| 17 | won't sing. I just I'll do a lead-in but I won't |
| 18 | sing. Thank you, Mayor. Tonight we have a little bit |
| 19 | of business to do. One, we are going to adopt our 2020 |
| 20 | budget. In order to do that, we have to process an |
| 21 | amendment to the budget. The budget amendment |
| 22 | recognizes that we have received authorization to adopt |
| 23 | our budget with transitional state aid in the total |
| 24 | amount of \$3,250,000. This is an amount greater than |
| 25 | what we had anticipated in our budget introduction |

earlier in the year by some \$487,000. That money is distributed across the school, the county, and the municipality. The majority of the money goes to the school and to the county.

recognizing a reduction in our budget of our construction fees for the year. We've had a significant volume in our construction office for a lot of projects, but we're not generating the revenue from those projects as consistent with some of the bigger things that have gone on in town. So as a result, our budget reflects a reduction in our co-construction fees, as well as the allocation and increase of the appropriation to the school and the county. The net is simply is at the bottom line of the budget as introduced doesn't change. We introduced a budget with a zero increase in the municipal tax rate, and we will be able to preserve that for the year.

One element I've gotten a lot of questions on as it relates to COVID expenses. So far this year, we have spent \$728,000 in COVID-related expenses. That money is coming out of a trust account that we have on the balance sheet, with permission from the state to use it, so it hasn't affected our operating budgets for the year. Of that amount, so far we've been reimbursed

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| 1 | \$650,000, with another application pending. I'm |
| 2 | anticipating that we'll continue to receive the vast |
| 3 | majority of those funds as reimbursements. So with |
| 4 | that, I move for the public hearing. |

| 18 | for the purposes stated of the sums therein, said |
| 19 | appropriations and authorizations in the amount for |
| 20 | municipal purposes, \$40,538,387.74, to be raised |
| 21 | through taxation. For the municipality, \$1,334,364.26 |
| 22 | to be raised for the library. For to cover a total |
| 23 | appropriation of \$58,360,041.96, the difference being |
| 24 | revenues that we generate throughout other areas. So |
| 25 | move. |

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One thing that the police chief told me is that the vests for the plainclothesmen has undergone a redesign which will allow identification to be available to the public. So I just wanted to make clear that in fact, my understanding is that you could not -- there was no identification, but it was not a willful attempt to cover up identification.

With that being said, I want to address the issue of the mask that the particular officer was wearing. When I spoke to the police chief, I mentioned that the mask is emblematic of Blue Lives Matter, which was in -- which would be perceived as in opposition to the group that was protesting, and he report -- he said back that no, it's not, it's Thin Blue Line, which is emblematic of standing up for fallen officers. said to him, which I'll say to you, that, you know, I certainly support officers who've given their lives, and who put their lives on the line to protect the However, that particular symbol, the Blue Live public. -- the Blue Line, is really identified in a lot of quarters, with first of all, a right-wing group, and second of all, as being parallel to Blue Lives Matter, which is seen in opposition to Black Lives Matter, or a statement opposed to Black Lives Matter.

I did a little bit of research and saw that

-- let me see -- Montclair had an issue, and Fair Lawn,

the mayor of Fair Lawn, actually for 9/11, requested

that the officers who were on display at the 9/11

ceremony, remove their -- not wear Thin Blue Line masks

for that event, because it had a political

ramification.

So, I'd like to request and suggest to the commission, that the Nutley Police Department be told that in the event where they are put in the position to have to be peacemakers in political disputes, or even, anything to do with the public, that they wear masks that are entirely neutral. They should be black, they could be tan, they could have stars on them, they could have suns on them, but they should not be anything that could be symbolically represented as being taking one part or another, which to me, undercuts the role that they're intended to play, and also is incendiary to groups that find that particular symbol offensive.

The second -- the third thing that we talked about was that -- I asked about the fact that the police were wearing guns going into the No Man's Land between the two groups, and I was told that the police always wear guns when they're on duty, which is reasonable, if that's what the ordinance is. So I'd

also like to suggest to the commission that we consider 1 in Nutley, as was done in Camden, and I understand 2 Nutley isn't a city on the size of Camden, but that 3 Nutley consider, in instances where we need 4 peacekeepers, not police forces, that there be some 5 type of a group that can be a peacemaking group without 6 7 bringing weapons into the fray. Again, I was at the 8 march, and I found the weapons to be both intimidating 9 and incendiary. Then finally, I'm trying to find out who 10 11 brought the charges against the people on Twitter who had -- were attempting to find out who the officer was 12 with the blue line -- or Thin Blue Line or Blue Lives 13 Matter mask and no identification. I -- there had to 14

have been somebody in Nutley who brought the charge,

and I'd like to find out how that came about to be.

So, those are my -- those are my points, my questions,

18 and my request.

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- MAYOR TUCCI: Thank you. Commissioner
 Petracco, would you like to respond?
 - COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I would like to respond and say that the chief is in charge of the day to day operations, so as far as bringing weapons in a safe zone, or that, I guess would be a chief's decision to make, and our chief is accredited through the FBI.

He holds a very, very high standard resume, and I have all the faith in him in the world to make these decisions.

As far as the masks are concerned, I don't really know enough about it to say it's political or not political, but we could look into that.

MR. GARBER: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And I'd just like to say that I really support all the actors, you know, the protesters for being able to say what they need to say. I really respect our police department. I think they did an outstanding job that night. And as far as the officer that you're trying to identify, I would also talk to the chief about that.

MR. GARBER: I just want to say I don't want to identify the officer. It doesn't really matter to me who he is. What's important to me is finding out how the charges got levied against those individuals who came on Twitter. Eventually, the county tossed out the charges because there wasn't adequate evidence, but I find -- to be honest, I think it's an embarrassment to Nutley, that there was a charge brought against people on Twitter trying to find out some information. And as one person said, you know, there were five people who were involved, and five people had charges

brought against them. What if there were 50,000 1 Would Nutley have brought charges against 2 people? I just -- and it's just as I say, it's 3 50,000? embarrassing for the city, and I think it undercuts -- I 4 5 agree with you. I think the police did a fine job.
