10	this, and with the help and advice of some of the other
11	commissioners, or the other commissioners, we were able
12	to pass a resolution waiving the retail food license
13	fees for our restaurants for the 2021 calendar year.
14	Whereas, due to the COVID-19 Coronavirus
15	Pandemic, the restaurant and hospitality industry has
16	been among the hardest hit of the industries worldwide;
17	Whereas, due to the COVID-19 Coronavirus
18	Pandemic, the restaurant and food establishments have
19	seen record closures and layoffs since March, 2020;
20	Whereas, many of our own local food
21	establishments are struggling to keep their doors open;
22	and
23	Whereas, the Nutley Board of Commissioners is
24	dedicated to assisting the Retail Food Industry, an
25	industry that has long been part of the rich culture

1	and identity of our town.
2	Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of
3	Commissioners of the Township of Nutley in the County
4	of Essex, State of New Jersey, that all retail food
5	establishment fees for 2021 will be waived due to
6	hardships experienced by the Food and Hospitality
7	Industry since March of 2020 as a result of the
8	COVID-19 health pandemic. So moved.
9	COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Second.
10	THE CLERK: Commissioner Kelly?
11	COMMISSIONER KELLY: Aye.

6	for the 2021 year.

11	authorized to enter into a municipal services agreement
12	for solid waste collection disposal with 432 Owners

14	form approved by the Township Attorney. Funds in the
15	amount of \$18,144 are available from
16	Account 1-01-138-275.

8	Commission has granted an extension of liquor licensing
9	through March, this resolution extends what was
10	originally a deadline of November 30th will now allow
11	all of our restaurants that have been utilizing
12	sidewalks as well as parking and other areas to
13	continue to do that through March of 2021. And the fee
14	that's normally associated with applications will is
15	waived, that \$100 fee is currently waived.
16	We continue to have good compliance by the
17	town in terms of owner/operators of businesses, but
18	it's important that we encourage everyone to recognize
19	that COVID is still with us, and that the risks are
20	still with us, as well, so, continue to practice
21	wearing masks, good social distancing, and good
22	behavior when you're out in the public arena.
23	So with that, I move Resolution Number
24	236-20. So move.

17	actually allowing Kingsland Street Renewal to become
18	the redeveloper for the purpose of building an elevated
19	skywalk that will connect their parking garage in
20	Clifton to the existing elevated skywalk in Nutley.
21	So now therefore be it resolved by the Mayor
22	and the Board of Commissioners of the Township of
23	Nutley as follows:
24	Section One. The second amendment to the
25	redevelopment agreement by and between the township as

a redevelopment entity and Kingsland Street Urban
Renewal, concerning the walkway substantially in the
form attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby authorized
and approved, subject to any and all conditions
contained therein, and such revisions are deemed
advisable by the counsel of the Township.

Section Two. The Mayor and the Township is hereby authorized to execute a second amendment to the redevelopment agreement and the Township Clerk is hereby authorized to attest said signature and to affix the seal of the township unto the same, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, with such changes as deemed satisfactory, desirable, or necessary, by township counsel.

Section Three. Upon the effective date of the second amendment for the redevelopment agreement, the township representatives, in consultation with the township's consultants, internal staff, are each hereby authorized and directed to perform the obligations and exercise the rights of the township thereunder, in a manner consistent therewith and with the redevelopment law.

Section Four. The Township Clerk is hereby directed to publish and post the notice of this resolution as required by applicable law.

11	MR. MOORE: What is the is there an intent
12	on the town to do something with those properties?
13	DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: The intent of the town
14	is to evaluate areas where there's a potential to
15	redevelop it to a new future use. Particularly, it
16	started with the Ciccolini property itself, recognizing
17	that it has been a furniture store, and what would the
18	future use be? It's been a while in coming, but we're
19	now proceeding with what can what's the possible
20	range of options for what that property can be
21	converted into.
22	By declaring it in need of redevelopment, it
23	allows us to adjust the zoning in that area, as well as
24	to actually issue an RP that could actually take the
25	future of selling that property to a future third party

1	who would be the redeveloper at that point.
2	In addition with that, in that area, certain
3	of the properties were looked at as to see what their
4	condition was, and are they eligible, but certain of
5	the properties were evaluated, and are but are not
6	part of redevelopment, they're part of rehabilitation,
7	which is another section of the code, and that's simply
8	that helps those property owners, that if they were
9	to improve their buildings, that they would have some
10	tax reliefs for a period of time.
11	MR. MOORE: Okay, thank you.
12	DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Okay? Is there anyone
13	else?
14	THE CLERK: There's no one else.
15	DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Seeing no one, I move to
16	close the public comment period.
17	COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

16	Township of Nutley in the County of Essex and State of
17	New Jersey desires to proceed into closed executive
18	session.
19	And now therefore be it resolved by the Board
20	of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley to move into
21	closed executive session to discuss personnel and
22	potential litigation.
23	Be it further resolved that the time when
24	such discussion may be disclosed to the public shall be
25	when and such disclosure may be made without adversely

1	affecting the Township of Nutley, pending and/or legal,
2	personnel, contractual matters and other matters within
3	the exceptions provided for by statute.
