We will move into resolutions. Commissioner Kelly?
COMMISSIONER KELLY: Thank you, Mayor. I
have three tonight. The first one is to cele-- or not celebrate, but raise awareness regarding prostate cancer, because September is National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month.

So, Whereas, there are more than 3.1 million men in the U.S. who have been diagnosed with prostate
cancer; and
Whereas, one in nine males in the United States will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetimes; and

Whereas, the American Cancer Society's estimates in the United States for 2020 about 191,930 new cases of prostate cancer, and about 33,330 deaths due to prostate cancer;

Whereas, aside from non-melanoma skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer among men in the United States. It is also one of the leading causes of cancer death among men of all races, and Hispanic origin populations;

Whereas, prostate cancer occurs mainly in older men, about six in ten cases are diagnosed in men ages 65 or older, and it is rare before age 40. The average age at the time of diagnosis is about 66; and

Whereas, males in the United States with one family member diagnosed with prostate cancer have a 33 percent chance of being diagnosed with the disease. Males with two close family members diagnosed have an 83 percent chance, and males with three family members diagnosed have a 97 percent chance;

Whereas, there are no noticeable symptoms of prostate cancer while in the early changes, making
screening critical. Educating people in the United States, including healthcare providers, about prostate cancer and early detection strategies is crucial to saving lives of males and preserving and protecting families.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, declare September as National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. Be it further resolved that we urge all men and their families in the Township of Nutley to seek assistance in obtaining the facts and information about prostate cancer, and encourage residents to support efforts and activities that bring awareness and education to finding a cure. So moved.

COMMISSIONER KELLY: The second resolution I have is 191-20. This is because September is also National Blood Cancer Month. I've had -- personally, I've had friends who suffered from this, and luckily they were able to beat it, so this is also something close to me.

Whereas, leukemia, lymphoma, myeloma, and myelodysplastic syndromes, (MDS), are types of cancer that can affect the bone marrow, blood cells, lymph nodes, and other parts of the lymphatic system;

Whereas, approximately every three minutes, one person in the United States is diagnosed with blood cancer; and

Whereas, an estimated combined total of 178,520 people in the United States are expected to be diagnosed with leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma in 2020;

Whereas, new cases of leukemia, lymphoma, and myeloma are expected to account for 9.9 percent of the estimated 1,806,590 new cancer cases diagnosed in the U.S. in 2020; and

Whereas, blood cancers can be extremely complex, with some patients requiring bone marrow and stem cell transplants as part of their treatment;

Whereas, an estimated $1,297,027$ people in the
U.S. are either living with, or in remission from leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma;

Whereas, the health and vitality of residents -- the residents of Nutley are significantly enhanced by local efforts to increase communication and education pertaining to blood cancers, and raising general awareness of the disease.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, recognizes September as National Blood Cancer Month, and urge all citizens in Nutley to support efforts and activities that bring awareness and education to finding a cure for blood cancers during the month of September and throughout the year. So moved.

COMMISSIONER EVANS: Second, and I also would comment that as it relates to leukemia, lymphoma, and multiple myeloma, that's the actual focus of research that is currently underway at the Center for Discovery and Innovation at the Nutley Campus Site for Hackensack Medical Center. They've done significant research, and it's advancing every day, but it's right here local in Nutley, which is a major center for research for blood based cancers. I second.

Whereas, during the month of September, we encourage residents to reeducate themselves in the important task of being prepared in the face of any
crisis;
Whereas, the best time to prepare for an emergency is before it happens. Residents should take time to review their own emergency plans, and update their emergency kits; and

Whereas, by discussing with our families, friends, and neighbors how we will protect ourselves and our communities, we can contribute to and share in a stronger, more resilient society; and

Whereas, federal, state, and local agencies have resources to share with the community as to how to put personal emergency kits and plans, such as www. ready.gov and www.FEMA.gov.

And now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley of the County of Essex, State of New Jersey, recognize September as National Preparedness Month, and encourage all Nutley residents to encourage the importance of preparedness and work together to enhance our resilience and readiness.
