21	celebrate, but raise awareness regarding prostate
22	cancer, because September is National Prostate Cancer
23	Awareness Month.
24	So, Whereas, there are more than 3.1 million
25	men in the U.S. who have been diagnosed with prostate

1 cancer; and Whereas, one in nine males in the United 2 States will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their 3 lifetimes; and 4 5 Whereas, the American Cancer Society's estimates in the United States for 2020 about 191,930 6 7 new cases of prostate cancer, and about 33,330 deaths 8 due to prostate cancer; 9 Whereas, aside from non-melanoma skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer among men in 10 the United States. It is also one of the leading 11 12 causes of cancer death among men of all races, and 13 Hispanic origin populations; Whereas, prostate cancer occurs mainly in 14 15 older men, about six in ten cases are diagnosed in men ages 65 or older, and it is rare before age 40. 16 The average age at the time of diagnosis is about 66; and 17 18 Whereas, males in the United States with one 19 family member diagnosed with prostate cancer have a 33 percent chance of being diagnosed with the disease. 20 21 Males with two close family members diagnosed have an 83 percent chance, and males with three family members 22 23 diagnosed have a 97 percent chance; 24 Whereas, there are no noticeable symptoms of 25 prostate cancer while in the early changes, making

1	screening critical. Educating people in the United
2	States, including healthcare providers, about prostate
3	cancer and early detection strategies is crucial to
4	saving lives of males and preserving and protecting
5	families.
6	Now therefore be it resolved that the Board
7	of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of
8	Essex, State of New Jersey, declare September as
9	National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. Be it
10	further resolved that we urge all men and their
11	families in the Township of Nutley to seek assistance
12	in obtaining the facts and information about prostate
13	cancer, and encourage residents to support efforts and
14	activities that bring awareness and education to
15	finding a cure. So moved.

4	Blood Cancer Month. I've had personally, I've had
5	friends who suffered from this, and luckily they were
6	able to beat it, so this is also something close to me.
7	Whereas, leukemia, lymphoma, myeloma, and
8	myelodysplastic syndromes, (MDS), are types of cancer
9	that can affect the bone marrow, blood cells, lymph
10	nodes, and other parts of the lymphatic system;
11	Whereas, approximately every three minutes,
12	one person in the United States is diagnosed with blood
13	cancer; and
14	Whereas, an estimated combined total of
15	178,520 people in the United States are expected to be
16	diagnosed with leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma in 2020;
17	Whereas, new cases of leukemia, lymphoma, and
18	myeloma are expected to account for 9.9 percent of the
19	estimated 1,806,590 new cancer cases diagnosed in the
20	U.S. in 2020; and
21	Whereas, blood cancers can be extremely
22	complex, with some patients requiring bone marrow and
23	stem cell transplants as part of their treatment;
24	
25	Whereas, an estimated 1,297,027 people in the

U.S. are either living with, or in remission from 1 leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma; 2 Whereas, the health and vitality of residents 3 -- the residents of Nutley are significantly enhanced 4 by local efforts to increase communication and 5 education pertaining to blood cancers, and raising 6 7 general awareness of the disease. Now therefore be it resolved that the Board 8 9 of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, recognizes September as 10 National Blood Cancer Month, and urge all citizens in 11 Nutley to support efforts and activities that bring 12 awareness and education to finding a cure for blood 13 cancers during the month of September and throughout 14 15 So moved. the year. Second, and I also would 16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: comment that as it relates to leukemia, lymphoma, and 17 18 multiple myeloma, that's the actual focus of research 19 that is currently underway at the Center for Discovery 20 and Innovation at the Nutley Campus Site for Hackensack 21 Medical Center. They've done significant research, and it's advancing every day, but it's right here local in 22 23 Nutley, which is a major center for research for blood 24 based cancers. I second. 25 COMMISSIONER KELLY: Thank you.
