14	ceremony with ten people or less, instituting social
15	distancing. So all of the commissioners have in fact
16	been invited to that, and we will get final details and
17	distribute those.
18	As part of ongoing conversations with
19	commissioners and other folks in our community, there's
20	a couple of committees I'm thinking about establishing.
21	One is a small business community, and I had a
22	conversation with Commissioner Evans about this, to see
23	how we can assist our small businesses, because many of
24	them, because of the restrictions that are imposed, all
25	right, are feeling severe financial hardship. So it

may be a good idea for us to get together. We'll form a committee and see how we can help them. We'll get input from them and move forward in that regard.

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Earlier today, at the reorganization meeting, Commissioner Petracco mentioned the school expansion issue that we have. That's another committee that I'm thinking about establishing, all right, with the respective commissioners that want to serve on that. Obviously, I know the two of you have interests in these two areas, so we can begin dialogue with the Board of Education, all right, and see how we can get to a place that's affordable, that gives our students the facilities that are required. And that's all I have for announcements. Anyone else? Seeing none, I see we have no ordinance introductions this evening. We have no ordinances on second reading, so we'll move in to resolutions. Commissioner Kelly has none this evening. Commissioner Evans, would you like to read your resolution?

19	was memorialized by the BPU in accordance with order of
20	amendment dated June 21st, 2010; and
21	Whereas, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1, the
22	BPU issued a renewal of Cablevision's system-wide
23	franchise effective March 28th, 2016, granting
24	Cablevision the authority to operate Cablevision
25	stations within the jurisdictions set forth in its

application, including the Township; and 1 Whereas, Cablevision is undertaking the 2 upgrade of its cable television system to a fully Fiber 3 to the Home system, which required the installation of 4 three Remote Optic Light Terminals and associated 5 equipment within the Municipal Right-Of-Way located 6 7 within the township; and Whereas, the Mayor and the Board of 8 9 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley are in possession of a request from Cablevision to install the 10 11 ROLT and associated equipment at the following locations within the Municipal Right-Of-Way: Grant 12 13 Avenue, adjacent to Block 6702, Lot 19; Church Street, adjacent to Block 5900, Lot 1; Hancox Avenue, adjacent 14 15 to Block 9305, Lot 7. 16 Whereas, Cablevision is authorized to install said ROLT in the Municipal Right-Of-Way, subject to 17 18 applicable municipal permitting, pursuant to its right 19 granted under the State Cable Law, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1, 20 and under federal cable law 47 U.S.C. Section 521; and 21 Whereas, Cablevision has submitted Construction Permits, Building Subcode and Electrical 22 23 Subcode Applications with the Township Code Enforcement 24 Officer has said -- recommends that such authorization

Hello everyone, and congratulations, Mayor Tucci --6 7 MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you. 8 MS. ROSSI: -- on your appointment. I look 9 forward to some wonderful changes taking place in town. I have -- my first question this evening is, I 10 understand that the Township now has a hiring freeze. 11 Is the Board currently considering a salary freeze for 12 13 Township employees? MAYOR TUCCI: Ms. Rossi, the hiring freeze is 14 15 in effect. A salary freeze could very likely be in effect as we get more information, all right, and we 16 find out to what extent that there's financial distress 17 18 in the Township, we will take the appropriate action. 19 MS. ROSSI: Great, thank you. My next question is, what is the exact amount of transition 20 21 aid, transitional aid that has been received from the 22 state at this point? 23 MAYOR TUCCI: Commissioner Evans, would you 24 like to address that? 25 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. Ms. Rossi, are

you -- for this year, or on a cumulative basis?

MS. ROSSI: For this year.

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- COMMISSIONER EVANS: Eighty-five percent of
 the \$3,250,000 we got last year, so -- I don't have the
 number exactly in front of me, but it's about 2.7,
 \$2.8 million.
 - MS. ROSSI: Okay. And then are additional funds anticipated? And if so, how much, and when will we know?

COMMISSIONER EVANS: We won't know -- yes. We anticipate that the remaining 15 percent that was held back is -- that that would come later in the year, based upon my conversations. We -- but keep in mind, and we're very sensitive to this as well, given your first question, that we have a commitment from the The money is usually transferred to us later in the year, in the November/December time frame. So my expectation is that we will receive that aid, because it's directly related to the medical school decision that was made -- that -- which we made a number of years ago, to allow the school to be there, versus another economic driver. So I expect that money to come through, but, having said that, the -- and it -- I have no information from the state otherwise, you know, it's not -- the money is not in our pocket yet, and

1 that could result in a change later in the year. MS. ROSSI: Okay, thank you. 2 3 MAYOR TUCCI: Alan? MR. GENITEMPO: Okay, next? implementing zero-based budgeting going forward, and was looking to see, was the 2020 budget implemented using zero-based budgeting?

it? No. When you look at zero-based budgeting, one of the guiding principles that we look at is really actually geared to the tax rate. In order to change the tax rate by one penny, either increase the rate by one penny, or decrease it by one penny, which is on an annual basis, it's \$50 a year to the average taxpayer, we need to identify \$325,000 worth of new revenue, or identify \$325,000 of deductions in costs to achieve that.

So for this particular budget, we wanted to achieve a zero impact on the levy, which required us to identify over \$2 million worth of cuts or revenue infusions to make that happen. So to this point, we follow more of a model which was around how to keep the zero to the levy, the municipal levy flat. As we look at collections, more aggressive aspects of how we look at the budget will be in order as we move forward, but not yet.

I do want to clarify, you know, everyone seems to be saying something about we didn't follow zero-based budgeting principles before. That's

erroneous. So let's clear it up.

When we did this review, not the past year, but the year before, as many of you actually recall, we did not go down to paper clips and pencils. We got close to that, but again, it's guided by what is a requirement, so we have something to -- for example, our collective bargaining agreements, and what are our commitments around that, and what are the statutory requirements of costs that must be in place for every municipality? And then once we got through that, then it was looking at the degree of discretionary spending that was left on the table. And in that particular year, we cut \$2.9 million out of the budget in order to achieve that.

So to understand the philosophy and the principles fully around zero-based budgeting, the answer to your question would be not -- we didn't look at the paper clips. We looked at the things that actually had the ability to move the budget, and actually benefit the taxpayer.

One last point on that. In order to reduce a taxpayer's simple tax bill \$100, we need to identify \$1 million worth of cuts for the size of the cuts in order to create a beneficial (indiscernible) statutory requirements that are in place on every municipality in

the state, is really a very significant undertaking. 1 I'm quite proud of the work that we did. 2 I appreciate the perspective and the criticism that's been had, but 3 I'm proud of the work of this Board as we go into this 4 next phase, especially given -- in light of the COVID 5 environment. You can rest assured that we will begin, 6 7 again, to take a hard look at our budget. 8 MAYOR TUCCI: Mr. Cullari, anything else? 9 MR. CULLARI: No, that's it. 10 MR. We donate pet food through Nutley Family 14 15 Service Bureau to prevent surrenders and to help people keep their pets. CPAWNJ volunteers also work with the 16 Bloomfield Animal Shelter, which provides animal 17 18 control services to Nutley. 19 The outdoor cat population has exploded with 20 the mild winter and spring, particularly with COVID-19 21 conditions limiting outreach and low-cost vet services. You may know that the most effective way to reduce 22 23 outdoor cat population is to trap, neuter, vaccinate, 24 and return them to their homes, it's called TNVR. Animal control refers folks with outdoor cats to CPAWNJ 25

and we try to help them. If Nutley would promote this 1 service to its residents, more and more cats and people 2 could be helped, and the outdoor population would be 3 4 reduced. Even better, if the township, like 5 6 Bloomfield, would allocate funds to help defray for the 7 fixing and vaccinating of cats, currently at just \$55 8 apiece, so many more cats could be helped. 9 preventative and assistive to the cats, to the environment, and to our township. What do you think? 10 11 MAYOR TUCCI: I think this is a topic that falls under the Department of Public Affairs. 12 believe Animal Control is part of that department. 13 Ιf you want to forward us any information through the 14 15 Township Clerk, we'll be happy to look at it. I'm sure Commissioner Kelly would be happy to look at it, so we 16 could -- and at that point, make an intelligent 17 18 decision as to just what we could do, either to promote 19 or possibly support it financially. 20 MS.
