WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Murphy issued Executive Order 103 declaring a public health state of emergency arising from the dangers of the COVID-19 pandemic health crisis; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the Township of Nutley declared as well a local emergency consistent with Executive Order 103; and

WHEREAS, on March 16 and 21, 2020, Governor Murphy issued Executive Orders 104 and 107 which limited all restaurants, dining establishments and food courts, with or without a liquor license, all bars and other holders of a liquor license with retail consumption privileges, to offering food delivery and/or take-out services only; and

WHEREAS, given the decrease in the rate of reported new cases of COVID-19 cases in New Jersey and in the Township of Nutley, the State of New Jersey has relaxed certain restrictions related to restaurants, bar and food establishments by allowing outdoor dining as long as businesses comply with COVID-19 guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Health, Executive Directive 20-014, and the Department of Law and Public Safety Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, SR 2020-10, have issued compliance guidance which must be followed by restaurants, bars and dining establishments which enables them to conduct business with customers; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners are desirous of continuing to support businesses consistent with the orders herein, and now wishes to extend the prevision relief of certain provisions contained in Chapter 700.41 of the Zoning Code of the Township of Nutley, through March 2021 as may be modified by the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, in support of business reopening efforts and in recognition of the financial hardship our local businesses have sustained as a result of this Pandemic crisis, are willing to temporarily allow restaurants to utilize our public parking lots and public walkways for outdoor dining on a limited basis; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the **TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY** in the County of Essex, State of New Jersey does hereby extend the temporary relief through March 2021 as follows:

- 1. Chapter 700.41 is modified to allow both contiguous and non-contiguous outdoor seating consistent with State executive orders as long as the business owner provides evidence of a legal right to use non-contiguous property for their business.
- 2. Chapter 700.91A which requires, in certain cases, onsite parking is now modified to allow the use of parking lots for outdoor seating as long as the safety requirements of the Nutley Code Enforcement and Police Department are met.
- 3. Chapter 700.41-F(5)(b)7 application fee of \$100.00 is waived for 2020 and 2021.
- 4. Requests to use public property can be made through the single application process established by the Code Enforcement office and does not require a separate approval of the Board of Commissioners.
- 5. None of the above relieves business owners of the obligation to be compliant with the sanitary and social distancing requirements set out by the State of New Jersey.
- 6. All businesses requesting an outdoor dining permit and or alcoholic beverage permit must continue to provide bodily injury and property damages insurance coverage consistent with our ordinance naming the Township of Nutley and/or County of Essex as a covered party.
- 7. All businesses requesting an outdoor dining permit and/or alcoholic beverage permit must continue to sign an indemnification/hold harmless agreement with the Township of Nutley and/or County of Essex which also includes their agreement to comply with COVID-19 sanitary and social distancing requirements.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY AND KINGSLAND STREET URBAN RENEWAL, LLC

WHEREAS, the Township of Nutley and Kingsland Street Urban Renewal, LLC (the "<u>Redeveloper</u>") are parties to a certain Redevelopment Agreement dated as of September 29, 2016, amended by a certain Amendment to Redevelopment Agreement dated as of April 10, 2018 (collectively, the "<u>Redevelopment</u> Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Redeveloper desires to submit an application to the Planning Board seeking preliminary and final site plan approval to construct an elevated pedestrian walkway (the "<u>Walkway</u>") linking the Clifton Parking Structure to an existing elevated pedestrian walkway; and

WHEREAS, as a result of such linkage, the Walkway will allow for pedestrian access between the Clifton Parking Structure and the Hackensack Meridian Health School of Medicine (Buildings 123/123A) (located on Block 300, Lot 1.03 in Nutley and Block 80.02, Lot 4.01 in Clifton) and 111 Ideation Way (Building 102, located on Block 300, Lot 1.05 in Nutley); and

WHEREAS, the existing elevated pedestrian walkway traverses Block 300, Lots 1, 1.03, 1.04 and 1.05 in Nutley and Block 80.02, Lots 4.01 and 4.02 in Clifton connecting the School of Medicine and 111 Ideation Way; and

WHEREAS, the Walkway will traverse Block 300, Lots 1 and 1.05 in Nutley and Block 80.02, Lots 4,03 and 4.04 in Clifton; and

WHEREAS, Redeveloper has obtained site plan approval from the Clifton Planning Board for the segment of the Walkway located in Lot 4.03 in Block 80.02 in Clifton and has a pending, fully complaint application with the Clifton Planning Board for the segment of the Walkway located in Lot 4.04 in Block 80.02 in Clifton; and

WHEREAS, the segment of the Walkway to be constructed in Block 300, Lot 1 in Nutley is subject to the Phase III Redevelopment Plan adopted by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the segment of the Walkway to be constructed in Block 300, Lot 1.05 in Nutley is subject to the Phase IIA Redevelopment Plan adopted by the Township; and

WHEREAS, by action at its meeting of October 6, 2020, the Board of Commissioners determined that the Walkway is permitted by and consistent with both of the above redevelopment plans; and

WHEREAS, both of the above redevelopment plans require, as a prerequisite to a hearing by the Planning Board to review a site plan application for property within the area subject thereto, that the applicant be designated as redeveloper in connection with the subject of such application and that the applicant and the Township enter into a redevelopment agreement with respect to the subject of such application; and

WHEREAS, the Township and the Redeveloper wish to satisfy such requirements by entering into a Second Amendment to the Redevelopment Agreement (the "Second Amendment").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley as follows:

- **Section 1.** The Second Amendment to the Redevelopment Agreement by and between the Township, as a redevelopment entity, and Kingsland Street Urban Renewal, LLC, concerning the Walkway substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is hereby authorized and approved, subject to any and all conditions contained therein and such revisions as deemed advisable by counsel to the Township.
- **Section 2.** The Mayor of the Township is hereby authorized to execute the Second Amendment to the Redevelopment Agreement, and the Township Clerk is hereby authorized to attest said signature and to affix the seal of the Township unto the same, substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, with such changes as deemed satisfactory, desirable or necessary by Township counsel.
- **Section 3.** Upon the effective date of the Second Amendment to the Redevelopment Agreement, the Township representatives, in consultation with the Township's consultants and internal staff, are each hereby authorized and directed to perform the obligations and exercise the rights of the Township thereunder in a manner consistent therewith and with the Redevelopment Law.
- **Section 4.** The Township Clerk is hereby directed to publish and post notice of this resolution as required by applicable law.
 - **Section 5.** This resolution shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by applicable law.
