2 MAYOR TUCCI: Everyone, please stand for the
3 Pledge of Allegiance.

4 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Please stand for the Pledge
5 of Allegiance.

6 MAYOR TUCCI: Please stand for the Pledge of
7 Allegiance.

8 (Pledge of Allegiance)

9 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Tuesday, March 20th, 2012,
10 pursuant to the requirements of the open public meeting law,
11 Chapter 231, Public Laws 1975, notice of this meeting was
12 published in the December 22nd, 2011 issues of The Nutley
13 Sun, The Star Ledger and The Herald News. A copy of this
14 notice has been posted on the Nutley Town Hall bulletin
15 board and a copy is on file in the municipal clerk's office.

16 Commissioner Scarpelli?

17 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

18 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Petracco?

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

20 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Evans?

21 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Here.

22 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Mayor Tucci?

23 MAYOR TUCCI: Here.

24 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: All present, Mayor.

25 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you. Well, we can see we have

1 a full house. We have some very special guests with us. We
2 have a lot going on as usual in this township, so we're
3 going to take some of our items out of order and the first
4 item, I'm sure much to everyone's pleasure will be the
5 resolution marking the 100th anniversary.

6 Whereas, March 12, 2012 marked the 100th
7 anniversary of the Girl Scouts of the United States of
8 America, which began in 1912 when Savannah, Georgia native,
9 Juliette "Daisy" Gordon Low, gathered 18 girls to provide
10 them with the opportunity to develop, physically, mentally
11 and spiritually and whereas for 100 years Girl Scouting has
12 helped build many girls and women of courage, confidence and
13 character who act to make the world a better place.

14 And whereas, the award winning Girl Scout
15 leadership program helps girls discovery themselves and
16 their values, connect with others and take action to make
17 the world a better place and whereas the Girl Scout Gold
18 Award, the highest honor in Girl Scouting requires girls to
19 make a measurable and sustainable difference in their
20 community, assess a need and design a solution, find the
21 resources and support to make it happen, complete the
22 project and also inspire others to sustain it.

23 And whereas, the Gold Award honors leadership in
24 the Girl Scout tradition, the Gold Award recipients have
25 already changed the world as high school students.

1 Whereas, core programs around science, technology,
2 engineering and math, environmental stewardship, healthy
3 living, financial literacy and global citizenship helps
4 girls develop a solid foundation in leadership.

5 And whereas, since its founding in 2000, the Girl
6 Scout Research Institute has become an internationally
7 recognized center for original research, research reviews
8 and surveys that provide significant insights into the lives
9 of girls.

10 And whereas, through the dedication, time and
11 talent of volunteers of different backgrounds, abilities and
12 areas of expertise, the Girl Scout Program was brought to
13 over Nutley girls in grades K through 12 by Girl Scouts of
14 the Green and White Mountains.

15 And whereas today more than 50 million American
16 women are Girl Scout alumni, 3.8 million girls and adult
17 volunteers are active members and Girl Scouts is the largest
18 member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl
19 Scouts, a global movement comprised of more than 10 million
20 girls in 145 countries worldwide.

21 Now, therefore, be it proclaimed that the Mayor
22 and Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley to
23 hereby applaud the Girl Scouts of the United States of
24 America and in Nutley for their 100 years of leadership and
25 expertise as the voice for and of girls and proudly proclaim

1 2012 as the Year of the Girl. I move the resolution.

2 (Applause)

3 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Seconded by Commissioner
4 Scarpelli.

5 COMMISSIONER: Evans, I think.

6 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: By Commissioner Evans.
7 Commissioner Scarpelli?

8 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: I say Happy 100th
9 Anniversary. Since I've been here that was the best Pledge
10 of Allegiance we've ever had. So, I vote yes.

11 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Petracco?

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Having three boys of my
13 own and not being as fortunate to have that little girl, I
14 very proudly vote yes, for you guys.

15 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Evans?

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Girls, what I will tell you
17 is, stand strong. The world you're growing up in has a
18 wonderful amount of opportunity all over the world. I've
19 travelled extensively and the power of your voice is growing
20 and don't ever underestimate what your ability is or don't
21 let anyone ever sell you short. Scouting is wonderful.

22 I have the experience because my daughter, she
23 was in Brownies. I was actually allowed to go on a camping
24 trip as long as I promised not to try cooking again, but I
25 was able to go.

1 Please realize that your potential is ahead of
2 you. The leadership you get in scouting is wonderful, so
3 stand strong. I vote yes.

4 (Applause)

5 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Mayor Tucci?

6 MAYOR TUCCI: Yes, I'd just like to congratulate
7 each and every one of you and tell you that your
8 contributions, not only to this community, but to this
9 county and to this state do not go unnoticed. We know the
10 things that you do are not always easy, but you do them with
11 a lot of pride and a lot of integrity and you make us all
12 very proud. And this is Girl Scouts on all different
13 levels, because there's what, three levels of Girl Scouting.
14 So, I also, very proudly, vote yes.

15 (Applause)

16 MAYOR TUCCI: Now, if we could have the Girl
17 Scouts -- just the Scouts and Brownies and everyone, just
18 come forward for a photo opportunity, we have the
19 proclamations to present to you.

20 (Photo opportunity)

21 MAYOR TUCCI: Okay. We'd like to get back to the
22 agenda, please.

23 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Are we going in order or
24 no?

25 MAYOR TUCCI: No, we've got to do two more

1 resolutions.

2 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: That's fine.

3 MAYOR TUCCI: Okay. Ready?

4 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Yes, Mayor.

5 MAYOR TUCCI: All right. Our second presentation
6 this evening concerns Autism and proclaiming April, Autism
7 Awareness Month and April 2nd, as Autism Awareness Day and
8 Light It Up Blue Day.

9 This is a resolution that I will introduce co-
10 sponsored by Commissioner Scarpelli. Scarpelli Association
11 has donated Ipads and other articles to our Autism Programs
12 here in town.

13 It reads as follows; Whereas Autism is a complex,
14 neurobiological disorder which inhibits a persons ability to
15 communicate and develop social relationships which is often
16 accompanied behavioral challenges.

17 And whereas, Autism affects all persons regardless
18 of race, religion, socioeconomic status or geography and
19 whereas Autism Speaks was founded in February 2005 by Bob
20 and Suzanne Wright, grandparents of a child with Autism and
21 whereas the mission of Autism Speaks is to change the future
22 for all who struggles with Autism Spectrum Disorder and
23 whereas Autism Speaks is dedicated to funding global
24 biomedical research into the causes, prevention, treatments
25 and cure for Autism to raising public awareness about Autism

1 and its affect on individuals, families and society and to
2 bring hope to all who deal with the hardships of the
3 disorder.

4 Whereas, on April 2nd, 2012 Autism Speaks invites
5 everyone to Light It Up Blue by replacing outdoor lighting
6 with blue bulbs to help raise awareness about Autism now
7 therefore be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of
8 the Township of Nutley in the County of Essex acknowledge
9 the achievements, abilities and needs of people with Autism
10 Spectrum Disorder and their families, as well as the
11 leadership communities, especially the Township of Nutley
12 that take pride in recognizing and acknowledging April 2nd
13 as Autism World Awareness Day and April as Autism Awareness
14 Month. I move the resolution.

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Second.

16 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Scarpelli?

17 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: I'd just like to say that
18 I'm proud that the Scarpelli Civic Association has really
19 gotten behind the Autism Awareness in town and we've been
20 able to raise some money and donate it to our program and
21 some scholarships, so it's a good cause and a good way to
22 raise awareness and I vote yes.

23 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Petracco?

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Mayor, if I may, before I
25 vote. Also, at Public Safety, I'd just like everyone to

1 know and it's a good time to announce this, is that we have
2 trained all of our police officers in Autism, dealing with
3 an Autism person because as everyone probably knows that
4 around the country there are cases where a police officer or
5 a fire fighter has not known how to deal with an Autism
6 child. So, we're very proud of that.

7 Also, we're putting together in Public Safety, a
8 program as far as educating the kids with Autism about 9-1-
9 1, how to communicate with police departments and we're
10 working on educating the children on that stuff. So, I very
11 proudly vote yes.

12 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Evans?

13 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes. Also, the Department of
14 Public Affairs has a series of activities relating to Autism
15 coming up as well, so stayed tuned.

16 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Mayor Tucci?

17 MAYOR TUCCI: Yes. Before I vote yes, we in the
18 Parks Department have had an anonymous donor donate 100 blue
19 light bulbs that we will make available to anyone who comes
20 down to the Parks Department to Light It Up Blue on April
21 2nd. I vote yes.

22 (Applause)

23 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Can I have Maria come up,
24 please? The Sumkowski's (phonetic) for a presentation and a
25 photo.

1 (photo opportunity)

2 MS. SUMKOWSKI: I just wanted to everyone know
3 that my -- this is my grandson Alec, my daughter Laurie is
4 his mom and my -- Laurie and my other daughter, Robin are
5 running fundraiser on April the 21st, which is, again, to
6 benefit Autism Speaks. Happy to say that the event is
7 completely sold out and I just would like to acknowledge
8 everybody's support -- thank you -- everybody's support on
9 it and everybody's generosity to making this -- it's going
10 to be a success for the whole Autism Speaks, so thank you,
11 again and thank you for this award.

12 (Applause)

13 MAYOR TUCCI: Okay. Our last presentation for
14 this evening comes a little bit after the Grand Marshall
15 dinner and the wonderful parade that we had, but we wanted
16 to make sure that we recognize all of our Nutley Irish
17 American Alliance Honorees for this year.

18 This resolution reads as follows: Whereas, on
19 Saturday March 3rd, 2012 the Irish American Association held
20 its 34th annual St. Patrick's Day Parade and whereas the St.
21 Patrick's Day has become an exciting event in the Township
22 of Nutley, which is looked forward to and enjoyed by both
23 spectators and participants alike.

24 And whereas, the Nutley Irish American Association
25 celebrated its annual St. Patrick's Day Parade Grand

1 Marshall dinner on Friday, February 3rd, 2012 at The
2 Landmark in East Rutherford, New Jersey and whereas this
3 year's Grand Marshall is Thomas J. McHenry and whereas Mr.
4 McHenry was joined by Deputy Grand Marshall Karen O'Connor
5 and NIAA Member of the Year, Thomas Donohue, along with
6 Parade Queen, Elizabeth Dunnigan (phonetic) as this year's
7 dignitaries now therefore be it resolved by the Board of
8 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley in the County of
9 Essex as we join with the citizens of Nutley to solute and
10 congratulate our Grand Marshall, Thomas J. McHenry, our
11 Deputy Grand Marshall, Karen O'Connor, NIAA Member of the
12 Year, Thomas Donohue and Parade Queen Elizabeth Dunnigan, as

5 honorees. Love the organization. It was a great parade.
6 Yes.

8 MAYOR TUCCI: You know, every year we do this
9 resolution and every year we say wow, what a group of
10 individuals we're honoring this year and every year it just
11 seems that they get better and better and better. You are
12 such a big part of this community and all of your deeds and
13 all of your contributions to this community do not go
14 unnoticed, we know you're involved in everything and this is
15 the least we can do to recognize this year's honorees, so

1 support they give us ever year. This is our 34th year and
2 we're still going strong. Just want to let you know that
3 the money we raise all year, I know we ask for a lot of
4 money through fundraising and everything, most of it stays
5 in the community. We don't advertise everything we donate
6 to. We help families, we help veterans, we help whatever
7 anybody needs, we talk at our meeting and we give the money.
8 We try to keep it in the community so, I just want you to
9 know that we're all Nutley, I mean, we trying keeping
10 everything here and it's a lot when the mayor and the
11 commissioners behind us that really helps us. Thank you

11 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you. I see we have no
12 ordinance introductions or no public hearings. Commissioner
13 Petracco?

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Be it resolved by the
15 Board of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
16 State of New Jersey, that the Township Clerk being that she

16 Whereas the total emergency temporary resolution adopted in
17 2012 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 96 PL 1951,
18 including this resolution \$11,565,402.25, now therefore be
19 resolved that in accordance with NJSA 48:4-20 emergency
20 temporary appropriations being the same, are hereby made for
21 the total of \$11,565,402.25, that said budget emergency

19 whereas the request for qualifications for Township
20 Forrester were received and opened on March 1st, 2012 by the
21 Township Clerk and whereas, a response to the request for a
22 proposal was from the Shade Tree Department, LLC, John
23 Linson (phonetic), P.O. Box 6089 WOB, West Orange, New
24 Jersey. And whereas the Shade Tree Department, LLC, John
25 Linson, New Jersey Certified Tree Expert, Number 198 has

1 provided these services in the past to the Township of
2 Nutley and is particularly suited to provide continued

9 We'll now open the meeting up to the public. All
10 persons addressing the Board of Commissioners regarding
11 community concerns should approach the microphone and
12 provide their name and address for the record.

15 remarks to the board or its individual members must be
16 addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer citizen

18 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing
19 the board shall be allowed unless the Mayor or presiding
20 officer or the majority of the membership of the board shall
21 determine that the interest of the quorum and/or the
22 expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
23 adversely affected by such dialogue.

24 MS. PATEKFAIR: Hi, my name is Januvi Patekfair
25 (phonetic), I live at 112 Pershing Avenue in Nutley and this

1 is Erin.

2 MS. GOLDEN: My name is Erin Golden (phonetic) and
3 I'm at 25 Laurel Place.

4 MS. PATEKFAIR: And we're here representing a
5 small local monies library group, it's about 60 of us, who
6 obviously, many of us moved into the community because of
7 the amenities and all the activities that you have for our
8 children. But we've run into some problems with the parking
9 situation at the library. I have two young kids under two
10 and it's very hard for me to find parking for most of the
11 activities that they have planned at the library for them.

12 And I was wondering if there was any type of
13 solution that you guys can help us with to alleviate the
14 situation? In the past we used to park across the street
15 from the library in the church, but recently they told us
16 not to park there or our cars would be towed and ticketed.

17 So, I'm hoping -- I don't know if there's any
18 other areas for us to park, so we can continue to attend
19 some of the activities.

20 MAYOR TUCCI: Commissioner Scarpelli.

21 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: What days are you there?

22 MS. GOLDEN: Usually Mondays, Fridays and
23 sometimes on Wednesdays. That's when they have the various
24 story hours at the library.

25 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Obviously, parking is at

1 a premium because school's in session.

2 MS. PATEKFAIR: And we do see a lot of the
3 teenagers that still park there. I don't know if they're
4 allowed to park there. It's a little frustrating.

5 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Park where?

6 MS. PATEKFAIR: By the library.

7 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Oh, you mean the couple
8 of spots that are in the front?

9 MS. GOLDEN: Right. They're taking up the spots.

10 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: That's library parking.

11 MS. PATEKFAIR: I don't know if maybe the Town can
12 talk to the church and they can, just during those hours,
13 give us some more spots or --

14 MS. GOLDEN: Or perhaps up the road there's a lot
15 of spaces that could be utilized, but right now you can't
16 park there, it's all painted yellow.

17 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: In front of like the
18 senior citizen building?

19 MS. GOLDEN: Correct.

20 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: There's a yellow curb
21 there and I don't know -- I'll talk to the fire department
22 because I think there was an issue there --

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: A safety issue.

24 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Yeah. But we could maybe
25 relook at that.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I know, as far as the fire
2 -- we were just at the senior's home. The fire zone there,
3 because of the size of the fire truck and (indiscernible).

4 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: (indiscernible) close to
5 the library.

6 MS. GOLDEN: That's the problem, it is a little
7 further away and trying to get two kids out of the car and
8 then --

9 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Let's take it under
10 advisement, let's take a look around and let's see what we
11 can do.

12 MS. GOLDEN: Thank you.

13 MAYOR TUCCI: Let us take a good look at it and
14 see if there's something that -- maybe closer to the library
15 that we can accommodate you with --

16 MS. PATEKFAIR: At least during those hours, where
17 -- you know --

18 MAYOR TUCCI: Right.

19 MS. PATEKFAIR: -- it's a short time, hour, hour
20 and a half. That's the most we --

21 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: -- impose on the church,
22 but the reason the church kicked you out, it was?

23 MS. GOLDEN: We used to park there and then -- it
24 was up until recently, they just -- I guess they spoke to
25 one of the librarians who made an announcement, we're no

1 longer welcome to park there. They're going to start
2 ticketing and towing cars.

3 MAYOR TUCCI: Was their parking lot full when you
4 were there also, or there was no one in there?

5 MS. GOLDEN: No. I don't - I know there was a
6 comment made that maybe some of the staff parking was
7 blocked, but maybe it's not marked correctly. If they just
8 allowed a certain amount or a certain area. We're fine
9 abiding to the rules, but maybe that was a little bit
10 unclear.

11 MAYOR TUCCI: Let us contact the church and see
12 what their objections were and see if they would be amenable
13 to allowing you to park on those specific hours.

14 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: And we'll look at our
15 parking situation also.

16 MS. GOLDEN: Thank you.

17 MS. PATEKFAIR: Greatly appreciated.

18 MAYOR TUCCI: Just before you leave make sure we
19 get contact names and numbers.

20 MS. PATEKFAIR: Sure.

21 MS. GOLDEN: Thank you. Feel free to check us out
22 on Facebook, we're a legit group in town. We have a
23 Facebook page. We have over 60 members. Thank you.

24 MAYOR TUCCI: Okay.

25 MS. PATEKFAIR: Thank you.

1 MS. GOLDEN: Thank you.

2 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you.

3 Sure, just identify yourself for the record, Jack.
4 We know who you are.

5 JACK: Commissioners, my name is Jack
6 (indiscernible) I'm with the American Legion. I've been
7 with them for 35 years. It's your Legion, the town of
8 Nutley's Legion and, unfortunately, they have run into some
9 problems of their own making, but not really of their own
10 making because at one point they were trying to be a little
11 more conservative and raise more money for more of our
12 programs.

13 There are 19 programs within the American Legion
14 organization that we have to support by our constitution and
15 bylaws and by our charter for the United States Government.
16 These programs require quite a bit of money. We normally
17 raise enough money by parties et cetera, et cetera. But as
18 our membership has diminished or declined we haven't been --
19 they weren't able to do it, the young men today.

20 And as a result they asked for the town to --
21 which you people did, and I asked and got permission for us
22 to rent some space with a gentleman they found and rented
23 space to. Well, he reneged on taxes over a year, which I
24 didn't know and Thomas was kind enough to accept the money
25 for that two years that they didn't pay.

1 And that consumed \$25,000 worth of posts money.
2 If you reads these papers, our post over the years has not
3 only donated that and plenty more to Nutley's projects. We
4 at one point, were chartered on -- which I gave you, on
5 8/15/1919, second post in the United States. And then we
6 got our confirmed in 1974 as a permanent charter.
7 Originally we got the temporary charter in France, et
8 cetera, et cetera. It's all in these minutes. I have the
9 book here from 1919 to 1926, but I don't think you want to
10 go through that.

11 In that, what I'm asking for -- and I don't want
12 to put the burden on Mr. Evans because it's not fair. The
13 tax man that I talked to, unfortunately, said to me, well,
14 this is the way it's got to be. Well, you know me better
15 than that, nothing's got to be. The only thing that's got
16 to be is death and, unfortunately, some taxes.

17 MAYOR TUCCI: But, Jack, just for my edification,
18 that was not Commissioner Evans that gave you that response?

19 JACK: No, I talked to him about it and he did not
20 give me any -- none of the commissioners here did.

21 MAYOR TUCCI: I just wanted to make that clear.
22 Okay. I didn't mean to interrupt.

23 JACK: No, I will tell you who did it, believe me.

24 MAYOR TUCCI: And I know you will.

25 JACK: And what I'm concerned about is I had the

1 we had the Department Commander of New Jersey down this past
2 week to Post 299 and all the people were there and were
3 asking me what's happening? Because, you know, people talk,
4 you know, it's - unfortunately, in the Veterans
5 organizations they talk to each other. Not that it's bad,
6 it's good.

7 But he got me on the side and he says, how we
8 doing? Well, as you know for some reason The American
9 Legion has kept me on the State - County Board for as long
10 as I can remember and at this point I'm still the Judge
11 Advocate for the County.

12 They said, we're going to ask you to step up and I
13 said, no, don't ask me to step up, my town will take care of
14 it. I said, I've already talked to certain people and
15 they're going to look into it. And I said, but the main
16 thing they brought up to me and the thing I'm going to
17 present to you and I'll get it done, is that they want us
18 back on a non-profit status. We will only use the post the
19 way we used to use it, to utilize it for all the programs
20 that we've got. We've got 19 scheduled programs a year by
21 the charter that we have to go by, by the constitution.

22 And that normally runs 25, \$30,000 a year with no
23 problem. That's not with the expenses of the post. And 90
24 percent of the time, thank God, our town fees will come
25 through with the money. I just raised \$4,000 for Boys State

1 for our town, through our towns people -- went through our
2 towns people, but through programs that I go to and people I
3 go -- anyway, I want to ask you to please, please Mr. Evans,
4 Commissioner Tucci, Petracco and Joe -- thank you very much
5 for your donation to our posts with your party -- you know,
6 it's a donation that we use to put into the programs, Girls
7 State, Boys State, baseball -- two of them, senior, minor,
8 there's so many of them, there's 19 of them to be exact.

9 And I don't want it to -- I don't want the post to
10 lose its Charter and I've been informed -- you've got to
11 understand, I've been with this organization a long time and
12 in 1992 I was scheduled to be the State Commander, but I got
13 a call from National and they were very unhappy with the
14 state of Essex County being that many posts had bought and
15 sold -- had sold their post and one diligent person asked
16 the national organization, what did the post do with the
17 money from the sale? Well, they put me in charge of it and,
18 unfortunately, what I was fortunate enough -- I had to go to
19 work for two years, I didn't become State Commander, I had
20 to work for two years closing down ten posts in Essex
21 County. I took three quarters of a million dollars, which I
22 turned into funds for scholarship in Essex County through
23 our Essex County approved -- and for helping hand of other
24 veterans that were in trouble and for burial fund.

25 I don't want to take our post money. I don't want

1 our post to close. It would break my heart, I would
2 probably croak before that would happen. But what I'm
3 asking for is to please to see what you can do about
4 establishing us back on the non-profit status, so we can
5 continue existing and I will promise you that the work that
6 is done by a non-profit will be done by our post.

7 I'm not going to let them fall back into the thing
8 that happened to these other posts. Please, Commissioners,
9 I appreciate it.

10 And those papers are for your study. If you want
11 to see anything else, I've got the books which I'll be glad
12 to show you. Thank you.

13 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you, Jack.

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Jack, just so you know, I
15 raised the matter with our tax council to see what could be
16 done. There are, obviously, as you're well aware,
17 challenges associated with being for profit, not for profit,
18 it does not -- I understand that the building was converted
19 for a period of time and that, obviously, created a hardship
20 for you because that didn't work out.

21 I am aware of that, I'm under -- I'm aware of the
22 hardship and I'm trying to see what would be possible in
23 order to be able to change that status, recognizing that the
24 tax year for Essex County is on a different time line than
25 you're on.

1 MAYOR TUCCI: We need to record it, Jack.

2 JACK: The gentleman, unfortunately, leased our
3 property. The scuz bucket --

4 MAYOR TUCCI: Is that a technical term?

5 JACK: I don't want to use a nasty term. But,
6 what he did was, in essence, do nothing for a year and
7 didn't bother telling our treasurer and naturally in good
8 faith we had made an agreement with your former
9 commissioners and the people at the post paid the town for a
10 year, almost two years, actually, the taxes. Paid the
11 power, paid the insurance, paid everything. Paid for
12 repairs, et cetera, et cetera.

13 So, when we did find out -- how we found out, we
14 didn't see any people coming in for three or four months,
15 but, you know, you don't think about it, you're a little --
16 and we had a very frugal finance officer that just kept
17 paying the bills. And when we found out about it was at
18 time for renewal of the lease, almost a year and a half
19 later.

20 However, that was paid out of the money that we
21 had been saving for our programs that we had been using -
22 you know getting donations for, through everything that we
23 did.

24 We had always been a non-profit, even when I ran
25 it, with all the parties I ran for our members and other

1 people. I don't think we ever exceeded 38 or \$40,000, but
2 it went for a reason. Just like now, we just sent out \$800
3 for the baseball program, we have to give that to the
4 insurance company for our boys.

5 Now, how did we get that money? Through donations
6 and through the bar. So, I mean, we're still a non-profit
7 and we will always be a non-profit because it requires us at
8 a national code, not only the town, but by national code to
9 be non-profit. But when you start messing around -- that's
10 why I had to go out after ten posts, because they were
11 messing around.

12 Anyway, whatever you can do to take that tax
13 burden or reduce it. Anyway, I mentioned to you I was going
14 to borrow money - out of those ten posts, one post stayed
15 honest and when they sold the business, they put that money
16 and funds and that post has offered to lend my post, our
17 post, Nutley, not mine personally, lend the Nutley post
18 money to pay what you had originally discussed with me and I
19 will do that if we have to. But if we don't have to it
20 would sure be appreciated because we would like to continue
21 our programs. All right. That's all. I'm not faulting any
22 of you people. If anybody I'm faulting it's my own members.
23 I just don't -- you know, there were 12 people -- when you
24 read this stuff, there were 12 people that started this
25 Nutley post back in - after World War I and those 12 people

1 are the reason for VFW, American Legion, Disabled Vets and
2 they all got their start -- well we got our start with the
3 townspeople giving us money and then we worked on the
4 library, we were in the basement of the library.

5 In 1924, we bought a building, 507 Franklin Avenue
6 and we used that building to help start the other three
7 posts and they've always thanked us and they've always been
8 there.

9 So, I just -- I'm begging, I'm really begging
10 because at this point, I'm paying more taxes that I make in
11 salary and I can't go much further. You know what I'm
12 saying, Tom. Thank you.

13 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you, Jack. Anyone else like
14 to address the Board?

15 (No verbal response)

16 MAYOR TUCCI: Hearing none, I'll entertain a
17 motion.

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Move to adjourn.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

20 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Scarpelli?

21 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

22 MADAM CLERK ROSARIA: Commissioner Petracco?

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

24 MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Commissioner Evans?

25 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

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MADAM CLERK ROSARIO: Mayor Tucci?

MAYOR TUCCI: Aye. Thank you.
