2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. I have a broken microphone
3 tonight. I'll work with it. It's fine. Okay. Okay.
4 That'll work. Okay.

5 Madam Clerk?

6 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor? Are we ready?

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: We are ready.

8 MADAM CLERK: Tuesday, March 18th, 2014 --
9 pursuant to the requirements of the Open Public Meeting Law,
10 chapter 231 Public Laws 1975, notice of this meeting was
11 published in the December 12th, 2013 issues of the Nutley
12 Sun, the Star Ledger, and the Herald News. A copy of this
13 notice has been posted on the Nutley town hall bulletin
14 board, and a copy is on file in the municipal clerk's
15 office.

16 Commissioner Rogers?

17 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

20 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

21 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Here.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

23 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

24 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Here.

1 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor.

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

3 Could we move on to the communications and
4 correspondence?

5 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor, I have two items of
6 communication this evening. The first item is an
7 application for a social affair permit for an event to be
8 held at 44 Park Avenue at the parks and recreation building.
9 The application has been submitted by the Rotary Club of
10 Nutley for an event scheduled to be held on Saturday,
11 April 5th, 2014e

12 I need a motion, please.

13 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Move.

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: Second.

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

16 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

18 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

19 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

21 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

22 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

23 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Aye.

25 MADAM CLERK: And the last item of communication I

1 have is from the Nutley Unico, Inc. The Nutley Unico, Inc.
2 is requesting to hold a Sunday raffle on April 27th, 2014.

3 I need a motion, please.

4 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Moved.

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Second.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

13 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Aye.

16 MADAM CLERK: That's all for communications this
17 evening, Mayor.

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Bills, please?

19 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor. Tuesday, March 18th,
20 2014 -- Public Affairs, \$93,147.84; Revenue and Finance,
21 \$6,210,331.23; Public Safety, \$154,091.43; Public Works,
22 \$837,050.86; Parks and Public Property, \$162,118.84.
23 Payroll as of March 14th, 2014, \$796,310.59, for a grand
24 total bill list of \$8,253,050.79. And that's all for bills
25 this evening, Mayor.

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

2 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Move the bills.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

4 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

5 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

9 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

11 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: Thank you, Mayor.

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Thank you.

16 Tonight, I have an announcement. So we'll take
17 that out of order.

18 Can everyone hear me now?

19 Tom and Rob (sic), can you guys come to the mike?

20 Good evening, guys.

21 (Off-mike)

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: Fine, thank you.

23 So tonight's announcement is that I'm going to

24 make Tommy Strumolo permanent in his position as chief, and

25 we're going to make Rob Irwin permanent in also his position

1 as captain.

2 So congratulations on that.

3 Just a few words that I'd like to add to this
4 announcement, and I know Mrs. Corrale (ph) has been working
5 diligently with Civil Service to move this along, but I
6 would like to comment on it publicly, because a lot of
7 things transpire publicly, and Bobby and I had a long talk
8 up here I think it was yesterday. So I just want to be
9 clear on a couple of things.

10 As an elected official, you take an oath of
11 office, and my oath that I took is very serious, just like
12 you gentlemen have taken in the past. I believe in the
13 processes that are there. I believe in the Civil Service
14 rules.

15 So, when all of this came kind of to a head and
16 you decided to let go the chief's (sic) test, I want
17 everyone to be clear that I wasn't dragging my feet or
18 playing games with a very serious matter that is also
19 critical and important to this town. I wasn't going to be
20 pushed into making a decision. I wasn't going to be
21 intimidated into making a decision, but I owe it to the
22 residents of this town to make sure I'm making the right
23 decision.

24 As the mayor of the community, as the director of
25 public safety, I have to know. I can't guess. I have to

1 see it for myself that what I do is the right thing for the
2 township first, and that's the most important message, as we
3 discussed yesterday, is that the most important thing is
4 that Nutley, our town, comes first before everything,
5 including all of us and everybody here. The town is the
6 most important thing. There were some things that happened
7 through that process that we won't comment on tonight.

8 As I told you, Chief, yesterday, I had a lot of
9 people pushing for you, a lot of people telling me what I
10 should do with you in particular, but the difference between
11 people telling me what I should do is what you showed me the
12 last few months, and you've earned it, but I want to be
13 clear on that. No one's pushed me. No one's told me.

14 You have shown me, and I think that that is what
15 is the most important message that we could give tonight is
16 that you've done an excellent job the last few months under
17 some stressful moments for the both of us, I'm sure. I'm
18 very proud of you, and I wanted to congratulate you
19 publicly, and I wanted you to know that you have my support.
20 You have this board's support, and we're looking forward to
21 knowing now why I was able to bypass that test and move
22 forward with that, you know, making it permanent tonight
23 because I'm not guessing any more. I know that you're the
24 right guy for the job of chief and to move our town forward
25 under some stressful times.

1 Captain Irwin, I've talked to you a lot through
2 the process. I know it's been very stressful for your
3 family as well. I'm very pleased with your work performance
4 the last few months as well, and we have two guys in front
5 of us that really care about the town and love the town, and
6 that's what's most important. You know? They're a lot
7 younger than what has happened in the town in the past,
8 which I think is a good thing.

9 You guys both have kids and families, and you're
10 bringing them up, and you know what that's all about, and
11 you know the struggles that the residents have, and paying
12 taxes isn't easy as it was in this economy. So I'd like to
13 just congratulate the both of you. I'd like to say thank
14 you, thank you to you very, very much for always being
15 professionals. Congratulations, and I look forward to
16 working with both of you in leading this department into a
17 nice horizon.

18 Chief?

19 MR. STRUMOLO: Thank you, sir. I just want to say
20 thank you, Mayor and all the commissioners. It's truly an
21 honor and a privilege to have this opportunity to serve as
22 chief of the community. I worked hard for this, and, you
23 know, it's a lifelong dream to actually reach the top now
24 and make a difference, and I will work hard every day to
25 continue to keep Nutley the place we all know it, and I will

1 not let you down, and I will work together with all of the
2 officers here tonight. Because they're the guys that make
3 this happen. You know, these are the guys that go out every
4 day and work for all of us, and it's a privilege and honor
5 to serve as their leader, and I look forward to working
6 together. Thank you.

7 (Applause)

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

9 (Applause)

10 MAYOR PETRACCO: Congratulations.

11 Captain?

12 MR. IRWIN: Mayor, Commissioners, I'd just like to
13 take this opportunity to thank you. It truly has been a
14 pleasure to serve the town as a police officer for the past
15 15 years, and it will be my honor to be the captain as long
16 as I'm here. Thank you.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

18 (Applause)

19 MAYOR PETRACCO: Commissioner Scarpelli?

20 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Chief and Captain, it's
21 been a pleasure working with you the last couple of months
22 in your acting roles. Congratulations on your appointments
23 tonight, and I look forward to working with both of you for
24 a long time. Congratulations again.

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Commissioner Rogers?

1 COMMISSËONER ROGERS: Chief and Captain and the
2 officers out in the audience, especially with the chief and
3 the captain now in charge of the department, I had the
4 unique opportunity of working with you fellows for 38 years,
5 for the most part of my life. I think the message -- I
6 believe the message that the township is getting tonight is
7 that the mayor has ensured, through the decision that he
8 made, that this township is going to be in good hands.
9 People need to know that when they hear about the crime
10 increasing around us. It seems like the hand of God is on
11 this town, because we have good police officers.

12 So, Mayor, I congratulate you for making this
13 decision, and again, I know now the town's in good hands,
14 and our children, our grandchildren, hopefully, because, as
15 you said, Mayor, they're young fellows. They're going to
16 grow up in the same type of environment we did. So God
17 bless you.

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you, Commissioner.

19 Commissioner Evans?

20 COMMISSËONER EVANS: Gentlemen, thank you for your
21 service.

22 All of the police officers, thank you for your
23 service. Nutley is a town that sits as an oasis. There's a
24 lot of things that can influence us, and most important to
25 us is protecting our borders, protecting our citizens,

1 protecting our children, and even protecting our animals.
2 They're there every time. It's a community policing
3 department, which actually, I think, gives you a higher
4 responsibility, and you carry that out with honor. I
5 appreciate all that you do.

6 Chief, congratulations. I look forward to working
7 with you. Many years of success.

8 Captain, same to you. Many years of success, and
9 hopefully, under your leadership, the Nutley Police
10 Department will rise even higher than what it's risen.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

12 Commissioner Tucci?

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes. Chief Strumolo, I've
14 been waiting a long time to say that. I think the mayor
15 made an excellent decision. I think it's an excellent
16 choice, both you and Captain Irwin. You're the future.

17 You fellows have the background. You have the
18 energy. You have the integrity, and most importantly, you
19 have the support of the department. I congratulate you,
20 and, as everyone else has already said -- I'll be redundant
21 at this point -- whatever this board can do to support you
22 and keep this town the safe family town that it is, we're
23 here to do for you. Congratulations to you both and your
24 families.

25 (Applause)

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. We are going to continue
2 with our normal business.

3 If there's anyone that would like to escape now,
4 you may, or you're going to have to sit through a long
5 meeting.

6 P.J. being the first one up.

7 You know, the old chief loved to sit through all
8 of our meetings.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah.

10 (Laughter)

11 (Pause)

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. I guess, if I have -- here
13 we go.

14 I don't see we have any ordinance introductions,
15 no ordinance public hearings. So I guess we'll move on to
16 -- but, before we do that, I think we should do the reports,
17 Madam Clerk.

18 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes, I have a shade tree
20 report for the months of January and February, and, if you
21 take a close look at February, we were in a support position
22 for the Department of Public Works in the area of snow
23 removal around.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That's all I have.

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

2 Okay. Now, we'll move on to resolutions.

3 Commissioner Rogers?

4 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: None, Mayor, thank you.

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Would you like to add anything to
6 that?

7 Commissioner Tucci?

8 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes. BE IT RESOLVED by the
9 board of commissioners of the township of Nutley, county of
10 Essex, state of New Jersey that, in accordance with the
11 provisions of R.S. 40A: 4-59, the following transfer(s) of
12 2013 Appropriation Reserves be and the same are hereby
13 authorized and approved. In the department of parks and
14 public property, from Group Insurance, an amount of \$2,500
15 to shade tree salaries and wages, \$1,200; to public
16 buildings and grounds salary and wages, \$1,300, for a like
17 total of \$2,500.

18 I move the resolution.

19 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Second.

20 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

5 Commissioner Evans?

6 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Thank you. WHEREAS, the
7 township of Nutley, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-12A and
8 N.J.A.C. 5:24-7.2(c), may by resolution and without
9 advertising for bids, purchase any goods or services under
10 the State of New Jersey Cooperative Purchasing Program for
11 any state contracts entered into on behalf of the state by
12 the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of
13 the Treasury; and

14 WHEREAS, the township of Nutley has the need on a
15 timely basis to purchase goods or services utilizing the
16 state contracts; and

17 WHEREAS, the township of Nutley intends to enter
18 into contracts with Candoris Technologies as authorized
19 under the Dell NJ WSCA Contract B27160/ and state contract
20 #70256 and also Samuels, Inc./Buy Wise Auto number 73219 and
21 85902 through this resolution and properly executed
22 contracts, which shall be subject to all conditions
23 applicable to the current state contracts;

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the township of
25 Nutley that the township of Nutley authorizes the purchasing

1 agent to purchase certain goods or services from these
2 approved state contract vendors pursuant to all of the
3 conditions of the state contract; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the governing body of
5 the township of Nutley, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:20-5.5
6 (b) the certification of available funds shall either
7 certify the full maximum amount against the budget at the
8 time the contract is awarded, or no contract shall be
9 chargeable or certified until such times as the goods or
10 services are ordered or otherwise called for prior to
11 placing the order and a certification of availability of
12 funds is made by the chief finance officer; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of this
14 contract between the township of Nutley and Candoris
15 Technologies shall be January 1, 2014 through December 31,
16 2014.

17 So moved.

6 Essex, New Jersey, that the municipal clerk be and is hereby
7 authorized and directed to advertise for a request for
8 qualifications or proposal for grant writing consulting
9 service.

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the request for
11 proposals shall be due on Wednesday, April 9th, 2014 at 3:00
12 P.M. Nutley township hall, third floor commission chambers,
13 One Kennedy Drive, Nutley, NJ, at which time they will be
14 opened and read.

15 So move.

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

2 COMMISSIONER EVANS: WHEREAS, New Jersey statutes
3 40A: 4-19 provides that where debt service is to be paid in
4 2014 prior to the time of the final adoption of the 2014
5 budget, temporary appropriations should be made for the
6 amount of such debt service in the manner and time therein
7 provided;

8 WHEREAS, the date of this resolution is subsequent
9 to December 20th, 2013; and

10 WHEREAS, debt service will become due during the
11 first six months of 2014;

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the board of
13 commissioners of the township of Nutley, that the following
14 temporary appropriations be made. Total debt service --
15 \$79,427.50 in the operating current fund, and, in the water
16 budget, the water operating fund debt service no payments
17 are required.

18 So move.

8 appropriations may be lawfully made for the purposes and
9 amounts required in the manner and time therein provided;
10 and

11 WHEREAS, the total emergency temporary resolutions
12 adopted in the year 2014 pursuant to the provisions of
13 chapter 96, P.L. 1951 (N.J.S. 40A: 4-20), including this
14 resolution total \$12,421,318.00.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance
16 with N.J.S. 40A: 4-20: emergency temporary appropriations be
17 and the same are hereby made for the total amount of
18 \$12,421,318. That said emergency temporary appropriations
19 will be provided for in the budget to cover the general
20 appropriations for the mayor's office, the department of
21 public affairs, the department of revenue and finance, the
22 department of public safety, the department of public works,
23 department of parks and public property as well as
24 additional appropriations to cover such items as gasoline,
25 fuel, electricity, street lighting, contingent items,

1 deferred charges such as and including pension and insurance
2 and general appropriations for items such as sewer and
3 sanitation, the public library, the municipal
4 (indiscernible), for a grand total of \$12,421,818.

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: WHEREAS, 40A: 4-20 provides
17 that where contracts, commitments or payments are to be made
18 prior to the final adoption of the 2014 water utility
19 budget, emergency appropriations may be lawfully made for
20 the purpose and amount required in the manner and time
21 therein provided; and

22 WHEREAS, the total emergency temporary
23 appropriation adopted in 2014 pursuant to the provisions of
24 chapter 96, P.L. 1951 (N.J.S. 40A: 4-20), including this
25 resolution, total \$1,072,008.88.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance
2 with N.J.S. 40A: 4-20: emergency temporary appropriations
3 be and the same are hereby made for the total amount of
4 \$1,072,008.38 to cover water utility appropriations for
5 salaries, other expenses, North district water supply
6 charges, the city of Newark, Passaic Valley Water
7 Commission, annual audit, and group insurance and other
8 deferred charges related to Social Security payments.

9 So move.

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

11 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

21 COMMISSIONER EVANS: The last resolution that I
22 read is -- I'm reading it, but it's actually a combined
23 resolution from the board of commissioners, a resolution of
24 the board of commissioners authorizing the planning board of
25 the township of Nutley to conduct a preliminary

1 investigation of certain property within the township for
2 potential redevelopment.

3 WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:2A-6 authorizes the
4 governing body of any municipality, by resolution, to
5 have its planning board conduct a preliminary investigation
6 to determine whether an area of the municipality
7 is a condemnation area in need of redevelopment pursuant to
8 the criteria contained in N.J.S.A. 40A:2A-5; and

9 WHEREAS, the board of commissioners of the
10 township of Nutley considers it to be in the best interests
11 of the township of Nutley to have the township planning
12 board conduct such an investigation of an area known as the
13 Hoffman LaRoche site, consisting of certain properties
14 located in the township, which properties are identified as
15 to their lot and blocks as shown and attached to this
16 resolution known collectively as the property.

17 WHEREAS, the township believes the property is
18 potentially valuable for contributing to, serving, and
19 protecting the public health, safety and welfare and for the
20 promotion of smart growth within the Town: and

21 WHEREAS, the preliminary investigation will be
22 designed to evaluate the area to determine whether
23 designation of the property as in need of redevelopment is
24 appropriate and in conformance with the statutory
25 criteria contained in N.J.S.A. 40A:2A-5; and

1 WHEREAS, subject to the results of the preliminary
2 investigation, the redevelopment area determination shall
3 authorize the township to use all those powers under the
4 local redevelopment and housing law, N.J.S.A. 40A:d2A-1,
5 including the use of eminent domain.

6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the board of
7 commissioners of the township of Nutley that one, the
8 planning board of the township is hereby directed to conduct
9 a preliminary investigation to determine whether the
10 aforementioned property, or any portions thereof, constitute
11 a condemnation area in need of redevelopment according to
12 the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:d2A-5;

13 Two, the planning board of the township is hereby
14 directed to study the area known as the attached block

16 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

19 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

20 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Aye.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: There's a typo on the --

23 MADAM CLERK: On the affidavit for the change
24 order?

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 1500 should be --

1 MADAM CLERK: Okaye I will correct that. It will
2 indicate 15,000.00. Thank you.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

4 Okaye That concludes our business portion of this
5 evening's meeting. I'd like to thank everyone for waiting
6 for us to come out of an executive sessione

7 If there's anyone this evening that would like to
8 address the mike, please step forward.

9 Before you do that -- I'm sorrye Madam Clerk,
10 please read --

11 MADAM CLERK: All persons addressing the board of
12 commissioners regarding community concerns should approach
13 the microphone and provide their name and address for the
14 recorde Unless further time is granted by the board, each
15 person shall limit their address to five minutes. All
16 remarks to the board and its individual members must be
17 addressed to the mayor.

18 The mayor may defer citizen comments to the
19 appropriate member of the board. Dialogue between citizens
20 and others addressing the board shall be allowed, unless the
21 mayor or presiding officer or the majority of the membership
22 of the board shall determine that the interests of decorum
23 and the expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
24 adversely affected by such dialogue.

25 Good evening.

1 MS. LANDRY: Mayor, Commissioners, Pennie Landry,
2 135 Lakeside Drive, Nutley, New Jersey.

3 December 18th, I asked a question, and I'm going
4 to ask it again, because I submitted an open request for the
5 minutes from the last meeting, and unfortunately, we're
6 having a little challenge with minutes being verbatim. So
7 I'll address that in a minute, but I want to reread it,
8 because Commissioner Evans provided some information last
9 week that I didn't write down, and I want to make sure I
10 have it.

11 So is that okay, Mayor?

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

13 MS. LANDRY: Okay. Our lot, 135, is in Zone R-1,
14 and it is smaller than 18 Edgewood, which is zoned R1AA,
15 which is 2 zones higher. 18 Edgewood's land description is
16 59 by 132.

17 And, at the last meeting, Mr. Evans, you gave me
18 the corrected dimensions. Would you provide those again,
19 please, sir?

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Am I required to answer that?

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Counsel?

22 MR. GENITEMPO: It's up to you, Mayor. It's a
23 personal question that has been asked and answered, and --

24 MS. LANDRY: Well, it's an 18 Edgewood, and you
25 gave me the dimensions last time, and you said they were

1 higher than they were.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's a question in the
3 past.

4 MS. LANDRY: I'm going to keep asking it until I
5 hear from Mr. Librizzi, as I was promised by Mr. Evans that
6 he would call me since December 18th. I think excessive
7 amount of time waiting for an official of this township to
8 call me. I was told at the last meeting that Mr. Evans
9 would ask Mr. Librizzi to call me concerning this question.
10 This question was first asked December 18th. I think he's
11 had enough time.

12 Mr. Evans, do you want to answer or not?

13 COMMISSIONER EVANS: The particular question of
14 sitting down with Mr. Librizzi. You have filed complaints
15 with the county as well as the state, and, on the advice of
16 counsel, until that's resolved, I was advised to --

17 MS. LANDRY: I have not filed anything.

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: You have been before the
19 board and have said you filed a complaint.

20 MS. LANDRY: I have not been before the board.

21 COMMISSIONER EVANS: (Indiscernible.)

22 MS. LANDRY: So I don't know who has been.

23 MR. GENITEMPO: Ms. Landry, you have --

24 COMMISSIONER EVANS: It's on the record.

25 MR. GENITEMPO: -- said in emails that you have

1 filed complaints with the state. Excuse me -- about
2 Mr. Librizzi. You've gone to the county against
3 Mr. Librizzi. You've questioned his abilities and his
4 competence, and now, --

5 MS. LANDRY: Do you have a complaint number, sir?

6 MR. GENITEMPO: No, you're the one that said in an
7 email --

8 MS. LANDRY: I do not have a complaint number or
9 anything against Mr. Librizzi. I have sent emails.

10 MR. GENITEMPO: If you don't want me to speak, I
11 won't speak.

12 MS. LANDRY: Well, maybe they've contacted you.
13 Because they haven't contacted me.

14 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm only going by what you have
15 told us in emails.

16 MS. LANDRY: Well, if you could get the verbatim
17 minutes, then we could discuss this. Where are the verbatim
18 minutes, Mr. Genitempo?

19 MR. GENITEMPO: The township is not required to
20 provide stenographic transcripts of the meeting --

21 MS. LANDRY: Why did they provide them in all of
22 2013?

23 MR. GENITEMPO: If you'd like me to answer (off-
24 mike). I'm trying to explain to you the meeting you got
25 verbatim minutes, which were not stenographic, do not have

1 to be stenographic. When the meetings are long and they're
2 hard to transcribe by hand (off-mike) a service to be
3 transcribed. Some minutes do not.

4 I know that the clerk gave you the actual audio
5 transcript or the audio tape of the meeting, which is, in
6 your words, I believe, verbatim. We are not required to pay
7 to have a stenographic transcript made of every single (off-
8 mike) trying to avoid that. So, to answer your question, we
9 abide with the law on the verbatim minutes. I know you
10 don't accept that, but that is what we believe --

11 MS. LANDRY: I have a question for the mayor.

12 Mayor, was there a vote where it was decided that
13 there would no longer be transcribed minutes as they were
14 for every board of commissioners meeting in 2013?

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Was there a law?

16 MS. LANDRY: Was there a vote? How was that
17 decided that the methodology for providing the minutes to
18 the taxpayers of Nutley was changed for 2014?

19 (Off-mike)

20 MS. LANDRY: I'm addressing the mayor, please.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Mayor, may I answer that,
22 please?

23 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Off-mike) is that we did
25 not have a vote on that. We're not required to vote on

1 that. The clerk of our town is certified and is required to
2 comply with the law related to the preparation of minutes
3 and/or transcripts, if needed. We do not have to vote on
4 that. It is the law.

5 MS. LANDRY: Do you agree, Mayor, that the way
6 that the minutes have been provided to the taxpaying
7 citizens in 2013, which was by transcription, which provided
8 them with information that I believe is their right -- do
9 you now agree that the format for these minutes should be in
10 no way, shape, or form verbatim, but paragraphs where key
11 issues are left out?

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: I think that what we all try to
13 do, myself as the mayor and the commissioners, our governing
14 body, is to always inform the residents and always be
15 transparent up here.

16 MS. LANDRY: You have up to 2014.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: You know? So -- right. So, you
18 know, Pennie, this is all new. You know? My answer, my
19 honest answer is that I really never paid attention to what
20 happened to the minutes after these.

21 I just assumed that, if somebody requested them or
22 if they were going up on our website -- so, now that you
23 bring this to our attention and mine, if there's a way that
24 we can put minutes on and in the most possible fashion of
25 being transparent up here -- I know that we've had issues

1 with these microphones, as you could see. I know that we've
2 discussed replacement for them, and, you know, whatever we
3 can do to be transparent we're always going to do.

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Mayor?

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

6 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Can I interject here for a
7 moment?

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Ms. Landry, I just want you
10 to know that I have all the faith and confidence in
11 Mrs. Rosario and her decision making. You do raise a good
12 point, though, and, as the mayor has said, our equipment is
13 somewhat antiquated. We will be putting dollars into this
14 capital budget to replace this, but I think -- you know and
15 I've raised this. I guess it was back in 2002 or maybe
16 2003, I guess everybody was here.

17 You came later, Commissioner Evans.

18 It might be time -- and the issue of, you know,
19 addressing the issue of transparency that we start
20 televising these meetings so that, if the burden is not
21 placed on Mrs. Rosario -- Mayor, we had this conversation --

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: We have.

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- with pretty much all of
24 the commissioners.

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yep.

1 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: All right? If it's more
2 economical and it makes the office run better not to
3 transcribe verbatim minutes, well then, so be it, but, if we
4 televise our meetings, we'll be killing two birds with one
5 stone. Just something to think about, and, if everybody
6 agrees, --

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: I agree. I --

8 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- I'd be happy to offer that
9 resolution that --

10 MS. LANDRY: Thank you, Mayor.

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- at the next meeting.

12 MS. LANDRY: Thank you, Commissioner. Thank you.

13 So could it be that -- I brought up communications before,
14 but, because it wasn't a raffle, it was read in. So I would
15 like to make a communication available requesting that, but
16 I don't know how to do it.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: Requesting what --

18 MS. LANDRY: Because every way I've tried to do it
19 it gets shut out.

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: Requesting what?

21 MS. LANDRY: You want me to read the request from
22 December 18th where I requested that we change the way we
23 provide minutes?

24 And it was not put into the minutes because
25 somebody said -- I believe it was you, Mr. Genitempo -- that

1 traditionally, we only accept certain types of
2 communications.

3 And he sent me a list. It was like raffles and
4 things that really don't make that big of a difference for
5 the community as a whole. So I don't know how to
6 communicate with the elected officials who represent me.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. We could --

8 MS. LANDRY: And it's very frustrating.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure. Well, we're communicating
10 now, obviously.

11 MS. LANDRY: Yes, yes.

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: But, if there's a better format
13 -- tonight, I don't know if there's anyone else that would
14 like to speak. So, if it's light like that, that's fine.
15 However, you know, look. We're here to, you know, --

16 MS. LANDRY: But it's not just for me.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: It's the --

18 MS. LANDRY: It's for all the taxpayers.

19 MAYOR PETRACCO: Listen, I understand that.
20 That's why I think it's a good idea that, you know, we do
21 move on something we'll televise these meetings, because
22 people are working later, and, you know, technology being
23 what it is, the people, you know, have a right. I'm sure
24 there's a cost associated with that as well that needs to be
25 looked at, but I'm in favor of televising these meetings as

1 well.

2 MS. LANDRY: Thank you.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: But that's my own personal
4 opinion.

5 MS. LANDRY: Thank you.

6 If I can have another couple of minutes? Do you
7 mind, Mayor?

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

9 MS. LANDRY: Okay, thank you.

10 So I'd like to go back to the issue of Librizzi
11 and my taxes that 18 Edgewood is 2 zones higher and larger,
12 even larger than it's listed at the tax assessor's office,
13 according to Commissioner Evans, and yet, my lot, our lot,
14 my fiancé and I -- it is taxed \$36,800 higher than a larger
15 lot in 2 zones higher. I have requested that Mr. Librizzi
16 contact me regarding this. Yes, I sent an email and have
17 been communicating via email with the state of New Jersey
18 for an answer. Okay?

19 There is no complaint number. There is no file
20 that has been done. There have been emails that have gone
21 back and forth. The last email said, "We are preparing a
22 written response." There is no lawsuit. There is no formal
23 complaint. None of that exists.

24 So I do not know what Mr. Genitempo is referring
25 to, because I don't have any of that. I never did anything

1 other than ask the same question that I have asked here that
2 has not been able to be answered in a way that I can
3 understand. I asked the same question to the state, and
4 they are preparing a written response to me which I have not
5 received. However, I --

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Who is --

7 MS. LANDRY: -- would be happy to show up here and
8 read it.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Who is the they? Who is the they
10 that's supposed to give you the written answer?

11 MS. LANDRY: Joan Durkin, a gentleman by the last
12 name of Scott, and I think that's it.

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

14 MS. LANDRY: That's who I'm getting emails from.

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

16 MS. LANDRY: I don't know who they really are.

17 One says treasurer's office on his email, and the other one
18 says Caldwell Banker.

19 MAYOR PETRACCO: If you could provide us with that
20 information, then we'll see what's on their mind.

21 MS. LANDRY: If there is some kind of suit, I
22 don't know anything about it, because nobody's asked me
23 about it. Now, Evelyn and I are going to sit down with a
24 mediator from the state about the planning board minutes,
25 but I did not take it -- I had a choice to go to court or to

1 mediate, and I respect Evelyn, and I respect all of you
2 here. So I chose to mediate.

3 I am also holding right here six court documents
4 that I have not signed and turned in to our court here
5 dealing with planning board issues, and respecting for all
6 of you, I'm holding them in hopes that we can take care of
7 our dirty laundry amongst ourselves without having to go and
8 let Belleville and Bloomfield deal with this stuff, because
9 our judge can't deal with it, because she appointed most of
10 the people to the planning board.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Well, Ms. Landry, as I spoke to
12 you, you know, I am looking forward to meeting with you to
13 get some type of resolution with that, and this way, we
14 could move on with those six complaints.

15 MS. LANDRY: Well, it's taking too much time.

16 MAYOR PETRACCO: Right.

17 MS. LANDRY: I mean, these things are important,
18 all of these things. I wouldn't be up here every two weeks
19 with this stuff if I didn't feel it was, in my heart, that
20 it was important for everybody.

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: I understand.

22 MS. LANDRY: You know? Because, when I talk to
23 people, you know what they tell --

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: (Indiscernible.)

25 MS. LANDRY: -- me about this town? That's the

1 way it's always been, Pennie. (Indiscernible.)

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: Who's telling you that?

3 MS. LANDRY: Neighbors, people I meet, anybody I
4 talk to says, "Oh, forget it. You're wasting your time."
5 Well, I have time. That's one thing I have, and I have
6 energy, and I have passion, and I also called the realtor to
7 see if I could get what value out of my house that I have.
8 But guess what? Real estate values are --

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Plummeting.

10 MS. LANDRY: -- plummeting in this town. I can't
11 get out of it what I have in it. And all this started when
12 I submitted -- try and bring more tax dollars into this town
13 -- a little comment, a \$3,000 architectural plan to build a
14 playhouse at my house.

15 This all started because of the inefficiencies
16 within one of the departments here, which, as I understand
17 from other people who are dealing with that department,
18 haven't changed. It breaks my heart, because I want to live
19 in a town that I'm really proud of, and I want to be part of
20 it, and I want everybody here who never shows up to feel
21 like they can show up here and be heard and listened to and
22 not, when they make requests, there's all this legal mumbo-
23 jumbo about why we can't do it or that my neighbor can't
24 discuss, for whatever legal reasons he's being coached on,
25 what the true dimensions of his lot are.

1 I would respectfully submit (off-mike). Sorry.

2 I'm submitting a piece of paper from the Essex
3 Treasurer's Office showing that Commissioner Evans' land is
4 59 by 132, even though at the last meeting, he said that it
5 was larger.

6 I have one other thing.

7 Evelyn, thank you for being so sweet and so kind
8 and so wonderful.

9 If I could find it, which I can't. So I'll just
10 -- like everything else, it doesn't matter.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Ms. Landry, before -- Ms. Landry,
12 before you step down, before you step down, I just want you
13 to know that this board -- we are always open to public
14 comment, and we are always willing to listen. So I
15 understand, and I'm looking forward to our meeting, but I
16 don't want you to get frustrated. I don't want you to ever
17 think that your voice falls on deaf ears here, because it
18 does not.

19 MS. LANDRY: Well, can I say something?

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sure.

21 MS. LANDRY: I've had great results with you.
22 However, I sent everybody an email saying, you know, about
23 my frustration about the minutes, and I said I'd really love
24 to hear from any one of you, and I didn't get one email
25 response. I also emailed Commissioner Evans eight questions

1 about the budget. I've gotten no responses. I can go back
2 through all of my emails, and I can give you per
3 commissioner 30, as I counted them up, 30 emails that have
4 not been responded to by any commissioner, and it breaks my
5 heart. Thank you.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

7 Is there anyone else this evening --

8 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Mayor?

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Commissioner Scarpelli?

10 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: About the televising?

11 You know, maybe with technology the way it is we can get
12 away -- you're never going to get away, but maybe be a
13 little bit smarter in the televising. Maybe videotape and
14 post it to our website like a (off-mike) type of thing where
15 we wouldn't incur the costs of television and all the
16 things, the reverberation and all the other things we have
17 to do to get them televised.

18 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That's a good point,
19 Commissioner, and, when I said televised meetings, that was
20 a generic term, even though I myself am low-tech. Jim -- I
21 know Jim Kelly (ph) and the high school and many of us here,
22 all right, and many of the people in our I.F. department can
23 accomplish that so that people can, in fact, see what goes
24 on here, and there are not any misconceptions, and no one
25 gets the thought or even the idea that someone is trying to

1 hide something here.

2 The government does move slow, Ms. Landry. I will
3 acknowledge that. All right? But there is nothing
4 inappropriate, all right, that I am aware of that goes on in
5 this government.

6 MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive.
7 So this is very interesting. I submitted my communication
8 to specifically request, Commissioner Scarpelli, that the
9 audio be put on the website, and I was told at a meeting
10 that you were all here that, by law, it could not be done.

11 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: I don't remember that.
12 I've been --

13 MS. LANDRY: Well, I think you were here. I do
14 believe you were here.

15 Mr. Genitempo told me this at this podium that --
16 now, in my bag right now, I have a CD of the meeting. Okay?
17 So I can get a CD, and I can play it in my own computer. I
18 can also take money out of my pocket and go have it
19 transcribed and post it all over the web. Okay?

20 So there's something not right here which I'm not
21 understanding about why we can give people a CD and about
22 why in all the 2013 we could have the minutes transcribed
23 and posted on the website. Okay? And, now all of a sudden
24 in 2014, we can't do that.

25 So, if you all want to go -- and I don't mind,

1 Mr. Genitempo, saying this is one I will go to the state of
2 New Jersey and fight it complete with complaint and file
3 number for both the board of commissioners and the planning
4 board. So I hope that we can resolve that before this
5 happens. Because, up to this point, I haven't gotten mad
6 yet. Thank you.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: Was there anyone else this
8 evening that would like to address the board of
9 commissioners?

10 Please state your name and address for the record.

11 MR. ODRIA: My name is Michael Odria, 133 High
12 Street.

13 Mr. -- oh, sorry. Mayor.

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: That's okay.

15 MR. ODRIA: I just have to ask him a question.

16 Did I even hear you before you said that you're
17 going to condemn Hoffman-LaRoche? Did I hear that
18 correctly?

19 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Not going to. It's an
20 evaluation of the property, that whole area.

21 MR. ODRIA: Uh-huh.

22 COMMISSIONER EVANS: In need of redevelopment.
23 That's the actual procedure, but, within the statute, there
24 is a provision that, if the township chose to, we could
25 actually condemn it through eminent domain, which would be

1 to buy it, and that's what that means. There's no decision
2 to do that. It's just right now it's an evaluation,
3 preliminary evaluation to go to the planning board to
4 evaluate the property as if it's in need of redevelopment.

5 The importance of doing that is, if it is
6 designated that, it opens the property up to special
7 financing arrangements with the state, you know, for state
8 loans and state funding, which we would not otherwise be --
9 would not otherwise be available to us.

10 MR. ODRIA: Okay. So what's the scenario if it's
11 condemned? Will that affect our property taxes to go
12 higher?

13 COMMISSIONER EVANS: No matter what's going to go
14 on with Hoffman-LaRoche, whether we condemn it or not, the
15 use of the property has changed. The buildings that were
16 there are no longer there. The value of the property has
17 gone down. The implication is that, yes, it could increase
18 our taxes.

19 What we've been doing is we've been working with
20 the state to qualify for transitional aid to enable us to
21 offset that cost. I talked about that last Wednesday.

22 MR. ODRIA: Yes, I remember that.

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: That's what we're doing.

24 MR. ODRIA: Well, you broke convention. Now,
25 that's why I'm bringing it up.

1 Another thing -- for the review and finance
2 department for the 2014 budget, will there be any increases?
3 Because I've seen that it increased almost \$70,000. I know
4 that's a minimum, but everything counts nowadays. From a
5 2000 -- what was it? 2012 to 2013? There's an increase of
6 about \$70,000. Do you expect any increases in that
7 department?

8 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes.

9 MR. ODRIA: And will that affect our property
10 taxes going up, too?

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Along with other increases in
12 the town, yes.

13 MR. ODRIA: And are you doing anything to help
14 stop it, put a tax freeze on that?

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes.

16 MR. ODRIA: You know, stop it. You know, so our
17 property -- because, as concerned --

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah.

19 MR. ODRIA: -- property taxpaying --

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Right.

21 MR. ODRIA: -- homeowner, that, you know, we're
22 getting cash-strapped.

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Okay.

24 MR. ODRIA: We're not limitless in what we can pay
25 in property taxes. Because, at some point, from what I

1 understand, we were a town of 30,000 people. Now we're --
2 last I heard, we're at 25,000 people or --

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Twenty-nine.

4 MR. ODRIA: There's 29? Because I heard 25.

5 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Twenty-nine.

6 MR. ODRIA: Okay.

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Twenty-nine.

8 MR. ODRIA: So you're taking 29. All right. But,
9 if you know that it's going to affect our property taxes,
10 you know, the increases in all these departments, wage
11 increases, whatever -- if you know that that's going to
12 affect us, how can you do it? Can't you just stop? I mean,
13 I've said this before.

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Well, --

15 MR. ODRIA: In the private sector, if we can't
16 afford it, we don't do it.

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I work in the private sector.
18 I understand it.

19 MR. ODRIA: Okay. But the question is why don't
20 you just stop.

21 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Can't.

22 MR. ODRIA: So the burden's going to just fall on
23 us, all of us homeowners?

24 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Ultimately, if we cannot get
25 additional state aid, we do not -- and we cannot stop

1 increases that we get bills for. Just like you as a
2 homeowner get a bill. You get an increase in your insurance
3 costs for your homeowners' insurance. You can't turn around
4 and say to the insurance company, "Please don't give me a
5 new insurance bill for my homeowners' insurance. Please
6 don't make it go up, because I can't afford it. I don't
7 want it to go up."

8 We can't do the same as a municipality to tell our
9 insurer not to give me an increase in a bill. But, when I
10 get the increase in a bill, we do everything we can to
11 mitigate that increase. So you specifically singled out my
12 department.

13 MR. ODRIA: No, I'm saying all departments, but
14 I'm --

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah.

16 MR. ODRIA: Since I'm talking to you, I might as
17 well, you know, -- you have the facts.

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Okay.

19 MR. ODRIA: I guess I could do --

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: You specifically singled out
21 my department.

22 MR. ODRIA: Yeah.

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: And the increase in my
24 department from 2012 to 2013. The increase in my department
25 was \$208,000.

1 MR. ODRIA: Oh, so I was wrong. I'm sorry.

2 COMMISSIONER EVANS: You were. You were.

3 MR. ODRIA: It was a lot more. Sorry.

4 COMMISSIONER EVANS: But it did go up. It did go
5 up. \$135,000 of that increase related to specific legal
6 activities in support of what's going on with Hoffman-
7 LaRoche. It's a major entity. It's a major corporate
8 structure, and the expertise that's required to that is not
9 something that a township normally has.

10 MR. ODRIA: Uh-huh.

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: We have to hire legal
12 counsel. So you heard tonight the payment of -- an approval
13 of payment of a bill for Inglesino and Pearlman, who are
14 legal counsel, and so, in my budget, it reflects the money
15 to help support those activities. As my department is not
16 specific to roads or parks or public affairs or public
17 safety. It's a general area where money finds itself for a
18 general purpose in the town. So \$135,000 of that increase
19 is related to those activities.

20 There's another \$115,000 worth of increase for
21 various cost increases, including the adjustment of
22 salaries. I was able to reduce that by \$47,000 to have a
23 net increase of \$68,000 in my department. So, on a net
24 basis, my budget went up \$68,000.

25 Now, in relation to the township budget, my budget

1 itself represents -- let's see -- it's about four percent of
2 the municipal budget. It's about 1.9 percent in total of
3 the township levy, the tax levy, and it's about 5 percent of
4 the municipal levy. Because remember the tax bill is
5 divided into three components. So my department is a fairly
6 small component of the total tax bill.

7 MR. ODRIA: Uh-huh.

8 COMMISSIONER EVANS: But, in my department as
9 well, I have surcharges. I have the pension charge for the
10 township. I have all the Social Security payments for the
11 township. So the billing, when you look at an individual
12 department, it is complex. Now, when you roll it all
13 together, all of the commissioners work very hard together
14 to try and figure out what's the best thing that we can do
15 to mitigate these costs.

16 MR. ODRIA: Well, you only could (indiscernible)
17 the two percent, because the law of the state, and --

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Well, --

19 MR. ODRIA: -- I remember the last time, a couple
20 times before -- I'm sorry -- that you guys were all
21 congratulating each other back in December. "Oh, wow, we
22 could have went up 15 percent or something like that, but we
23 did a great job. We only did --"

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Hey, hey, Michael, that --
25 listen. We're public servants, but we're not here to get

1 abused or mocked.

2 MR. ODRIA: No, we're not -- I'm not mocking you.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: No, no, no, no, let me finish.

4 MR. ODRIA: But I'm just stating a fact.

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Listen.

6 MR. ODRIA: If you remember.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: We're not going to talk over each
8 other, right?

9 MR. ODRIA: Right.

10 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. The thing is that what
11 Commissioner Evans is saying -- okay? We don't congratulate
12 ourselves. We don't pat each other on the back, and we get
13 \$2,200 to do this. Okay?

14 But however, we all do our best. We do our very
15 best. We all live in this town as well. Our taxes have
16 gone up considerably, and there's a lot of drivers of the
17 budget that create that.

18 Our pension contribution, Commissioner Evans, is
19 approximately --

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Total contribution?

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yes.

22 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Seven, eight million a year.

23 MAYOR PETRACCO: Our health benefits?

24 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Close to five, around five.

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Is that the increase?

1 COMMISSIONER EVANS: No, no, that's total. The
2 increase this year in pension, total pension, is about
3 \$348,000.

4 MR. ODRIA: How much is the total pension -- I'm
5 sorry. How much is the total pension that we pay in this
6 town?

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: In total?

8 MR. ODRIA: Yeah. You said 8 million, did you?

9 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah, our annual bill is 7, 8
10 million.

11 MR. ODRIA: I'm curious. How many people are
12 under that pension that get paid in this town that are on
13 pension here in this town?

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: I think this is not a forum for a
15 discussion. If we're going to have -- this is a forum for
16 comment. Okay? So I've let -- I've been very patient up
17 here.

18 I let everybody speak pretty much as long as they
19 want, but it is a five-minute rule that we have in place in
20 case there's other people that want to be heard, but what
21 I'm saying to you is this is that everybody that's on this
22 board -- we work very, very diligently and hard and spend
23 many, many hours -- Commissioner Rogers said tonight to me
24 that we think we make about 24 cents an hour doing this job.

25 MR. ODRIA: Yeah.

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: So again, we are not giving up.
2 We pay taxes in the town. We do everything, everything
3 possible that we can to scrub all these budgets out.
4 However, there are things that are necessities, like police
5 and fire. People in Nutley want a health department. We
6 need DPW.

7 You know, people need the snow removal. They want
8 nice parks. You know? Our garbage has to be collected. It
9 costs money to do that.

10 MR. ODRIA: I understand that.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: You know? So, like you know, I
12 mean, I'm sure that your salary isn't the same what it was
13 ten years ago, just like the taxes aren't, because it's hard
14 to keep up. But whatever we do, we shop it. We make sure
15 that we're being competitive.

16 Even with our employees. When we pick our -- when
17 we're doing contracts and all that stuff, we don't just say,
18 "Let's give our police and firemen a ten percent raise and
19 everybody else in the industry is getting two.e" We compare,
20 because we do want good departments, and we want quality
21 people working for us, but you have to be competitive. And
22 shouldn't the town workers get a fair shake here, too? I
23 mean, shouldn't --

24 MR. ODRIA: In all honesty, I think they get --

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Shouldn't they get a fair shake?

1 MR. ODRIA: But this --

2 MAYOR PETRACCO: You know?

3 MR. ODRIA: I'm going to ask you a question.

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: I mean, those people -- but I
5 just want you to hear it all, because, you know, people seem
6 to only pick the highest salaries in town. There's a lot of
7 people in these departments, Commissioner Tucci, all the
8 commissioners, that are making way under 50,000 a year, and
9 it's very difficult to raise a family in any town, but you
10 have a lot of positive energy, and I applaud you for that.

11 You know, what I think the problem is -- it's not
12 unique to Nutley.

13 MR. ODRIA: Oh, it's not. It's all over the
14 state.

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay?

16 MR. ODRIA: I know.

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: This is a New Jersey issue.

18 MR. ODRIA: And this virus has to stop before it
19 spreads to the other surrounding states.

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: And, you know, Michael, we get
21 handed a lot of things. Just like in public safety. I'll
22 speak for myself. There is all kinds of training that's
23 mandated by the state that I have to send police officers
24 for, and I've got to backfill these holes in my schedule,
25 but the state doesn't say, "You know, we're going to mandate

1 it, but we're going to give you the money,e" and we all
2 suffer from that.

3 So believe me, you know, that stuff about
4 congratulating each other -- we're very frustrated, too, up
5 here. We don't want to -- you think that we don't want
6 people coming to the mike and saying, "Mayor, Commissioners,
7 what a great job. My taxes haven't gone up in ten years.e"

8 Do you think that we want to come here and listen
9 to, "What are you going to do about the taxes? What are you
10 going to do about the taxes? What aree--" We get it loud
11 and clear, and alls I can tell you from my heart I have my
12 family here. I have my parents here. We love this town,
13 and we're doing the very, very, very best that we can, but
14 there is a lot of drivers that are out of our control.

15 Are we going to give up? No. Commissioner Evans
16 has said this a million times about this state aid. Has
17 anybody in this audience tonight wrote a letter to
18 Governor Christy complaining about that we don't get a fair
19 shake of our state aid?

20 MR. ODRIA: Trust me. I write letters to
21 Governor Christy.

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: But did you specifically write
23 that letter? Because it's frustrating when your neighboring
24 towns are getting four times -- Commissioner Evans, is that
25 fair to say -- the state aid that Nutley gets?

1 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Municipal between Nutley and
2 Belleville -- Belleville gets \$4 million more at municipal
3 level, and roughly \$16 million more at the school level.

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: So what we need is we need people
5 not to be part of the problem. We get what the problems are
6 here. We're looking for people to be part of the solution.

7 MR. ODRIA: Then, I have a suggestion.

8 MAYOR PETRACCO: And that solution is is to get on
9 the phone with your legislation people and start writing
10 letters and saying look, I'm --

11 MR. ODRIA: I know Sweeney, Vincent Predo (ph),
12 Loretta Weinburg (ph) I know all them. They all know me
13 now, but I do have a question for you, too, and this is the
14 question. Do you remember -- and thanks to the Nutley Sun
15 for putting this in the Nutley Sun. July 5th, 2013 -- as I
16 walked in here, I saw you -- was that Officer Strumolo?

17 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yes.

18 MR. ODRIA: Remember this article?

19 MAYOR PETRACCO: Well, I can't see it, but --

20 MR. ODRIA: Yeah, this was -- so he's finally the
21 chief of police; am I correct on that?

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: We're in the process of doing
23 that, yes.

24 MR. ODRIA: Okay. Because I do remember that
25 night, and I'll reiterate from the last time, well, two

1 times ago I said this, or was it the last time -- that I
2 remember the night I came here, and there was -- it was like
3 a mob of cops that really wanted to -- they looked like --
4 honestly, they looked like they wanted to lynch you.

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: (Indiscernible.)

6 MR. ODRIA: And some old guy here was yelling at
7 you telling you to -- but that's what it looked like to me.
8 I mean, the rat on the door, some --

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: (Indiscernible.)

10 MR. ODRIA: -- old guy got up and said, you know,
11 please get the blank out of this town, like, yelling at you,
12 but --

13 MAYOR PETRACCO: Whoa, whoa, whoa. Let me say
14 this to you. Nobody said get the blank out of this town.

15 MR. ODRIA: It was right here. Some older guy --

16 MAYOR PETRACCO: No, if somebody said get the
17 blank out of this town to me, I would come around the desk,
18 and I wouldn't allow that, but go ahead. Continue.

19 MR. ODRIA: All right. Okay. Maybe I remember it
20 differently, but I do have this -- and, because of you, I'm
21 educated about this. What the discussion was that night was
22 that if he got his promotion, you would have to pay him
23 \$175,000 a year, and the reason why you didn't want to give
24 him his promotion is because we were going to pay him
25 \$175,000 a year. So basically, now that I walk in and I

1 guess he's going to -- I mean, I got nothing against the
2 guy.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Listen.

4 MR. ODRIA: But the thing is this is \$175,000 a
5 year.

6 MAYOR PETRACCO: Michael, Michael, Michael,
7 Michael, Michael, please. Give me a chance, and then, we
8 have to end it, because we can't be too long. But however,
9 no, that's not true. Right now, I'm in the process of
10 negotiating a salary with the new chief that, you know,
11 we're going through the process right now, but I have no
12 plans on paying him \$175,000. Okay?

13 MR. ODRIA: Okay. Because --

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: And let me follow-up by the
15 reason why. Our previous chief was making around that sum,
16 and it took that chief 40 years to make that kind of money.
17 So there's going to be a starting point a year with the new
18 chief, because he has approximately 18, 19 years on the job.
19 So it's going to take him a little while to get to that
20 salary.

21 MR. ODRIA: Okay.

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: However, we do want good people,
23 and you have to be fair and equitable of what the going rate
24 is, and that's what we're doing right now.

25 MR. ODRIA: I'm --

1 MAYOR PETRACCO: To come up with something that's
2 fair and just for the positions.

3 MR. ODRIA: I mean, I could be wrong on the
4 statistic, but I think I got it right, but I think the chief
5 of police of New York City, who covers 12 million people,
6 gets \$300,000 a year.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah, but -- all right. Listen.
8 We're going to move on now.

9 Okay. Is there any -- does he have any other
10 comment?

11 Mike, if you want to talk, I'll talk after the
12 meeting, but, for now on, too, if you have any other --

13 MR. ODRIA: But the point I'm trying to get at --
14 here's the point I'm trying to get at. We're all suffering
15 in this town, and literally, I am suffering.

16 I'm not making a lot of money, and I don't blame
17 my boss. I don't blame my clients. It's because my clients
18 don't have money. I'm a commissioned employee where I work,
19 and, when my clients don't have money because they're facing
20 the same problems that I'm facing in this town, like high
21 property taxes, 12, \$14,000 a year --

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: Michael, I work --

23 MR. ODRIA: Everyone should ban together and say
24 look, let's --

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: All right.

1 MR. ODRIA: These high salaries have to go down.
2 I mean, this is -- I mean, because of this, from what you
3 wrote in here, it opened my eyes, and many people in this
4 town --

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Listen, and I stand behind it,
6 what I wrote in there.

7 MR. ODRIA: No, I'm glad you do, and I'm glad that
8 --

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: And that's why --

10 MR. ODRIA: I applaud you --

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

12 MR. ODRIA: -- for pointing this out. That's what
13 a true leader does.

14 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

15 MR. ODRIA: But, to help us out more, you've got
16 to bring sanity to our tax code. I mean, I'm about to hit
17 12 grand, when I used to pay 3 pre-2006.

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

19 MR. ODRIA: I mean, come on.

20 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you, Michael. If we need
21 to talk more, we can talk on the side.

22 MR. ODRIA: No, but thank you for the time.

23 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

24 Just a couple ground rules, too, for these
25 continuing meetings and this. We have to stand a little

1 true to that this is a forum for a public comment. Okay?
2 So, in the future, if there's anyone that has a comment,
3 they are more than welcome to come discuss it.

4 If it becomes that it's going to be a conversation
5 in the future, then you need to ask that commissioner or
6 myself that, after the meeting, if they would be willing to
7 spend time to spend with you to discuss whatever your issues
8 are, but we cannot continue on this path of, you know,
9 people at the mike for 20 minutes. Okay? And not that I
10 don't want to be -- you guys to be heard. I will make
11 myself available after any meeting if anybody needs me or
12 any of the other commissioners. Okay?

13 Is there anyone else that --
14 (Off-mike)

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: That's fine.

16 MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive.
17 The number 67-14 -- is that a resolution?

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: What was it?

19 MS. LANDRY: On the Commissioner Evans, number 67-
20 14, authorize the planning board to conduct a preliminary
21 investigation --

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: That's a resolution.

23 MS. LANDRY: That is a resolution that was passed
24 tonight, I believe?

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yes.

1 MS. LANDRY: Okay. Now, given that it is already
2 printed and doesn't have to be transcribed, can a copy of
3 that resolution be obtained tomorrow?

4 (Off-mike)

5 MS. LANDRY: Oh, it is in the back of the room?
6 Oh, great.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah, when you walk in, that
8 should be in the packet.

9 MS. LANDRY: Oh, all that was back there when I
10 walked in were these.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay.

12 (Off-mike)

13 MS. LANDRY: Oh, great. Thank you. You all have
14 a great evening. Thank you.

15 (Off-mike)

16 MS. LANDRY: Downstairs? Yeah, they didn't have
17 them in the back.

18 MAYOR PETRACCO: That's fine. That's fine.

19 Is there any -- do you --

20 MS. LANDRY: I do have to say something.

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: All right.

22 MS. LANDRY: Somebody said at the Roche meeting
23 that we were going to get copies. That's just the agenda.
24 They never put those other things out.

25 At the Roche meeting, it was said that we would

1 get a handout at the end of the meeting, but I didn't get
2 mine. Were there handouts?

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Sam, do we have any available?
4 Could we get one to Ms. Landry?

5 MS. LANDRY: Because that little man -- you can
6 give me one? Okay, great. And then, final thing -- the
7 input, Mayor, that you promised, the input on the website
8 for people to put their ideas about Roche.

9 (Off-mike)

10 MS. LANDRY: Thank you. Thank you so much.

11 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you, everyone.

12 Is there anyone else this evening that would like
13 to address the board of commissioners?

14 Seeing no one, --

15 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Move to adjourn.

16 MAYOR PETRACCO: Second.

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

18 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

19 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

21 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

22 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

23 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

24 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

25 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

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
