MAYOR TUCCI: There's no one there? Thank you very much. Board of Commissioner announcements. Commissioner Scarpelli?

COMMISSIONER EVANS: I have none, Mayor.
MAYOR TUCCI: Commissioner Petracco?
COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I don't really have an announcement, but $I$ just want to say that at our holiday tree lighting this year, first of all, I'm a big traditional guy in Nutley, and when $I$ saw the Christmas tree off to the side, I actually said to Sam Carella, did somebody lose their mind? I said, I hate
the way that looks, but of course, it was during the day. But $I$ have to tell you, when they lit it up, it is magnificent. It really looks great. You know, we saved the church by doing that as well, and a lot of people have been commenting, even though we did it on Zoom. I was in Centre Ridge the other day, someone grabbed me and said, you know what, they're so happy to see that we're continuing to try to do some things to make people feel good during this virus. So I have to say, kudos to your department, Mayor, (indiscernible) looks great. I really like it a lot, and so do a lot of other people.

MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: I just was going to echo that. I thought the tree lighting ceremony was really great. It was very thoughtful. I think well done. As well as the Santa drive-by. I think, you know, all of these things that we're doing to keep the spirit of traditions alive and well in Nutley, I think are really well. And I just really want to shout out to the resident on King Street who sent me a Christmas card. It was very thoughtful. It's the first one I've gotten in 18 years as the Revenue and Finance Commissioner. So taking my picture off the tax bill probably was a
good idea. So --
MAYOR TUCCI: The commissioner has a good sense of humor this evening. Thank you. I have a few announcements to make this evening.

As was already mentioned, on Monday, December 7th, we had our tree lighting, which was virtual, and I have to give a shout out to our IT wizards, Sal Scarpelli and Jason Kirk, for doing such an outstanding job. And on Sunday, this past Sunday, the 13th, we had Santa in front of the middle school with a horse drawn sleigh, and it was just phenomenal. You could see the smiles on peoples' faces. It was a mission accomplished. We try to lift peoples' spirits at this time of the year under the conditions that we're working under.

So I need to say some thank yous to some folks. Number one, the men and women of my Parks Department. They have done a superb job. There's not enough kudos and credit $I$ can give to them. What they've done in the Mudhole, what they did with the tree, and all of the other decorations was phenomenal. I need to thank the Board of Education grounds crew, Timmy and company, for giving us a big assist. It was phenomenal, the way everyone worked together really warmed my heart.

Our Public Safety Department, our Fire -- our Fire Department for putting up the wreaths, our Police Department for helping out with Santa and the sleigh. Our DPW for the guidance that they gave us, because really, the Parks Department, we were in uncharted waters, all right, this was the first year the mayor's office has been in our department, so Joe, thank you and all your people for all your help.

Public Affairs, Commissioner Kelly, for pitching in wherever he could, and was always willing to help. Revenue and Finance, I know you were always with us, Tom, and --

MAYOR TUCCI: -- I know there's bills on there tonight.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: There are.
MAYOR TUCCI: The bills are fine, so thank you very much, so --

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Getting paid.
MAYOR TUCCI: -- this is what Nutley is about. This is a team effort, all right, and, you know, I was speaking with Commissioner Scarpelli before the meeting started, and naturally, the children driving by, with seeing Santa in the sleigh, were smiles from ear to ear. Even some of the grumpier
older people who were coming by, who were a little tentative in smiling, by the time they got to Santa, were smiling like, unbelievably. So again, mission accomplished. Thank you, everyone, for all of your help. Without everyone's help, it wouldn't have been as successful as both events were.

Commissioner Kelly's also asked me to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays. He's on active duty in the military. I think he's confined to his computer. I'm not exactly sure what that set up is, but it's the military, and he's doing his duty. So, Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays from Commissioner Kelly.

I was also on a call this morning with the County Executive and the Governor's Office relative to the Covid vaccinations, which will start next week at 235 Prospect Avenue in West Orange at the former K-Mart building, and towns that will be participating at the site are West Orange, Cedar Grove, Essex Fells, Montclair, Newark, Nutley, and Verona. And the first folks to get the shots will be our First Responders and those in nursing homes.

They're also soliciting people to volunteer, all right, because they need people to help them with some administrative duties, and they're also looking
for folks with medical backgrounds, either nursing or some other type of medical background to volunteer and to help out.

I also have to have another shout out this evening to Tom McEnery. Congratulations, Tom, on being the Ghiblan (ph) Association awardee for their Community Prestige Award. That happened this past Sunday, for all you do not only for Nutley but throughout the state, so thank you, Tom. And in conclusion, $I$ just want to wish everyone all the happiness and blessings and magic of this season. No matter what you celebrate, if you celebrate Christmas, Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, Happy Kwanzaa or any other festive type occasion you want to celebrate, enjoy yourself. We're under difficult times right now, but we will get through this. Nutley is Nutley because of what everyone in this town does and how everyone pitches in, and I'm just so proud to be able to serve here with my fellow commissioners, so Happy Holidays to everyone.

Whereas, when the National Guard's oldest regiment met for their first drill on the village green in Salem, Massachusetts, they were barely three months old, organized on December 13th, 1636, the date we now celebrate as the National Guard's birthday;

Whereas, the military tradition meant citizens organized themselves into military units, responsible for their own defense. Organizing the
militia into regiments increased its efficiency and responsiveness, which proved critical for the defense of their communities. Its oldest units, like the one pictured above, are the oldest units in the United States Military, and among the oldest military units in the world;

Whereas, the militia called the National Guard since 1916, has served community, state, and nation for nearly 400 years, and citizen soldiers have fought in every major American conflict from 1637 to present day operations in Afghanistan and Iraq. Much has changed since the "first muster;"

Whereas, from the Revolution to the Civil War to the World Wars to the present day, the Township of Nutley is thankful for the -- and is proud to support the United States National Guard on the occasion of the National Guard's 384th birthday. The township remembers those who have sacrificed to serve their nation and thanks and recognizes the National Guard veterans who call Nutley home today.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, recognizes and celebrates the United States National Guard on its 384th birthday. I proudly move the resolution.

Whereas, the performance of said professional service requires knowledge of advanced -- of an advanced type in the field of learning acquired by a prolonged formal course of specialized training study as distinguished from general academic instruction, or apprenticeship and training; and

Whereas, funds are available for this account
-- for this purpose from Account 1-01-012-205, subject to the adoption of the 2021 budget;

Whereas, services rendered pursuant to the resolution shall not exceed $\$ 65,000$ in the aggregate;

Whereas, Inglesino, Webster, Wyciskala, and Taylor has completed and submitted a business entity disclosure certification, which certifies that they have not made any disqualifying reportable contributions to a political candidate committee in the township of Nutley in the previous one year, as that would violate N.J.S.A. 19:44-A20.5, or the township's local Pay-To-Play ordinance, adopted by referendum; Whereas, the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 as amended requires that this resolution be publicly advertised.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley that in accordance with the Local Public Contract Law hereby authorizes and approves the award of a professional services contract to the firm of Inglesino, Webster, Wyciskala, Taylor, LLC, pursuant to a non-fair and open process, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 as legal counsel in accordance with a contract for professional services, which shall provide that the legal counsel or any attorney on staff
shall be paid an hourly rate of $\$ 215$ for legal services, an hourly rate of $\$ 100$ for services performed by a paralegal or law clerk.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Whereas, the Township of Nutley has a need to acquire the services of a registered municipal accountant to conduct an annual audit of the Township's books, accounts, and financial transactions, inclusive of the Nutley Public Library within five months after the close of its fiscal year as a non-fair and open contract pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 and 20.5 as appropriate;

Whereas, the Chief Financial Officer has determined and certified in writing that the value of the aggregate services provided by the vendor for one year will exceed $\$ 30,000$; and

Whereas, the anticipated term is one year, beginning January 1, 2021 through December 31st, 2021;

Whereas, Nisivoccia LLP, Certified Public Accountants and Consultants, 200 Valley Road, Suite 300, Mount Arlington, New Jersey, has submitted a fee
schedule totaling $\$ 163,219.89$ for providing such services;

Whereas, Nisivoccia LLP Certified Public Accountants and Consultants, has completed and submitted a business entity disclosure certification, which certifies that they have not made any disqualifying reportable contributions or political -to a political or candidate committee in the Township of Nutley within the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit them from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract;

Whereas, funds are available from Account 1-01-222-205 in the amount of $\$ 95,543.12$ and Accont 1-05-706-205 in the amount of $\$ 67,676.77$. The second account is actually for the library, as it's its -they split the total amount. And these will be certified by the Chief Financial Officer subject to the adoption of the 2021 Budget.

Whereas, Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 as amended requires that this resolution be publicly advertised.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley as follows:

1. The Board of Commissioners, in accordance with Local Public Contract Law, hereby authorizes and approves the appointment of DMR Architects, PC as the

Township Professional Planner and Consultant in connection with such specialized professional planning services required or desirable for the investigation and redevelopment of the property identified in this resolution.
2. On the official Tax Map of the Township of Nutley known as the Ciccolini Redevelopment area in an amount not to exceed $\$ 25,000$, pursuant to a non-fair and open process in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5. The Chief Financial Officer of the Township has executed or will execute a certification of funds for the appointment and that sufficient funds are available for said appointment.
3. The Business Entity Disclosure Certification, Business Entity Disclosure of Campaign Contribution, and Determination of Value shall be placed on file with this resolution.
4. A copy of the resolution or a summary thereof shall be published within 10 days of its adoption, or as otherwise required by law, and
5. The resolution shall take effect immediately, but no sooner than as permitted by law. I move the resolution.

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.
THE CLERK: Commissioner Evans.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.
THE CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.
COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.
THE CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli.

MAYOR TUCCI: Aye. That concludes our formal business this evening; we will now open the meeting to the public.

THE CLERK: All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners regarding community concerns should approach -- should state their name and address for the record. Unless further time is granted by the Board, each person shall limit their address to five minutes. All remarks of the Board and its individual members must be addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer citizens' comments to the appropriate member of the Board.

MR. MOORE: Rory Moore, 462 Chestnut Street. Can you hear me?

MAYOR TUCCI: Yes, we can, Mr. Moore.
MR. MOORE: Okay. Mayor Tucci, I have a question about the plan that you're speaking of, for between Vreeland and High Street. I received an OPRA response this week. Is there a plan in place right
now, or a preliminary plan, because you had Inglesino as being in charge of the contract, it looks like.

MAYOR TUCCI: Sorry, I couldn't hear what you were saying, Mr. Moore. Could you --

MR. MOORE: That's all right.
MAYOR TUCCI: -- please repeat that for me?
MR. MOORE: Is there a plan in place, or do we have any kind of idea of what the redevelopment will look like between Vreeland and High Street? I know that's --

MAYOR TUCCI: No, Mr. Moore. We are in the very early steps of the process, in declaring it in need, an area in need of redevelopment, and rehabilitation. At the appropriate time, we will go out and solicit recommendation (audio interference) all right, from people that do this type of work, developers, redevelopers, which of course we will lend guidance to as far as what our vision is, as a board, all right, but we must also be cognizant of the fact that there are market forces that come into play here, and whatever we move forward with, we want to ensure to the best of our ability that it's successful.

MR. MOORE: Is it -- is the public going to have any portion to add comments to that before the final solution?

MAYOR TUCCI: Yes, Mr. Moore. The public is plugged into the process pretty much every step of the way.

MR. MOORE: Okay, thank you.
MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you. Have a good evening. Merry Christmas.

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Move to adjourn.
THE CLERK: There's no one else, Mayor.
MAYOR TUCCI: Before we move to adjourn, just one more little piece of business. I'd like to thank Belleville Mayor Michael Melham for holding up his end of the Nutley/Belleville Mayor's Cup Football Game, relative to the pizza bet that we made. He supplied two pizzas for the Board of Commissioners, and we thank you for that, and we look forward to next year's game. Yes, Commissioner Scarpelli?

COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Thank You, Mayor.
As we sit here, we are awaiting a snowstorm on Wednesday night and into Thursday. Just asking everybody to stay safe. Get the cars off the road when they're snow covered, and please don't throw the snow back into the street. It promises to be a significant snowstorm, and hopefully, the weather forecasters are wrong, but we will see what happens. But just everybody stay safe, and stay off the street till
they're cleared. Thank you.
MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you, Commissioner.
Anyone else? I'll entertain that motion now, Commissioner.
