2 MADAM CLERK: Board of Commissioners -- are you
3 ready?

4 Board of Commissioners Public meeting, Tuesday,
5 January 3rd, 2017, the time is 7:02.

6 Pursuant to the requirements of the Open Public
7 Meeting Act (Chapter 231, Public Law 1975), notice of this
8 meeting was published in the December 1st, 2016 issues of
9 The Nutley Sun and The Herald News, and the December 2nd,
10 2016 issue of The Star Ledger. A copy of this notice has
11 been posted on the Nutley Town Hall bulletin board and a
12 copy is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

13 Commissioner Rogers?

14 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Here.

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans is
18 absent/excused.

19 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

21 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Here.

23 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for
24 Commissioner Evans, he is absent/excused.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you. Commissioner

1 Petracco, what do you have on the agenda tonight? Page 3

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: We have a new prescription
3 drug disposal box at Public Safety that we -- got donated by
4 ADAPT. Is that correct? ADAPT, so we have a resolution
5 naming that and it would be a good place where people can
6 get rid of their -- clean out their medicine cabinets in a
7 safe manner.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So that will be a full time
9 thing rather than that once or twice a year, right?

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah, exactly. And it is
11 through our Municipal Alliance , I must add. I think that's
all I have.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: All right. Commissioner Evans
13 isn't here, but he has a cancellation of property tax credits
14 and delinquencies. It looks like that's just a clean-up.
15 Establish a petty cash account, which is a normal, annual
16 thing. And fix the rate of interest charged for non-payment
17 of taxes (indiscernible) required by law. Commissioner
18 Tucci, can you read those?

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Sure.

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you. And I have an award
21 of a fair and open contract to Amano McGann. This is for
22 parking meters in the parking lots, different than the ones
23 that we had demonstrated here. These are very similar to
24 the ones we have now. They're just upgraded in their
25 technology.

1 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Do they take cards?

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I think they may take cards.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Credit cards?

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah, they take cards. Reject
5 sealed bids, purchase of surplus equipment. It's a bunch of
6 transfer and rejecting of the vegetation bids by the three
7 companies: one for non-compliance and two for being over
8 what we had budgeted. And advertise for sealed bids for --
9 to go back out for the vegetative waste.

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Can I just be nosey for one
11 moment?

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Sure.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: How didn't they comply? They
14 didn't include grass and leaves?

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They handed in a document late.

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: So it wasn't what they were
17 accepting, it was a procedural thing.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They didn't comply with -- yeah.

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Okay. Okay, thanks.

20 MR. GENITEMPO: The bid said attached, but they
21 didn't attach it.

22 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: But they didn't attach it.

23 MR. GENITEMPO: It was critical to the bid so --

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I just wanted to make sure
25 there wasn't something going on where people were only

1 taking leaves and not grass or something like that.

2 MR. GENITEMPO: No. And then the other two bids
3 were above our budget and (indiscernible) the next one.

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. Good, thank you.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: And then we're going to re-
6 advertise. So that's all I have. Madam Clerk?

7 MADAM CLERK: We have nothing, other than the bill
8 list. And that's it.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Genitempo, anything?

10 MR. GENITEMPO: Just a couple of things in
11 executive, litigation related.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Can we have a motion to go into
13 executive session for litigation matters?

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Move it.

15 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Second.

16 MADAM CLERK: Whereas, Section 8 of the Open

14 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for
15 Commissioner Evans. He's absent/excused this evening.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Can we have a moment of silence.
17 We lost one of our longtime employees this week, Patti
18 Conroy, to her courageous fight with breast cancer. So
19 (indiscernible).

20 (Pause)

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Madam Clerk, bills.

22 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor. Bill list for Tuesday,
23 January 3rd, 2017. Public Affairs, \$93,600; Revenue and
24 Finance, \$3,183,237.47; Public Safety, \$789.79; Public
25 Works, \$710,188.05; Parks and Public Property, \$659,738.96;

1 total payroll, \$806,913.92, for a grand total of
2 \$5,454,477.19.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Move the bills.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

5 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

6 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

7 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

8 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

9 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

11 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

13 Public comment on agenda items only. Madam Clerk?

14 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

15 All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners
16 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone
17 and provide their name and address for the record. Unless
18 further time is granted by the Board, each person shall
19 limit their address to three minutes. All remarks to the
20 Board and its individual members must be addressed to the
21 Mayor. The Mayor may defer citizens' comments to the
22 appropriate member of the board. Dialogue between citizens
23 and others addressing the Board shall be allowed unless the
24 Mayor or presiding officer, or the majority of the
25 membership of the Board, shall determine that the interest

1 of decorum and/or the expeditious comment of municipal
2 business are being adversely affected by such dialogue.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
4 the Board of Commissioners on agenda items only?

5 MR. MOORE: Rory Moore, 462 Chestnut Street.
6 Mr. Petracco, I just have one quick question. You're
7 putting that box in. Who's going to empty it? It's an
8 environmental question actually.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah, you know what, I
10 know -- that's actually a pretty good question. I know that
11 we don't empty it into our waterways because of the fish and
12 all that stuff.

13 MR. MOORE: Right.

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But actually, I've got to
15 find out exactly who's going to be in charge of that.
16 That's a good question.

17 MR. MOORE: I was just curious because
18 environmentally, you just can't dump it.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right. And we -- I'm sure
20 they do it properly, but I'll get back to you as far as what
21 the policies are going to be.

22 MR. MOORE: I was just -- I'm taking a class and
23 it came up as an environmental issue how you empty that and
24 that is an environmental concern.

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, even back in the old

1 days, even myself when you have these prescriptions and all
2 the sensitivity around these prescriptions to get them out
3 of your medicine cabinets with everything that's come to
4 light the last 10, 20 years. You know, even myself, I
5 almost dumped prescription bottles down in the toilet bowl.
6 But you know, it stopped me from doing it and you know, now
7 we properly do it. So it's a good question. Thank you.

8 Mayor Scarpelli, before we had a conversation, you
9 explained the parking meter. Would you (indiscernible)
10 public, please? I thought it was a very good explanation.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Sure. The parking meters that
12 are on the agenda tonight are for the parking lots, not the
13 parking meters that we demonstrated a couple of months ago.
14 These are totally different. And we're doing that because
15 the technology in the current ones that are in the parking
16 lot do not communicate with each other or with the cell
17 tower. So we have to upgrade.

18 Would anybody else like to address the Board of

13 her wake and on Thursday will be the funeral. So again,
14 stellar employee. She'll be missed. All of us at Public
15 Safety went through this terrible sickness with her and it's
16 just awful how many lives this cancer has taken. So
17 hopefully in the future -- near future, there will be a
18 cure. Thank you.

7 cancel property tax credits or delinquent amounts of less
than \$10.00.

16 late payment of taxes provided by law; and

17 Whereas, R.S. 54:4-67 has been amended to permit
18 the fixing of said rate of 8 percent per annum on the first
19 \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18 percent per annum on any
20 amount in excess of \$1,500.00;

21 Now, therefore, be it resolved, by the Board of
22 Commissioners, of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
23 State of New Jersey as follows:

24 1. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized and
25 directed to charge 8 percent per annum on all taxes becoming

1 delinquent after the due date, subject to any abatement or
2 discount for the late payment of taxes provided by law.

3 2. Effective January 1, 2017, quarterly tax
4 payments made by cash, check or money order shall have a 10
5 day grace period.

6 3. Any payments not made in accordance with
7 Section 2 of this resolution shall be charged interest from
8 the due date, as set forth in Section 1 of this resolution.

1 support and help communities fight drug abuse, donated a
2 drop box that can be used by the residents to get rid of
3 their unwanted drugs. This helps to keep prescription drugs
4 out of the hands of children and the teenagers. This was
5 brought about by the Nutley Municipal Alliance. The
6 resolution:

7 Whereas, the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention
8 Team (ADAPT) has received a grant from the New Jersey
9 Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services to prevent
10 and minimize substance abuse; and

11 Whereas, through a collaboration with the Nutley
12 Municipal Alliance and the Nutley Police Department, ADAPT
13 is willing to purchase and donate a permanent prescription
14 drug disposal box which will be placed in police
15 headquarters for the purpose of safe and proper disposal of
16 prescription drugs; and

17 Now, therefore, be it resolved, by the Board of
18 Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
19 State of New Jersey, that the Township gratefully accepts
20 this donation.

16 Wednesday, January 25, 2017 at 3:00 pm prevailing time, at
17 which time they will be opened and read.

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

20 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

24 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

1 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

3 That concludes the business portion of our
4 meeting.

5
6 Madam Clerk, will you read the notice?

7 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

8 All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners
9 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone
10 and provide their name and address for the record. Unless
11 further time is granted by the Board, each person shall
12 limit their address to five minutes. All remarks to the
13 Board and its individual members must be addressed to the
14 Mayor. The Mayor may defer citizens' comments to the
15 appropriate member of the Board. Dialogue between citizens
16 and others addressing the Board shall be allowed unless the
17 Mayor or presiding officer, or the majority of the
18 membership of the Board, shall determine that the interest
19 of decorum and/or the expeditious comment that municipal
20 business are being adversely affected by such dialogue.

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
22 the Board of Commissioners this evening?

23 MS. QUIRK: Terry Quirk, 45 Hampton Place,
24 spokesperson for the Nutley Parent Advocacy Network. First
25 of all, happy new year to all of you. I know it's been a

1 new year and hopefully it will be a good one. I just have a
2 couple of questions. In regards to the notice that Mrs.
3 Pettas just said right now about addressing the Board
4 of Education. I know I go to a lot of meetings and I just
5 want to make sure that when you come to this meeting, it's a
6 little different than when you go to the Board of Ed
7 meetings because you just really speak just to the
8 president. Here it's a little different.

9 But my concern is I did see a meeting from last
10 month where someone got up and spoke to members of audience
11 and I was just wondering, that's not a new rule, is it?
12 That's not something that we would usually go by because I
13 know that when I get up to the microphone, I speak directly
14 to whoever I need to speak to. So I was wondering if that's
15 a new rule.

16 So in regards to that, I just could tell from that
17 particular meeting that things were pretty tense and just
18 because it's a new year and I just want it to be a new
19 beginning with people, I just want things to be a little bit
20 better in regards to how people treat one another. So in
21 the future, if we get up to the microphone, perhaps we
22 should think about what we say before we say it. That's
23 just my question or my feeling about something.

24 But here's a question that I have for you, Mr.
25 Mayor. I really do love those intersections in front of the

1 schools and I was just wondering if there's any way that
2 we'll get new ones, specifically around the high school area
3 where kids are having to go across the Franklin Avenue
4 during lunchtime, around New Street. Would there be an
5 opportunity to look into putting out one of those
6 intersections that you have in front of Lincoln, and Spring
7 Garden, and all of those others?

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Franklin Avenue is a county
9 road. We'll take that under advisement, Ms. Quirk.

10 MS. QUIRK: Thank you.

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Mayor, before -- Terry,
12 before you sit down. Would you mind if I make a comment? I
13 just want you to know because I saw your face on -- your
14 post on NJ Hometown. I don't know if you're aware of this.
15 Those intersections were a joint effort by Public Safety and
16 DPW. We encumbered the money and the mayor was nice enough
17 to install them for us to save some money. So I believe
18 that we did encumber some more money this year for that.
19 But I remember that we did look into Franklin Avenue. And I
20 don't know how far we got, even if it's a county road, if we
21 can do something there with the permission (indiscernible)
22 maybe. But it is something to look into because I know that
23 intersection is busy but I just want you to know it is a
24 joint effort.

25 MS. QUIRK: Thank you so much.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You're welcome.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody else like to
3 address the Board of Commissioner this evening? None?

4 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Motion to close.

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: And the time is 7:52.
