P R O C E E D I N G S

MADAM CLERK: Tuesday, November 19, 2013.

Pursuant to the requirements of the Open Public Meeting Law, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, notice of this meeting was published in the December 13, 2012 issues of the Nutley Sun, the Star Ledger and the Herald News. A copy of this notice has been posted on the Nutley Town Hall bulletin board and a copy is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Commissioner Rogers is absent, excused this evening. Commissioner Tucci?

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Here.

All present, Mayor, with the exception of Commissioner Rogers who is absent, excused this evening.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you so much.

MADAM CLERK: Thank you, Mayor.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Before we read the agenda and all that, I see we have some guests here this evening. Is it okay if we take them first?

MADAM CLERK: Absolutely. We have Surrogate

1 Stephens with us this evening. He'd like to provide us with
2 a brief presentation concerning the Surrogate
3 (indiscernible).

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

5 MR. STEPHENS: Thank you, so much. Good evening.
6 I'm Ted Stephens. I'm the Essex County surrogate. Last
7 year we weren't quite as successful at coming to you and I'm
8 glad I have the opportunity to give you a very brief -- it's
9 been emphasized I should be very brief. Tonight, I see you
10 have a very full agenda. So I intend to doat.

11 You know, upon becoming the surrogate last year, a
12 couple of things happened and it was new for me, of course,
13 in so many ways while I practiced as an attorney in the
14 Estates area, but being surrogate is totally different. I
15 was a municipal judge, just so you know my background, for
16 seventeen years, having sat in six different municipalities
17 here in Essex County. In fact, when I come to Nutley
18 (indiscernible) made that turn past the stadium that brought
19 back a lot of memories having played football at East
20 Orange, against Nutley and one of my good friends and
21 teammates down at (indiscernible) was a gentleman named
22 Vinnie Petalino (ph) who went to school here from Nutley as
23 well. So it brings back a lot of very warm memories.

24 In going through the process and I (indiscernible)
25 of course.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: If I remember, you lost a
2 lot.

3 MR. STEPHENS: I did -- if that's your
4 recollection (indiscernible).

5 (laughter)

6 MR. STEPHENS: So having said all of that, when I
7 was campaigning in the surrogate I recall two main
8 questions. I would go through my extensive background and
9 tell people what I did and why I'm qualified for the job and
10 after all that, the first question would be, what the heck
11 is your name again? And the second question of course would
12 be just what the heck is a surrogate?

13 So because as you know it's a very important
14 position but a little obscure in terms of the -- to the
15 public in terms of what it's really all about. The
16 surrogate as this body knows certainly is the Court that
17 handles primarily the probate or will estate administration
18 and non will estate, but also handles very important
19 functions of processing guardianship applications and
20 adoption applications as the clerk to the Superior Court.

21 We also handle the process and administration of
22 minor's funds, trust funds in the amount of about \$40
23 million. So everybody who comes through our court is very,
24 very anxious, has very important things. And even in the
25 case of an adoption, which is you've ever been through an

1 adoption proceeding, is the only time when everybody in the
2 courtroom is happy and that includes the judge, which is a
3 very rare occasion. But getting through to that last point,
4 overcoming that last hurdle, the family is anxious as well.
5 So it became incumbent upon me to come and speak to not only
6 councils, but also to the public when I get an opportunity
7 to do that at council meetings in order to explain what the
8 surrogate court is a little bit more about to prepare people
9 and have them a little, just a half a head start.

10 Now last year, what we did to try to make it a
11 little easier for folks coming into visit the surrogate
12 court was to extend hours for the surrogate court. So as of
13 last May, actually two Mays ago at this point, on the second
14 and fourth Wednesday of every month we're open an additional
15 two hours. So we're open from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. People can
16 be seen with an appointment, have their work handled without
17 having to take time from their precious job and they get the
18 one thing you can't get in the city of (indiscernible) at
19 any other time and that's free parking, because the employee
20 lot is open. So that, needless to say has been a very
21 substantial success for us.

22 Now this year, we decided we do something a little
23 different. We enhanced our website, because as everybody is
24 a businessman or businesswoman as the case may be, you're
25 not in business if you don't have a good website. So we

1 have a very robust website now, www.essexsurrogate.com. It
2 contains a ton of information, a lot of frequently asked
3 questions. But I do caution you, as you go through and
4 you're putting it through as you're filling up your web
5 browser and www.essexsurrogate, be careful because sometimes
6 the web browser fills in on its own and it may direct you to
7 an adult website that I have nothing to do with.

8 (Laughter)

9 MR. STEPHENS: Just caution you then in case your
10 kids are around. So but in that, that's also been very
11 helpful because it allows any individual, especially helpful
12 to attorneys because they don't have to come to the
13 surrogate court to get their forms. They can be filled out
14 online and again it's another opportunity to make it easier
15 for the public. We're trying to do more with less. We've
16 been able to achieve all of these benefits in the last
17 couple of years without having to ask the county exec or
18 freeholders for any additional budget.

19 My staff, there's only 13 of us. In fact, they're
20 listed here. I've done this voluntarily. I have to commend
21 one young lady here, Ms. Guy. If you've ever come to the
22 surrogate's court, everybody knows Doris Guy (ph) because
23 she has recently celebrated her 50th year working for Essex
24 County. And so she is a legend in her own right.

25 So with your permission, I'm going to leave you a

1 little bit of this information. I have more to present and
 2 maybe I'll save that for next year, since we're trying to do
 3 this update annually. So I hope I haven't gone over my ten
 4 minutes, but I just want to leave this and most importantly
 5 just thank you for the opportunity to introduce myself to
 6 you and to let you know my court is available to be a
 7 service whenever needed.

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you, so much.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I have a question.

10 MAYOR PETRACCO: Question.

11 MR. STEPHENS: This doesn't count for my ten
 12 minutes?

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: No.

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: This is free time. A lot
 15 of times we have constituents that come to us with a
 16 probated will and just how does that process work so we know
 17 when the confront us and say, can you help me?

18 MR. STEPHENS: Well quickly the main thing you
 19 need or any person would need is the original will and the
 20 original birth certificate with a raised seal. Now, that in
 21 the will identifies an executor or (indiscernible) if it
 22 happens to be a female, they come into the Court and were
 23 able to get it probated.

24 It's more tricky with a non-will estate actually,
 25 because see the will identifies exactly who is going to be

1 in charge of the estate going forward. Without developing
2 your own plan, which is your will, you're left to the
3 State's plan. The state's plan is a little bit more
4 convoluted except in the cases of spouse, because we all
5 know there should be only one spouse, right. There should
6 only be one spouse, so that's -- we know who that person is.
7 But if it's children or brothers and sisters or further
8 removed family members, now you have a larger group of
9 people and so we can't choose between them quite as easily.

10 They are allowed to work it out among themselves
11 by renouncing in favor of one of the eligible parties, but
12 if that doesn't work then you've got a real problem. You've
13 got to go to court and the judge has to pick a person. And
14 to be honest with you, the judge normally can't pick unless
15 one of the siblings or the children happens to be an estate
16 attorney well known to the Court. They're not going to pick
17 one over another, so chances are they will pick an attorney,
18 a non-family member who will come in and handle the estate
19 and they will get paid out of the proceeds of the estate.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: And do they need an
21 appointment to come down or they can just come down?

22 MR. STEPHENS: Only for the extended hours, up
23 until between 8:30 and 4:00, just walk in and they can be
24 seen. If you have any independent questions, call me as
25 well. My number if you want -- I don't have enough cards

1 for everyone. It's 973-621-4485. That's me directly.

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Is that on the website?

3 MR. STEPHENS: No. It better not be. The regular

4 --

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Oh, okay.

6 MR. STEPHENS: -- is 621-4900, 4485 is me
7 directly. For my assistant is named -- my deputy, I should
8 say, Natalie Dunston Harrison (ph) and she's at 621-4903.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

10 MR. STEPHENS: All right.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you, so much.

12 MR. STEPHENS: (Indiscernible) thank you so much.

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Thank both of you.
14 Yeah.

15 Okay. So I guess we'll move on to our agenda.
16 The first thing on our agenda is ordinance introductions. I
17 see I have one, two, three, four, five of them. This is all
18 regarding salaries.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible) I think we
20 talked about this a little bit earlier --

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yes.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: The last four, 3268 through
23 3271 I think we should just pull those for now.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Of the first one.

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Until we have a chance to

1 sit down with the chief and that will resolve a lot of the
2 issues.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah, we went back and forth with
4 that. Was it Evelyn today?

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We took it off the other
6 one, but it's now separate -- we did it separately as we
7 asked, but I think because we're in the midst of discussing
8 it, there's no reason to pass it because we have to come to
9 an agreement on it.

10 MAYOR PETRACCO: I think the range is enough, but
11 whatever you think we should do, I'll do.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I think we should. I think
13 --

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: Pull it? Okay. So which one are
15 we pulling?

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible) 3269 -- I'm
17 sorry, 3268.

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: 3268.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 69, 70 and 71.

20 MADAM CLERK: Okay. So we're going to pull the
21 four salary ordinances of the chief. Am I correct?

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah.

23 MADAM CLERK: Okay.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

25 MADAM CLERK: Mayor, that's going to leave you

1 with one ordinance, which is 3267, which is on the front
2 page.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. So then I just have one
4 ordinance introduction it looks like for parking.

5 MADAM CLERK: Yes, that's correct.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. While I'm at it, this is
7 time limited parking?

8 MADAM CLERK: (Indiscernible) Harrison Street.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Oh, okay. The two spots on
10 Harrison Street.

11 MADAM CLERK: (Indiscernible) January session.

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Did we already consider the
14 Harrison Street?

15 MADAM CLERK: Yes. But it was 8-6 everyday, so
16 we're making this 8-4 school days only, because the
17 residents I guess (indiscernible).

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Be careful what you wish
19 for.

20 MADAM CLERK: Yeah.

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Commissioner Evans, I see
22 you have a public hearing a couple of them tonight?

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. Did the
24 (indiscernible) go through (indiscernible) Harrison Street?

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible) asatoawhat

1 the issue was on (indiscernible)a

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Danny Maurice, one of the
3 residents came to us -- to you, Sam?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible) veteran of
5 the year.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: There you go.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: One in the same? Okay.

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah. And he had an issue with
9 the parking there. Sam, if you know the story better than
10 me, please jump in.

11 MADAM CLERK: I guess what was happening is all
12 the parents that go to Lincoln School were parking all along
13 and a lot of the teachers were parking in that area and
14 occupying those spaces all day long. So he asked and all
15 the residents -- they got a petition together -- asking for
16 time limit of parking. So originally we put it 8-6 and the
17 residents could park there. So then it was every day. So
18 then we amended it now tonight to be only on school days 8-
19 4.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 8-4 school days.

21 MADAM CLERK: And that's fair.

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Did they originally ask for
24 8-6?

25 MADAM CLERK: No.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: They just wanted it and we
2 did it and then --

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: And then it became an issue.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible).

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Commissioner Evans, I
6 guess we'll move on to you, stay in order.

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: So I have a public hearing on
8 Bank Street, I have a public hearing tonight on time limited
9 parking. That's why I was questioning. And then I also
10 have Roman Street, which is -- this is handicapped parking,
11 I believe. And then I have the public hearing on the non-
12 union salaries.

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Public hearing.

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah, public hearing for non-
15 union salaries for 13 and 14. Do I get 15?

16 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. And the next public
17 hearing is Commissioner Scarpelli. Scarpelli and Tucci
18 together.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'll defer to you, go
20 ahead.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah, it's the Teamsters
22 Contract for '13, '14 and '15, three years (indiscernible)
23 contract. Talking to counsel we can do one public hearing
24 for all three years.

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Excellent.

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: And for whatever reason
3 they didn't want (indiscernible).

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: Three? Is that what they did?

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We suggested a four year
6 deal, but they preferred a two year deal, so --

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: (indiscernible).

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: So we have to do the
9 resolution first before a public hearing.

10 MADAM CLERK: Right, prior to the public hearing.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: All right. So why don't we do
12 that first. Can we allow -- we'll read that resolution and
13 -- okay. And then just moving forward, I have one, two,
14 three, four, five, six, seven and keep going. I guess it's
15 for every year. We have the PBA ordinances on here of one,
16 two, three, four, so I'm assuming that's four years and now
17 we have the MBA. Allen, do you want to comment on that,
18 what we're trying to achieve tonight?

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah. What we should do is
20 have a public hearing, but not vote on it yet, because
21 there's an issue we have to resolve. And I'm trying to get
22 in touch with Ramone (ph) who actually negotiated it. We
23 had trouble, I couldn't connect with him today. But we're
24 going to -- we can vote on it the next time, I think we
25 should be okay to vote it. But we can do the hearing

1 tonight.

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: So when we do it, then we just
3 won't vote on it?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We won't vote on it. We'll
5 just do the hearing, public hearing so that will be
6 satisfied unless anybody has any objection to that.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I don't think the issue
9 we're dealing with is going to be that material, but we
10 don't want to have to go backwards. So I think we can fix
11 it.

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Just for clarity for myself, I
13 mean, the reason why I think we're trying to get this in
14 tonight is for Ro Costa, this way before the end of the
15 year, everything jives with the salaries and if this makes
16 easier bookkeeping for her. Is that --

17 MADAM CLERK: We're just trying to be consistent
18 with all of the contracts and all of the salary ordinances
19 just to have everything --

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. And --

21 MADAM CLERK: -- at the same time.

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: Allen, can we combine these or --

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. So we can just --

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do the PBA and then the --

1 MADAM CLERK: Okay. So Mayor, what you're going
2 to do is hold the public hearings for the FMBA salary
3 ordinances, open the public hearing, allow the public to
4 speak, close the public hearing and hold the vote to the
5 next meeting.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Very good.

7 MADAM CLERK: Am I correct?

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah. Thank you. So now we're
9 off to resolutions. I see Commissioner Tucci has the first
10 one.

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I just have one transfer of
12 appropriations.

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Mr. Evans?

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: It's a \$28,000 transfer, the
15 same amount (indiscernible).

16 (Multiple people talking).

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: I think I'm going to --

18 (Multiple people talking)

19 MADAM CLERK: 18,000.

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: 18,000.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Am I transferring to you or
22 are you transferring to me?

23 MAYOR PETRACCO: Oh, so that's a misprint
24 (indiscernible)?

25 MADAM CLERK: (Indiscernible).

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: Oh, so it's Commissioner Evans is
2 18,000.

3 MADAM CLERK: 18,000.

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: For the record.

5 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci (indiscernible).

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Just for clarification.
7 Commissioner Scarpelli.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well how come he gets ten
9 more than I do?

10 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: I have the resolution on
11 the teamsters contract, which we discussed earlier. And
12 then I have an emergency repair on a collapsed sewer main,
13 which is out -- which is on Washington and Hancock. And a
14 transfers, one is to pay for that sewer line and the other
15 is for just transferring water from public accounts to
16 (indiscernible) water.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. I have one raffle license
18 resolution and I think we are ready to roll.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Want me to take the
20 resolution first?

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yes. We'll take it out of order.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm here to vote on the
23 ordinances.

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. Got ya.

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: People to get their

1 (indiscernible).

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you want me to do your -

3 -

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: Who is going to read the
5 resolution?

6 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: He can read the resolution,
7 yeah. I just want to make sure I -- I want to vote on all
8 the ordinance --

9 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Indiscernible) transfer
10 too? You want me to do the transfer?

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: You can do my transfer, yeah.

12 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Okay.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: But I'll vote -- I'll stay
14 for the ordinances and --

15 MADAM CLERK: Mayor, just give me a few minutes to
16 set up.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: Take your time please.

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Rule 2, go into executive.

19 MADAM CLERK: They're going into executive?

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Are we doing executive now
21 or later?

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No. You don't need it.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, you don't need it.

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I was just giving him a
25 hard time.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, oh.

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: We also have a proclamation.

3 Guys.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible).

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: We have a proclamation for the

6 library. (Indiscernible).

7 (Multiple people talking)

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: The surrogate did such a
9 good job, why should we (indiscernible).

21 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Here.

24 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

25 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

1 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco.

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Here.

3 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor, with the
4 exception of Commissioner Rogers who is absent, excused this
5 evening.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Before we start, can
7 we just please have a moment of silence for our troops that
8 are serving abroad?

9 (silence)

10 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Okay. We're going to
11 take a few things out of order today. We have some friends
12 of our library here tonight. We have a proclamation for
13 them. They are going to be celebrating 100 years. What a
14 milestone, congratulations. The proclamation reads:

15 Whereas, on November 23, 2013, the citizens of
16 Nutley, Essex County, New Jersey will commemorate the
17 centennial of the laying of the cornerstone of the Nutley
18 Public Library in November of 1913; and,

19 Whereas, the Nutley Public Library was legally
20 constituted in 1912 by a referendum approved by citizens of
21 Nutley and the library, funded by an Andrew Carnegie grant,
22 and designed by Armstrong and DeGelleke, was formally opened
23 on August 5, 1914, with a collection of 5,113 volumes; and,

24 Whereas, in 1942 a three-story addition to the
25 Library, funded by a Federal Works Progress Administration

1 (WPA) grant and local funds, was opened; and,

2 Whereas, in 1989 the Library was renovated and
3 expanded through a building project that preserved the
4 elegance of the original Carnegie facility and the WPA
5 addition while adding two wings to house the library's
6 diverse collections; and,

7 Whereas, in 1990 the newly expanded library was
8 furnished through the fundraising efforts of the Friends of
9 the Nutley Public Library, which was recognized through the
10 1990 Library Service Award of the New Jersey Library
11 Association; and,

12 Whereas, in 1996 the Nutley Public Library became
13 the first Essex County library and the 70th member of the
14 Bergen County Cooperative Library System consortium,
15 (BCCLS), thereby greatly expanding its resources and
16 services to its patrons; and,

17 Whereas, the mission of the Nutley Public Library
18 is to serve as a cultural center facilitating access to
19 information, ideas and forms of creative expression. The
20 Library advocates reading, information seeking and lifelong
21 learning among all members of the community as a means of
22 pursuing personal, professional and leisure-time goals; and,

23 Whereas, the Library will accomplish its mission
24 effectively by providing excellence in staff, facilities,
25 collections, technology and programs and by participating in

1 cooperative networks; and,

2 Whereas, the promise and the progress of the
3 Nutley Public Library has resulted from the efforts and
4 support of many people, past and present: trustees,

6 as the Friends of the Nutley Public Library, local
7 businesses, major contributors, and, most importantly, our
8 more than 14,500 cardholders;

9 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of
10 Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex,

11 State of New Jersey that 2014 is hereby declared
12 to be The Year of the Nutley Public Library in honor of the
13 100th anniversary of this essential municipal institution.

6 pouring corn oil, wine and grain (no sound) ready with
7 refreshments (no sound), but 11:00 to 12:00 on Saturday is
8 the event. Thanks very much.

Whereas, on November 23, 2013, the citizens of Nutley, Essex County, New Jersey will commemorate the centennial of the laying of the cornerstone of the Nutley Public Library in November of 1913; and,

Whereas, in 1989 the Library was renovated and expanded through a building project that preserved the elegance of the original Carnegie facility and the WPA addition while adding two wings to house the Library's diverse collections; and,

Whereas, in 1990 the newly expanded library was furnished through the fundraising efforts of the Friends of the Nutley Public Library, which was recognized through the 1990 Library Service Award of the New Jersey Library Association; and,

Whereas, in 1996 the Nutley Public Library became the first Essex County library and the 70th member of the Bergen County Cooperative Library System consortium, (BCCLS), thereby greatly expanding its resources and services to its patrons; and,

Whereas, the mission of the Nutley Public Library is to serve as a cultural center facilitating access to information, ideas and forms of creative expression. The Library advocates reading, information seeking and lifelong learning among all members of the community as a means of pursuing personal, professional and leisure-time goals; and,

Whereas, the Library will accomplish its mission effectively by providing excellence in staff, facilities, collections, technology and programs and by participating in cooperative networks; and,

Whereas, the promise and the progress of the Nutley Public Library has resulted from the efforts and support of many people, past and present: trustees, directors, staff members, Mayors and Commissioners, as well as the Friends of the Nutley Public Library, local businesses, major contributors, and, most importantly, our more than 14,500 cardholders;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey that 2014 is hereby declared to be The Year of the Nutley Public Library in honor of the 100th anniversary of this essential municipal institution.
