MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank You, Madam Clerk. Commissioner Petracco, what do you have on the agenda tonight?

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I have a couple resolutions it looks like. I have this fire truck apparatus on here. I have the grant of a medical leave, a budget transfer of 10,000, and I have the copiers back on, there were three copiers. That's all I have.

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner. Commissioner Evans?

COMMISSIONER EVANS: I've got -- just have two resolutions, one for granting of a property tax exemption for a 100 percent disabled veteran, some refunds of overpayments. We have about 8400 bucks in outstanding checks that need to be canceled, they're outstanding for over a year. And a refund on some escrow monies, and a transfer to capital, a budget transfer for (indiscernible).

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Tucci?
COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I have a Shade Tree Report for the month of October, and I have three resolutions. The first one is awarding a contract for insurance, accident and safety review to the $C$. Walter Searle Agency, not exceeding 10,000. The second is for C. Walter Searle Agency to serve as our risk manager, and the third is authorizing a three-year agreement with Altice Business for internet and long distance

phone service. And that's all I have.
MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner.
Let me go through Commissioner Rogers's first, I'll take his. He's got a contract with Northwest Essex for \$20,000. He has an authorization to -- with -- for a contract with the New Jersey Association of Retarded Citizens, not to exceed 1,000. He has a municipal services agreement solids for Arbor Hills, and then he has three resolutions for recognizing Alzheimer's Awareness Month, World Diabetes Day, and National Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month.

And I have the authorization for raffles and award of a professional service contract for Pennoni, that's for doing a hydraulic study on our water system to see what it would take to get off North Water. So, that's all I have. Madam Clerk?

THE CLERK: Yes, Mayor. We have regular meeting minutes, and Holy Family Church has submitted a request to have a $50 / 50$ on a Sunday, December 29 th. And that's it.
