

We picked up recycling throughout the township, consisting of plastic, paper, aluminum, mixed glass and clear glass and brought it back to the garage where it is separated and put into bins.

Once recyclables are loaded, they are put into large carting containers and brought to various places, such as:

Newspaper to Galaxy Recycling, Jersey City, NJ Co-Mingled to Galaxy Recycling, Jersey City, NJ

This occurs several times a week.

Potholes around the township were filled in with hot asphalt. Also, large patches of asphalt were laid down, where needed.

Reflectors are placed on all dead end barricades throughout the township.

Dead end barricades were painted throughout the township.

On days and nights of very heavy rain, we work with the police Department on flooded streets so we may maintain all catch basins, clearing them of debris to prevent flooding of streets. This procedure is done all winter with the Police and during snow season also.

We assist the Police in vehicular accidents, cleaning up debris left by the accidents.

We try to assist the departments when we have the manpower. We pick up loose leaves and leaves in bio-bags, when required, all around the township, with the help from the Water

Department and the Parks Department. Commissioner Joseph P. Scarpelli--Page 2 Department of Public Works progress of work in the Road/Recycling Division for the Month of November 2011.

On Mondays and Fridays, we divided up the work load be picking up the recyclables at the condos, located at various areas throughout the town and doing work on our roads, such as filling in potholes, using winter mix, weather permitting cleaning off tops of catch basins and also inside them.

The Road Department also carts several containers of debris to Bergen County Utilities Authority, North Arlington, NJ for the Clean Communities Department and the Parks Department.

MONTHLY STANDARD PROCEDURES are as follows:

Newspaper is brought to Jersey City, NJ several times a week.

We empty litter baskets, every Monday and Friday located in all the parking lots, well area, town hall area and garages.

On Mondays and Fridays, we also send out our sweepers to clean around the Town Hall, Public Safety Building and Parking Lots.

We maintain the appearance of parking lots by picking up loose leaves and debris. Our sweepers are sent out every day to various areas in town to keep our streets as clean as possible. This also starts early in the morning.

We pick up all salt barrels.

Drivers and helper inspect trucks every morning, checking oil or broken lenses. When work is needed, the trucks are turned over to your Mechanics' Department for service.







BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR RENOVATION OF POLICE DESK IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, **APPROPRIATING** \$300,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING \$285,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$300,000, including the sum of \$15,000 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$285,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of

the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued, is renovation of Police Desk, including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all pursuant to plans and specifications on file with the Township, which plans and specifications are hereby approved.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with the bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a). The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale, and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the

meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained, and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Township of Nutley is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. Any grants or moneys received by the Township for any purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof are hereby appropriated for said purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof and shall be applicable either to the direct payment of the cost of such purpose or to the payment or reduction of the obligations issued or authorized herein. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Township may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and bond anticipation notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$285,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$30,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMITTEE AND PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION AND REGULATION OF HISTORIC LANDMARKS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY

I. CREATED, TITLE.

There is hereby created, ratified and adopted a new chapter of the Revised General Ordinance of the Township of Nutley to be entitled "Historic Preservation Committee" (Ord#XXX)

II. AUTHORITY.

This chapter has been enacted pursuant to the authority granted under the Municipal Land Use Law, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et seq., including, but not limited to, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-107 to 112 (OrdXXXX)

III. DEFINITIONS

- (A) Historic Landmark: Any real property, man-made structure, natural object or configuration or any portion or group of the foregoing which has been designated in the Master Plan as being of historical, archeological, cultural, scenic, or architectural importance or which has been identified as a Historic Landmark in accordance with this Ordinance.
- (B) Exemptions: The Certificate of Appropriateness requirements of this ordinance shall not apply to the following activities:
 - (1) Changes to the interior of a structure;
 - (2) Repair, or replacement of any existing structural component, provided that the proposed work does not alter the exterior appearance of the structure, including but not limited to:
 - a. The installation of storm windows and doors or the replacement or repair of existing windows and doors that does not change design, scale or appearance;
 - b. Maintenance and repair of existing roofing material that does not change design, scale or appearance;
 - c. A structural repair which does not alter the design, scale or appearance of the structure;
 - d. The replacement, maintenance and repair of existing clapboards, shingles, or other siding with the same or similar materials;

- (3) Exterior painting including the change in color of any existing structures;
- (4) Minor changes which do not by themselves or in conjunction with prior or subsequent minor changes materially alter the exterior appearance of the structure including but not limited to:
 - a. Changes in light fixtures; and
 - b. Changes in mailboxes; and
 - c. Changes in house numbering.

IV. INTENDED PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to effectuate and accomplish the protection, enhancement, and perpetuation of historic buildings, structures, sites, objects, improvements, within the Township of Nutley, to assist in implementing the historic preservation element of the Township's Master Plan, and to advance the following public purposes:

- (A) To safeguard the heritage of the Township by preserving the resources within the Township which reflect elements of its historical significance;
- (B) To identify, designate, and regulate Historic Landmarks in order to preserve their historical significance;
- (C) To encourage the continued use of Historic Landmarks and to facilitate their appropriate use or reuse;
- (D) To maintain and develop an appropriate and harmonious setting for Historic Landmarks within the Township of Nutley;
- (E) To foster civic pride in the history and architecture of the Township of Nutley;
- (F) To promote appreciation of Historic Landmarks for the education, pleasure, and welfare of the local population;
- (G) To encourage beautification and private reinvestment in Historic Landmarks and surrounding properties;
- (H) To manage change of Historic Landmarks by encouraging sensitive alteration and/or new construction;
- (I) To discourage the unnecessary demolition of historic resources;
- (J) To recognize the importance of Historic Landmarks by urging property owners and tenants to maintain their properties in keeping with the requirements and standards of this Ordinance;
- (K) To encourage the proper maintenance and preservation of historic settings and landscapes.

V. APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS; TERMS; VACANCIES; CONDUCT OF HEARINGS.

a. There is hereby created and designated with the Township an Historic Preservation Committee to be known as the "Nutley Township Historic Preservation Committee" (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") which shall consist of five (5) members and two (2) alternate members who shall be appointed by the Mayor, with the consent of the Governing Body. The Mayor shall designate at the time of appointment the regular members

by class and the alternate members as "Alternate No.1" and "Alternate No. 2". The classes of regular members shall be defined follows:

- 1. Class A A person who is knowledgeable in building design and construction or architectural history and who may reside outside the Township; and
- 2. Class B A person who is knowledgeable in, or who has demonstrated an interest in, local history and who may reside outside the Township; and
- 3. Class C Any citizen of the Township who shall hold no other municipal office, position, or employment except for membership on the Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment.
- b. There shall be one (1) regular member designated as Class A, one (1) regular member designated as Class B and three (3) regular members designated as Class C.
- c. The terms of the members first appointed shall be so determined so that to the greatest practicable extent, the expiration of the terms shall be distributed in the case of regular members evenly over the first four (4) years after their appointment; provided that the initial term of no regular member shall exceed four (4) years and that the initial member of no alternated member shall exceed two (2) years. Thereafter, the term of a regular member shall be four (4) years and the term of an alternate member shall be two (2) years.
- d. Vacancies occurring otherwise than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term only. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, the term of any member common to the Committee and the Planning Board shall be for the term of membership on the Planning Board and the term of any member common to the Committee and the Board of Adjustment shall be for the term of membership on the Board of Adjustment.
- e. The Committee shall elect a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson from its members and select a Secretary who may or may not be a member of the Committee or a municipal employee.
- f. The presence of five (5) members, which may include alternate members filling vacancies of regular members, at a meeting shall constitute a quorum.
- g. Alternate members may participate in discussions of the proceedings but may not vote except in the absence or disqualification of a regular member. A vote shall not be delayed in order that a regular member may vote instead of an alternate member. In the event that a choice must be made as to which alternate member is to vote, Alternate No. 1 shall vote.
- h. No member of the Committee shall be permitted to act on any matter in which he or she has, either directly or indirectly, any personal or financial interest.
- 1. A member of the Committee may, after public hearing if he or she requests it, be removed by the Board of Commissioners for cause. (Ord. #98-51 § 1; Ord. #08-10 §§ 1-4)

J. All Committee records and minutes shall be government records within the meaning of the Open Public Records Act, *N.J.S.A.* 47:1 A-1 *et seq.* and all Committee meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-7, <u>et seq.</u>

VI. Funding

- a. The Governing Body shall make provision in its budget and appropriate funds for the expenses of the Committee.
- b. The Committee may employ, contract for, and fix the compensation of experts and other staff and services as it shall deem necessary, and in consultation with the Planning Board. The Committee shall obtain its legal counsel from the Municipal Attorney.

VII. Duties of Committee.

- a. The Committee shall have the responsibility to:
 - 1. Establish a regular Schedule of meetings on a quarterly basis;
 - 2. Prepare and/or maintain a survey of proposed Historic Landmarks of the Township so as to identify Historic Landmarks that are worthy of protection and preservation. The criteria for evaluating and designating Historic Landmarks shall be guided by the National Register of Historic Places;
 - 3. Make recommendations to the Planning Board on the historic preservation plan element of the Master Plan and on the impact for preservation of historic landmarks of any other Master Plan elements;
 - 4. Advise and make recommendations on the designation of real property, man-made structures, natural objects or configurations or any portion or group of the foregoing for inclusion as a Township Historic Landmark and for inclusion in the New Jersey National Register of Historic Places which will be subject to final determination by the Planning Board;
 - 5. Advise the Planning Board and the Board of Adjustment on applications for development, when requested;
 - 6. Carry out such other advisory, educational and informational functions as will promote historic preservation in the Township (Ord. #98-51 § 1);
 - 7. Review and make decisions regarding any "Certificates of Appropriateness";
 - 8. Require that a photographic or video recording of every Historic Landmark be created by the Construction Official upon the adoption of this Ordinance or the subsequent designation of any Historic Landmark or the completion of work performed under any Certificate of Appropriateness which shall be part of the Committee's records.

VIII. Certificate of Appropriateness

A Certificate of Appropriateness, issued by the Committee, shall be required before any work is commenced on any Historic Landmark, whether or not a building permit is required for such work unless such work is determined to be exempt in accordance with Section III. (B).

- a) A Certificate of Appropriateness is required:
 - 1) when changing the physical appearance of a structure exclusive of painting the structure:
 - 2) for demolition of same;
 - 3) for relocation of a principal or accessory structure;
 - 4) for any addition to or new construction of a principal or accessory structure
- b) All applicants shall submit an application form accompanied by pictures, descriptions or other information about changes to the Construction Official for prompt distribution to the Committee. Applications for demolition shall include current and historical photographs of the structure.
- c) Anyone considering action that requires a Certificate of Appropriateness is encouraged to request an informal "Informational Meeting" with the Committee or its chairman to review the design issues and standards of appropriateness prior to submitting a formal application for a Certificate of Appropriateness or for a determination of non-necessity. A request deemed complete by the Construction Official shall be submitted to the Committee Secretary and a meeting to be scheduled within forty-five (45) days of said being deemed complete (unless time constraints are waived by the applicant).
- d) The Committee shall hold a public hearing on all applications for a Certificate of Appropriateness if the Committee determines that the desired work is not exempt. The fee for such a hearing shall be \$50.00.
- e) After the public hearing the Committee shall render a written determination on the application within forty-five (45) days of the hearing explaining the reasons for the decision (unless time constraints are waived by the applicant). The Construction official shall notify the applicant of said determination in writing within five (5) days. Should the Committee fail to report its decision within the 45 day period (unless time constraints are waived by the applicant), the application will be deemed approved in favor of issuance of a Certificate of Appropriateness.
- f) Appeals from the Historical Preservation Committee's decision may be made to the Planning Board, pursuant to NJSA 40:55D-111.
- g) The property owner shall post the Certificate of Appropriateness that is valid for 2 years in a conspicuous spot on the exterior of the designated structure while work is in progress. If demolition is permitted, the Certificate of Appropriateness shall be valid for one (1) year and cannot be extended.

h) The issuance of an historic preservation Certificate of Appropriateness shall not eliminate the necessity of obtaining and complying with the requirements of any other required permit or approval.

IX. ENFORCEMENT VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

- (A) The Construction Code Official shall be responsible for enforcement of this ordinance.
- (B) Any person who shall undertake any activity which requires compliance with the ordinance and does not do so shall be deemed to be in violation of this ordinance. Any person convicted of violation of the ordinance shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed \$500.00 and/or 90 days in jail or both. Each act in violation of the ordinance shall be deemed a separate violation of the ordinance.

X. CONSTRUCTION OF THE ORDINANCE: SAVING CLAUSE

If any section or provision of the Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such determination shall not affect the other sections or provisions of the Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, the Township of Nutley (the "Local Unit"), in the County of Essex, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to acquire, construct, renovate or install the Project (the "Project") as defined in each of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Trust Loan Agreement") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (the "Trust") and that certain Loan Agreement (the "Fund Loan Agreement", and together with the Trust Loan Agreement, the "Loan Agreements") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (the "State"), all pursuant to the SFY 2012 New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program (the "Program");

after consultation with counsel and any advisors to the Local Unit (collectively, the "Local Unit Consultants") and after further consultation with the Trust, the State and their representatives, agents, counsel and advisors (collectively, the "Program Consultants", and together with the Local Unit Consultants, the "Consultants"), shall determine, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution of such Financing Documents by an Authorized Officer as determined hereunder. The Local Unit Clerk is hereby authorized to attest to the execution of the Financing Documents by an Authorized Officer of the Local Unit as determined hereunder and to affix the corporate seal of the Local Unit to such Financing Documents.

Section 2. The Authorized Officers of the Local Unit are hereby further severally authorized to (i) execute and deliver, and the Local Unit Clerk is hereby further authorized to attest to such execution and to affix the corporate seal of the Local Unit to, any document, instrument or closing certificate deemed necessary, desirable or convenient by the Authorized Officers or the Local Unit Clerk, as applicable, in their respective sole discretion, after consultation with the Consultants, to be executed in connection with the execution and delivery of the Financing Documents and the consummation of the transactions contemplated thereby, which determination shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of each such certificate or other document by the party authorized hereunder to execute such certificate or other document, and (ii) perform such other actions as the Authorized Officers deem necessary, desirable or convenient in relation to the execution and delivery thereof.

WHEREAS, the Township of Nutley the "Local Unit"), in the County of Essex, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to acquire, construct, renovate or install the Project (the "Project") as defined in each of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Trust Loan Agreement") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (the "Trust") and that certain Loan Agreement (the "Fund Loan Agreement", and together with the Trust Loan Agreement, the "Loan Agreements") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (the "State"), all pursuant to the SFY 2012 New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program (the "Program");

WHEREAS, the Local Unit has determined to finance the acquisition, construction, renovation or installation of the Project with the proceeds of a loan to be made by each of the Trust (the "Trust Loan") and the State (the "Fund Loan", and together with the Trust Loan, the "Loans") pursuant to the Trust Loan Agreement and the Fund Loan Agreement, respectively;

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loans, each of the Trust and the State require the Local Unit to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Local Unit's 2012 Bonds, Series A, to the Trust in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,250,000 (the "Trust Loan Bond") and 2012 Bonds, Series B, to the State in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,250,000 (the "Fund Loan Bond", and together with the Trust Loan Bond, the "Local Unit Bonds") pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"), other applicable law and the Loan Agreements; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond to the Trust and the State, respectively, without any public offering, and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9(a) allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond to the Trust without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a 2/3 vote of the full membership of the governing body of the Local Unit as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9(a), the Local Unit hereby sells and awards its (a) Trust Loan Bond in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,250,000 to the Trust in accordance with the provisions hereof and (b) Fund Loan Bond in an aggregate principal amount not to exceedt\$ 1,250,000 to the State in accordance with the provisions hereof. The Local Unit Bonds have been referred to and are described in bond ordinance #3140 of the Local Unit, which bond ordinance is entitled "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF WATER METERS AND THE RETROFIT OF METER HEADS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF \$3,100,000 THEREFOR. AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,100,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE

TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF" and was finally adopted by the Local Unit at a meeting duly called and held on June 15, 2010, at which time a quorum was present and acted throughout, all pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

- **Section 2.** The Chief Financial Officer of the Local Unit (the "Chief Financial Officer") is hereby authorized to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the Trust and the State under the Loan Agreements and the terms and conditions hereof, the following items with respect to the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond:
 - (a) The aggregate principal amounts of the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond to be issued;
 - (b) The maturity and annual principal installments of the Local Unit Bonds, which maturity shall not exceed 20 years;
 - (c) The date of the Local Unit Bonds;
 - (d) The interest rates of the Local Unit Bonds;
 - (e) The purchase price for the Local Unit Bonds; and
 - (f) The terms and conditions under which the Local Unit Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities.
- **Section 3.** Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Local Unit Bonds by the parties authorized under Section 4(c) hereof.
- **Section 4.** The Local Unit hereby determines that certain terms of the Local Unit Bonds shall be as follows:
 - (a) The Trust Loan Bond shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered R-1. The Fund Loan Bond shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered R-2;
 - (b) The Local Unit Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owners thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
 - (c) The Local Unit Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, printed, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Local Unit Clerk.

- Section 5. The Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond shall be substantially in the form set forth in the Trust Loan Agreement and the Fund Loan Agreement, respectively.
- Section 6. The law firm of Carella, Byrne, Cecchi, Olstein, Brody & Agnello, P.C.is hereby authorized to arrange for the printing of the Local Unit Bonds, which law firm may authorize McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the Trust and the State for the Program, to arrange for same. The Local Unit auditor is hereby authorized to prepare the financial information necessary in connection with the issuance of the Local Unit Bonds. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer and the Local Unit Clerk are hereby authorized to execute any certificates necessary or desirable in connection with the financial and other information.
- Section 7. The terms of the Local Unit Bonds authorized to be set forth by the Chief Financial Officer in accordance with Section 2 hereof shall be ratified by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the full membership of the governing body of the Local Unit.
- **Section 8.** The Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer are hereby severally authorized to execute any certificates or documents necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Local Unit Bonds, and are further authorized to deliver same to the Trust and the State upon delivery of the Local Unit Bonds and the receipt of payment therefor in accordance with the Loan Agreements.  - Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
- Section 10. Upon the adoption hereof, the Local Unit Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to Arthur T. Vanderbilt, II, Carella, Byrne, Cecchi, Olstein, Brody & Agnello, P.C., bond counsel to the Local Unit, and Richard T. Nolan, Esq., McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the Trust.
