
3 with her husband, who was handicapped  
4 with a walker. This is passing -- no one  
5 else lives there and there are no other  
6 vehicles. I provided you the pictures.  
7 According to the example John Barry gave  
8 me last week in a phone conversation with  
9 him, this person would not qualify for a  
10 handicapped parking space in the street.  
11 He said, "If it's a question of a two-car  
12 driveway and the handicapped person will  
13 be the third car, then you really don't  
14 need a sign in the street."

15 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Hold on a minute.  
16 Say that to me again?

17 MR. SCAPERADA: Quote --

18 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Mr. Barry just  
19 walked into the room. Mr. Barry, I'm  
20 going to have you address this matter.  
21 Mr. Scaperada's just gone through a  
22 series of questions about a handicapped  
23 spot which is the subject of Commissioner  
24 Evans' public hearing this evening on 47  
25 Howard Place. I'm going to ask you --

1 I'm going to want you to go through the  
2 whole process of how it's determined to  
3 answer Mr. Scaperada's question, you  
4 know, what you've reviewed, the  
5 application  
6 verification --

7 MR. SCAPERADA: Well, my first  
8 question that wasn't answered was, how --  
9 who inspected the site for the  
10 handicapped parking?

11 MR. BARRY: Your question was?

12 MR. SCAPERADA: Who inspected the  
13 site for the handicapped parking?

14 MR. BARRY: I did.

15 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. And none of  
16 the commissioners inspected the site, is  
17 that correct?

18 MR. BARRY: No. No, that's not the  
19 usual practice.

20 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. I want it on  
21 the application, if somebody could read  
22 to me what the reasons were given for  
23 parking -- asking for a handicapped  
24 parking in the street. What reasons were  
25 given?

1 MR. BARRY: The particular  
2 application made -- I don't have it in  
3 front of me, but the lady stated --  
4 excuse me -- the lady stated that her  
5 driveway, the location of her driveway is  
6 on such a hill that when she tries to  
7 exit the vehicle, she has difficulty. So  
8 I asked her about her -- parking her car  
9 inside her garage which levels out and  
10 she said that's possible but not all the  
11 time and I really have a problem --  
12 pretty steep. I think you live next door  
13 because I met you out there that day when  
14 you came out and asked me who I was.

15 MR. SCARERADA: Because I had a  
16 meeting with Mr. Barry literally hours  
17 before and I wasn't sure if he was  
18 sending someone back.

19 MR. BARRY: Well, (indiscernible)  
20 because I think I mentioned to you that  
21 day. So the lady said to me, she has  
22 extreme difficulty opening the door and  
23 getting out. Now the law states that you  
24 can't -- you can't put a handicapped spot  
25 on an incline over -- I can't recall the

1 number of degrees, so if this lady is  
2 eighty-seven years old and she has a  
3 problem getting out of her vehicle  
4 because of the hill, I could understand  
5 that. And we always -- I tried to -- I  
6 have denied people in the past, but in  
7 this case I thought it would be more  
8 appropriate to grant the application. I  
9 spoke to Commissioner Evans about it,  
10 explained the application and what  
11 happened, and he had no issues with it.

12 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Could I ask a  
13 question? So she's saying she has a  
14 problem -- I'm just looking at the  
15 picture, at the photograph that we were  
16 given. She has a problem in her driveway  
17 because it's on an incline?

18 MR. BARRY: Correct, but she --

19 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: But now she's  
20 going to go to the street and then come  
21 up the steps to the -- and go up an  
22 incline?

23 MR. BARRY: She said it's much  
24 easier for her with the steps. To try to  
25 get out of a vehicle that's on an

1           incline, the door's quite heavy. It's  
2           very difficult. And again due to her  
3           advanced age, in my opinion, it would be  
4           better for her to do it in the manner she  
5           requested.

6           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: So, I'm going to  
7           have a question for you, Mr. Barry,  
8           because I want to understand what the law  
9           says entitles you to a handicapped spot.  
10          And Mr. Scaperada, what I want to ask you  
11          is, if you're the house next door and  
12          this spot is in front of this woman's  
13          house, how does it impact you?

14          MR. SCAPERADA: Well, if I may  
15          continue with some other questions?

16          MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Certainly.

17          MR. SCAPERADA: How does it impact  
18          me? Because I'm insulted, I'm offended,  
19          and in particular, I am here speaking out  
20          on individuals -- for individuals who are  
21          truly handicapped. Okay? In my eyes,  
22          this is a fraudulent and an abuse of a  
23          system in which I'd like to present to  
24          you some other facts.

25          MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay. Go ahead,



1           sir.

2           MR. SCAPERADA: Case in point -- two  
3 plus years ago, she called the police  
4 because I parked in front of her house.  
5 A year and a half ago, I have copies of a  
6 court decision by Judge Viola (ph.ø)--  
7 found guilty of barricading our vehicles  
8 in as well as others in front of her  
9 house. I can provide copies to all the  
10 commissioners.

11           MR. BARRY: If I may, Your Honor? I  
12 don't know if this is relevant to the  
13 application. I was not privy to any of  
14 this information when I received an  
15 application for a handicapped space. And  
16 I went and inspected purely on her  
17 application and what she said to me as  
18 far as the handicapped, so other neighbor  
19 issues I -- were never considered by me  
20 and I don't think rightfully should be,  
21 but that's just --

22           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Well, let's -- in  
23 part you're right. I mean, Mr.  
24 Scaperada, I think there's a history  
25 here. I mean, you've already appeared

1 before this board, but let's confine this  
2 to what Mr. Barry is saying. Are you  
3 saying that you believe there was  
4 fraudulent information presented to the  
5 township for his review?

6 MR. SCARERADA: I'm contesting it.  
7 The safest, most reasonable spot as I  
8 observed over the years -- her husband  
9 was handicapped prior to him  
10 passing away -- with a walker, was in the  
11 garage, getting out and going in the  
12 house. It's a level platform. The  
13 furthest most distance is in the street.  
14 Logically, if the driver's the one that  
15 is handicapped, you're going to open a  
16 car door into the traffic technically.  
17 Further away, it's stairs -- she has  
18 problems on the stairs, a hill. You're  
19 exposed to every single element. Every  
20 single day she parks in her garage or at  
21 the very top.

22 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Mr. Barry, tell me  
23 about the law. A person wants a  
24 handicapped spot in front of their  
25 house -- what do they have to do? What

1 do they do?

2 MR. BARRY: Our procedure is based  
3 on the statute and Mr. Scaperada has a  
4 copy of our application form and our  
5 information letter. He called my office  
6 last week and stated that his father-in-  
7 law was contemplating moving into his  
8 home. Again, I was not aware of all  
9 these neighbor issues, and I explained to  
10 him and I sent him -- mailed him a copy  
11 of our information letter and our  
12 application.

13 On our information letter, the  
14 statute says that a municipality may --  
15 not shall -- may grant a handicapped  
16 parking space in front of a residence.  
17 And it goes on and mentions some  
18 technical issues from the ADA  
19 requirements about no parking on a grade,  
20 or no designating handicapped spot on a  
21 grade, or in any other location that  
22 would be prohibited by law -- no stopping  
23 or standing by a fire hydrant, within  
24 (inaudible), close to a stop sign --  
25 those things that are --

1           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: But you may issue  
2           it on what basis, though? What's the --  
3           I guess you have to supply certain  
4           information in order to evaluate it. I  
5           mean, you can't just give it to anybody.  
6           They have to give you what?

7           MR. BARRY: No, I -- the person has  
8           to present a valid New Jersey handicapped  
9           placard or an identification card to show  
10          that the person residing in that location  
11          does in fact live there. For example,  
12          Mr. Scaperada -- I explained to him that  
13          if in fact his father-in-law did move in,  
14          he would have to get a handicapped spot  
15          that says that that is his residence.  
16          The ID card would say Howard Place or  
17          whatever it was.

18          So this lady came into my office.  
19          She presented the documentation, asked --  
20          filled out an application form, and I  
21          then went up there, I took a look at it,  
22          I listened to her what she had to say  
23          about her difficulties parking on the  
24          driveway. I agreed with it, and I  
25          forwarded to the commissioner and he was

1           briefed and he agreed.

2           MAYOR COCCHIOLA:   And so, but,  
3           ultimately -- I guess where I'm going  
4           with this is we don't have Commissioner  
5           Evans here who signed off on this  
6           application --

7           COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI:   Mayor, I  
8           would recommend we continue the public  
9           hearing --

10          MAYOR COCCHIOLA:   I think we have to  
11          table this --

12          COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI:   -- well, I  
13          don't know if we table it, continue the  
14          public hearing at the next meeting. I  
15          don't know procedurally what we'd have to  
16          do.

17          MAYOR COCCHIOLA:   Is it -- can we --

18          COMMISSIONER PETRACCO:   We could  
19          close the public hearing and table the  
20          vote --

21          MAYOR COCCHIOLA:   No.

22          COMMISSIONER PETRACCO:   -- or just  
23          continue the public hearing.

24          MAYOR COCCHIOLA:   Well, then I want  
25          to continue it when Commissioner Evans is

1 here because I didn't review this, none  
2 of us reviewed it. We're just getting  
3 educated on a law. I mean, it was his  
4 decision and I think he needs to be here  
5 to address --

6 COMMISSIONER SCARABELLI: I agree.

7 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: -- and your  
8 questions, Mr. Scaperada, I understand  
9 them and I don't want them to go  
10 unanswered, but I think the appropriate  
11 person to answer them is Commissioner  
12 Evans.

13 MR. SCAPERADA: Since Mr. Barry is  
14 here, can we just continue on some of the  
15 other -- on the application for the  
16 placard, how do you verify that?

17 MR. BARRY: The application for the  
18 placard?

19 MR. SCAPERADA: The placard  
20 identification number -- where do you  
21 verify it?

22 MR. BARRY: She provides me a copy  
23 with it and --

24 MR. SCAPERADA: Is there a photo on  
25 it?

1 MR. BARRY: I don't know if it's in  
2 my file. I'm pretty sure it is. Not a  
3 photograph but I asked her for a copy --  
4 that's actually on the application.  
5 Please provide a copy and number of the  
6 handicap placard or license plate for  
7 that matter would be on that.

8 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. On the  
9 placard, you're telling me there's no  
10 photo of my neighbor's face.

11 MR. BARRY: No, not at all.

12 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. Is there a  
13 name on the placard?

14 MR. BARRY: No. It's just the  
15 number.

16 MR. SCAPERADA: Because I have a  
17 concern that this placard was in  
18 existence for her deceased husband and is  
19 being continually renewed.

20 MR. BARRY: Well, I could go  
21 downstairs to my office and pull up the  
22 thing and it may have a copy of her  
23 identification card.

24 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: The placard  
25 doesn't have anything on it other than a

1 number. I know that because my mom has  
2 one.

3 MR. BARRY: It's the same as a  
4 license plate number. A policeman can  
5 run that number as similar to a license  
6 plate and the name of the  
7 (indiscernible)e.

8 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Well, then you can  
9 check that.

10 MR. SCARERADA: Furthermore, I'd  
11 like to interject just one more thing to  
12 the commissioners and the mayor. I have  
13 copies of a police report and photos of  
14 my neighbor on a cell phone pulling a  
15 large garbage can down to the street and  
16 proceeding to chain it to the tree and  
17 then placing a traffic cone to block the  
18 spot. This is just a clear intention and  
19 I recommend it to all the commissioners  
20 that you speak with -- this is on 729 and  
21 I have photos of my neighbor doing this  
22 to provide to all of you.

23 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Wait a minute --  
24 what are you telling us she did? She  
25 took a garbage can --



1 MR. SCAPERADA: The photos will  
2 show --

3 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay, we'll take  
4 them.

5 MR. SCAPERADA: And furthermore, I  
6 recommend that you speak to the Honorable  
7 Judge Viola because in court in which she  
8 was found guilty of barricading vehicles,  
9 she tried to explain her rationale that  
10 other neighbors should respect the front  
11 of other individuals' homes and not park  
12 in front of them. He doesn't like my  
13 other neighbors' children parking there  
14 and she didn't like us parking there.  
15 I'm totally opposed to this and I hope  
16 you do the right thing and do not serve  
17 an injustice to the people who are truly  
18 handicapped.

19 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: We're not -- we're  
20 going to continue the public hearing.  
21 Commissioner Petracco, you used to have a  
22 member of the police department who used  
23 to do neighborhood dispute resolution,  
24 didn't you?

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I'm sorry.

1 I didn't hear you.

2 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Didn't -- did you  
3 have Lt. Rogers used to do dispute  
4 resolution in the neighborhood when there  
5 were problems?

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Not since  
7 I've taken office.

8 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay. All right.  
9 Mr. Scaperada, I'm going to -- we're  
10 going to take this. We'll continue the  
11 public hearing on the handicapped, but  
12 until Commissioner Evans is here at the  
13 next meeting --

14 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay. Just further,  
15 or is a verification going to be provided  
16 at the next meeting on who the placard is  
17 actually registered to?

18 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: I'm sure Mr. Barry  
19 will be able to give us that information.

20 MR. SCAPERADA: Okay.

21 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay?

22 MR. SCAPERADA: All right. Thank  
23 you for your help.

24 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you. So we  
25 are not going to close the public hearing

1 in this matter. We're going to continue  
2 it?

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Should  
4 probably make a motion on that.

5 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Okay.

6 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: I make a  
7 motion that we continue the public  
8 hearing at our next regular commission  
9 meeting.

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

11 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner  
12 Scarpelli?

13 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: (Inaudible).

16 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Cocchiolo?

17 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Mayor, that will be  
19 for Tuesday, October 4th, at 7 p.m.

20 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you.

21 Okay. Commissioner Scarpelli, your  
22 resolutions and Commissioner Evans'.

23 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Be it

1 PASTOR ENSTROM: I'm Pastoer Kristin  
2 Enstrom of 158 Vreeland Avenue, Holy

4 wanted to come to speak before you today  
5 because I haven't been able to be at any  
6 of the other meetings when I know some of  
7 our neighbors at Holy Trinity have come  
8 to speak with you about the fact that we  
9 host twelve-step meetings at Holy Trinity  
10 and then more recently that other  
11 churches in Nutley host twelve-step  
12 meetings.

13 So I just wanted to come before you  
14 to speak basically on behalf of twelve-  
15 step programs because they cannot speak  
16 for themselves. That's part of what that  
17 program is and so as pastors, we tend to  
18 speak for them. I also wanted to be here  
19 in case you had any questions  
20 specifically for me. I know I've met  
21 with Mayor Cocchiolo and I thank you for  
22 that time, but I just wanted to share  
23 that twelve-step programs in my opinion  
24 and from what I've seen, provide a safe  
25 place and a safe place and a safe



1 community, for people who are struggling  
2 with addiction no matter whether it's  
3 from narcotics or alcohol or overeating,  
4 or whatever the addiction is -- a place  
5 for them to come and be and to be in  
6 recovery. And it also helps them to be  
7 better members of community, to be  
8 healthier and to be whole, and to be able  
9 to participate better in Nutley or in  
10 Bloomfield or Belleville -- wherever they  
11 may travel to. I also wanted to share --  
12 and it seems like we've been kind of  
13 spoken of negatively at Holy Trinity, but  
14 ever since I have come to Holy Trinity --  
15 I've only been for two months now, but  
16 even before that I've witnessed that the  
17 people of Holy Trinity and the leaders  
18 have done their very best to respond to  
19 the neighbors' concerns. We relocated  
20 the noon meetings that have grown too big  
21 for Holy Trinity to some other churches  
22 most recently found additional parking  
23 not on the street, for the people of the  
24 Wednesday evening meetings to alleviate  
25 that concern. And I've been in constant

1 communication with the people who still  
2 meet at Holy Trinity, who want to be able  
3 to stay there and want to not bother the  
4 neighbors. They want to participate in  
5 the Nutley community and want to be  
6 positive people in the Nutley community.

7 While addiction is messy, life is  
8 also messy. I mean, just going to  
9 Starbucks you might throw a cup on a lawn  
10 and -- life itself is messy, so I would  
11 ask that you as leaders of the Nutley  
12 community would help the people of this  
13 community who need a place and a space  
14 and a community to be in recovery and to  
15 become healthier people, so that they can  
16 be better citizens of this community or  
17 wherever they may live and work and go  
18 and shop and whatever they do. So, thank  
19 you for your time. I just wanted to  
20 speak since I haven't gotten to speak on  
21 behalf of the participants.

22 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you. And so  
23 you know, I can't speak for everyone on  
24 the board, but maybe I can in that the  
25 fact that there are A.A. meetings in your

1 church or any other one, has never been  
2 an issue for us. I don't think that was  
3 the issue at all, not one of us have ever  
4 said that. In fact, you know, I think  
5 all of us know many, many people who've  
6 been helped by the twelve-step process  
7 and we're really very proud of them. And  
8 that's not the issue at all.

9 It was a neighborhood disruption  
10 issue that I don't know if --  
11 Commissioner Petracco has there been any  
12 change or -- I haven't heard at this  
13 point?

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I don't  
15 think that we --all parties have been  
16 working on it. I know that the police  
17 department's been keeping a closer eye on  
18 it. I have a lot of -- people that are  
19 very close to me (inaudible) and I've  
20 spoken to them privately and I've -- you  
21 have to remember when  
22 you're -- that area -- you're a guest in  
23 somebody's neighborhood. You know, the  
24 cigarette butts and sometimes the  
25 language and you know, the parking could

1 be a problem, but I think it's  
2 dramatically improved (indiscernible).  
3 Hoping that everybody could find that  
4 common ground and we could just get  
5 along.

6 PASTOR ENSTROM: And I thank you  
7 for -- I know there have been some  
8 additional patrols and a ghost car was  
9 parked out there and -- well, at first I  
10 was like, oh, goodness. But I think even  
11 the people of A.A. appreciated that.  
12 They saw that last week there was some  
13 more police cars going by and they said,  
14 you know, it's good that they're here  
15 because that can help alleviate the  
16 problems.

17 So thank you for --

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You're very  
19 welcome.

20 PASTOR ENSTROM: -- ever so.

21 MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Thank you so much.  
22 You're welcome to Nutley.

23 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Pastor,  
24 just welcome to Nutley.

25 PASTOR ENSTROM: Thank you.

1           MAYOR COCCHIOLA: Does everyone --  
2           and thank you again -- everyone please  
3           don't forget, it's family day week.  
4           There's a lot of things going on in  
5           celebration of family day, which is  
6           actually Monday. Stay home with your  
7           family -- have dinner all of you.

8           We have a movie Friday night in the  
9           Oval. I'm not sure if that's going to go  
10          off or not because of the rain. We've  
11          got town-wide garage sale with huge  
12          participation this weekend -- about 175  
13          families already signed up. So there's  
14          going to be a lot of activity.
