JACK: Commissioners, my name is Jack

(indiscernible) I'm with the American Legion. I've been

with them for 35 years. It's your Legion, the town of

Nutley's Legion and, unfortunately, they have run into some

problems of their own making, but not really of their own

making because at one point they were trying to be a little

more conservative and raise more money for more of our

programs.

There are 19 programs within the American Legion organization that we have to support by our constitution and bylaws and by our charter for the United States Government. These programs require quite a bit of money. We normally raise enough money by parties et cetera, et cetera. But as our membership has diminished or declined we haven't been —they weren't able to do it, the young men today.

And as a result they asked for the town to -which you people did, and I asked and got permission for us
to rent some space with a gentleman they found and rented
space to. Well, he reneged on taxes over a year, which I
didn't know and Thomas was kind enough to accept the money
for that two years that they didn't pay.

1 And that consumed \$25,000 worth of posts money. If you reads these papers, our post over the years has not 2 only donated that and plenty more to Nutley's projects. 3 at one point, were chartered on -- which I gave you, on 4 5 8/15/1919, second post in the United States. And then we 6 got our confirmed in 1974 as a permanent charter. 7 Originally we got the temporary charter in France, et 8 cetera, et cetera. It's all in these minutes. I have the book here from 1919 to 1926, but I don't think you want to 10 go through that.

In that, what I'm asking for -- and I don't want to put the burden on Mr. Evans because it's not fair. The tax man that I talked to, unfortunately, said to me, well, this is the way it's got to be. Well, you know me better than that, nothing's got to be. The only thing that's got to be is death and, unfortunately, some taxes.

MAYOR TUCCI: But, Jack, just for my edification, that was not Commissioner Evans that gave you that response?

JACK: No, I talked to him about it and he did not give me any -- none of the commissioners here did.

MAYOR TUCCI: I just wanted to make that clear. Okay. I didn't mean to interrupt.

JACK: No, I will tell you who did it, believe me.

MAYOR TUCCI: And I know you will.

JACK: And what I'm concerned about is I had the

we had the Department Commander of New Jersey down this past week to Post 299 and all the people were there and were asking me what's happening? Because, you know, people talk, you know, it's - unfortunately, in the Veterans organizations they talk to each other. Not that it's bad, it's good.

But he got me on the side and he says, how we doing? Well, as you know for some reason The American Legion has kept me on the State - County Board for as long as I can remember and at this point I'm still the Judge Advocate for the County.

They said, we're going to ask you to step up and I said, no, don't ask me to step up, my town will take care of it. I said, I've already talked to certain people and they're going to look into it. And I said, but the main thing they brought up to me and the thing I'm going to present to you and I'll get it done, is that they want us back on a non-profit status. We will only use the post the way we used to use it, to utilize it for all the programs that we've got. We've got 19 scheduled programs a year by the charter that we have to go by, by the constitution.

And that normally runs 25, \$30,000 a year with no problem. That's not with the expenses of the post. And 90 percent of the time, thank God, our town fees will come through with the money. I just raised \$4,000 for Boys State

for our town, through our towns people -- went through our towns people, but through programs that I go to and people I go -- anyway, I want to ask you to please, please Mr. Evans, Commissioner Tucci, Petracco and Joe -- thank you very much for your donation to our posts with your party -- you know, it's a donation that we use to put into the programs, Girls State, Boys State, baseball -- two of them, senior, minor, there's so many of them, there's 19 of them to be exact.

And I don't want it to -- I don't want the post to lose its Charter and I've been informed -- you've got to understand, I've been with this organization a long time and in 1992 I was scheduled to be the State Commander, but I got a call from National and they were very unhappy with the state of Essex County being that many posts had bought and sold -- had sold their post and one diligent person asked the national organization, what did the post do with the money from the sale? Well, they put me in charge of it and, unfortunately, what I was fortunate enough -- I had to go to work for two years, I didn't become State Commander, I had to work for two years closing down ten posts in Essex County. I took three quarters of a million dollars, which I turned into funds for scholarship in Essex County through our Essex County approved -- and for helping hand of other veterans that were in trouble and for burial fund.

I don't want to take our post money. I don't want

our post to close. It would break my heart, I would probably croak before that would happen. But what I'm asking for is to please to see what you can do about establishing us back on the non-profit status, so we can continue existing and I will promise you that the work that is done by a non-profit will be done by our post.

I'm not going to let them fall back into the thing that happened to these other posts. Please, Commissioners, I appreciate it.

And those papers are for your study. If you want to see anything else, I've got the books which I'll be glad to show you. Thank you.

MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you, Jack.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Jack, just so you know, I raised the matter with our tax council to see what could be done. There are, obviously, as you're well aware, challenges associated with being for profit, not for profit, it does not — I understand that the building was converted for a period of time and that, obviously, created a hardship for you because that didn't work out.

I am aware of that, I'm under -- I'm aware of the hardship and I'm trying to see what would be possible in order to be able to change that status, recognizing that the tax year for Essex County is on a different time line than you're on.

MAYOR TUCCI: We need to record it, Jack.

JACK: The gentleman, unfortunately, leased our property. The scuz bucket --

MAYOR TUCCI: Is that a technical term?

JACK: I don't want to use a nasty term. But, what he did was, in essence, do nothing for a year and didn't bother telling our treasurer and naturally in good faith we had made an agreement with your former commissioners and the people at the post paid the town for a year, almost two years, actually, the taxes. Paid the power, paid the insurance, paid everything. Paid for repairs, et cetera, et cetera.

So, when we did find out -- how we found out, we didn't see any people coming in for three or four months, but, you know, you don't think about it, you're a little -- and we had a very frugal finance officer that just kept paying the bills. And when we found out about it was at time for renewal of the lease, almost a year and a half later.

However, that was paid out of the money that we had been saving for our programs that we had been using - you know getting donations for, through everything that we did.

We had always been a non-profit, even when I ran it, with all the parties I ran for our members and other

people. I don't think we ever exceeded 38 or \$40,000, but it went for a reason. Just like now, we just sent out \$800 for the baseball program, we have to give that to the insurance company for our boys.

Now, how did we get that money? Through donations and through the bar. So, I mean, we're still a non-profit and we will always be a non-profit because it requires us at a national code, not only the town, but by national code to be non-profit. But when you start messing around -- that's why I had to go out after ten posts, because they were messing around.

Anyway, whatever you can do to take that tax burden or reduce it. Anyway, I mentioned to you I was going to borrow money - out of those ten posts, one post stayed honest and when they sold the business, they put that money and funds and that post has offered to lend my post, our post, Nutley, not mine personally, lend the Nutley post money to pay what you had originally discussed with me and I will do that if we have to. But if we don't have to it would sure be appreciated because we would like to continue our programs. All right. That's all. I'm not faulting any of you people. If anybody I'm faulting it's my own members. I just don't -- you know, there were 12 people -- when you read this stuff, there were 12 people that started this Nutley post back in - after World War I and those 12 people

are the reason for VFW, American Legion, Disabled Vets and they all got their start -- well we got our start with the townspeople giving us money and then we worked on the library, we were in the basement of the library.

In 1924, we bought a building, 507 Franklin Avenue and we used that building to help start the other three posts and they've always thanked us and they've always been there.

So, I just -- I'm begging, I'm really begging because at this point, I'm paying more taxes that I make in salary and I can't go much further. You know what I'm saying, Tom. Thank you.
