A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY DECLARING A CERTAIN AREA LOCATED ALONG FRANKLIN AVENUE AND SHOWN ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY AS BLOCK 3100, LOTS 28, 29, 30 AND 37 IS A NON-CONDEMNATION AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6 of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "Redevelopment Law") authorizes the governing body of any municipality, by resolution, to have its Planning Board conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether an area of the municipality is a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment" pursuant to the criteria contained in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 of the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners (the "Board") of the Township of Nutley (the "Township") considers it to be in the best interest of the Township to have the Township Planning Board conduct such an investigation of an area generally known as the Ciccolini site, consisting of certain properties located along Franklin Avenue in the Township, which properties are identified as Block 3100, Lots 28, 29, 30 and 37 on the official tax map of the Township of Nutley (collectively, the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 222, adopted October 6, 2020, the Board authorized and directed the Township Planning Board to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether the Property, or any portions thereof, constitute a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment" according to the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 of the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes the Property is potentially valuable for contributing to, serving, and protecting the public health, safety and welfare and for the promotion of smart growth within the Township; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the Planning Board, DMR Architects prepared a report entitled "Preliminary Investigation for Determination of an Area in Need of Redevelopment, Block 3100, Lots 28, 29, 30 and 37," dated November 2020, which concluded, for the reasons stated therein, that the Property meets the criteria under the Redevelopment Law supporting a declaration that the Property is a non-condemnation redevelopment area (the "Preliminary Investigation"); and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6.b(4)-(5) of the Redevelopment Law provides in pertinent part relative to the Township Planning Board's public hearing on the Preliminary Investigation and whether the Property should be designated a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment":

- "(4) At the hearing, which may be adjourned from time to time, the planning board shall hear all persons who are interested in or would be affected by a determination that the delineated area is a redevelopment area. All objections to such a determination and evidence in support of those objections, given orally or in writing, shall be received and considered and made part of the public record.
- (5) (a) After completing its hearing on this matter, the planning board shall recommend that the delineated area, or any part thereof, be determined, or not be determined, by the municipal governing body to be a redevelopment area"; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board held a duly noticed public hearing on November 4, 2020 and received public comment and evidence concerning the above-referenced Preliminary Investigation; and

WHEREAS, at the November 4, 2020 hearing, the Planning Board further concurred and agreed with the reasons stated in the Preliminary Investigation that the Property constitutes and meets the criteria under the Redevelopment Law supporting the recommendation that the Property be determined and declared a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, in a letter to the Board, dated November 10, 2020, the Planning Board recommended to the Mayor and Board that the Property be declared a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment" under the Redevelopment Law in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6; and

WHEREAS, the Board concurs and agrees with Planning Board's recommendation as supported by the reasons stated in the Preliminary Investigation that the Property constitutes and meets the criteria under the Redevelopment Law and that the Property should be determined and declared a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, State of New Jersey, that the property located along Franklin Avenue identified as Block 3100, Lots 28, 29, 30 and 37 on the official tax map of the Township of Nutley is hereby designated a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment" under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq., which designation shall authorize the Township to use all those powers under the Redevelopment Law, except that such determination shall not permit the Township to exercise the power of eminent domain; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby directs the Town Clerk to (a) serve this Resolution declaring that the property located along Franklin Avenue identified as Block 3100, Lots 28, 29, 30 and 37 on the official tax map of the Township of Nutley is designated a non-condemnation redevelopment area upon the Commissioner of the Community Affairs in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6.b(5)(c), and (b) serve notice of such designation, within ten (10) days hereof,

WHEREAS, by resolution dated October 6, 2020, the Board of Commissioners referred this resolution declaring the Property as an "area in need of rehabilitation" to the Planning Board of the Township of Nutley in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14, directing the Planning Board to review this proposed resolution and to submit its recommendations to the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board reviewed this proposed resolution and any reports and testimony provided by DMR at its meeting held on November 4, 2020; and

RESOLUTION FOR AN AGREEMENT MADE BETWEEN NORTHWEST ESSEX COMMUNITY HEALTHCARE NETWORK, A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE AGENCY") HAVING ITS PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS AT 570 BELLEVILLE AVENUE, BELLEVILLE, NEW JERSEY 07109 AND THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "NUTLEY").

WHEREAS, the Agency has agreed and functioned in the past to provide behavioral healthcare for the residents of Nutley and will continue to provide said services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this agreement, and

WHEREAS, Nutley has agreed to make bi-annual grants of funds for the partial support and maintenance of the said services rendered by the Agency to Nutley residents, and

WHEREAS, it is agreed that:

- 1. The Agency will furnish and provide behavioral healthcare services to residents of Nutley by professionally qualified personnel, and will cooperate with other Nutley community programs which deal with the provision of said services.
- 2. For services rendered by the Agency and described heretofore, during said contractual period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, Nutley agrees to pay the Agency a grant in the amount of \$20,000.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Space Force (USSF) is a new branch of the Armed Forces. It was established on December 20, 2019 with enactment of the Fiscal Year 2020 National Defense Authorization and currently has 16,000 individuals assigned to the Space Force which is an option given to the Air Force cadets at the Air Force Academy as of 2019;

WHEREAS, the primary mission of the U.S. Space Force as directed by Congress is to maintain, protect, and expand the U.S. fleet of advanced military satellites that form the backbone of U.S. global military operations;

WHEREAS, the USSF was established within the Department of the Air Force where, meaning the Secretary of the Air Force has responsibility for the USSF, under the guidance of the Secretary of Defense. Additionally, a four-star general known as the Chief of Space Operations (CSO) serves as the senior military member of the USSF;

WHEREAS, on Sept. 1, 1982, the Air Force established AFSPC, with space operations as its primary mission. Cold War-era space operations focused on missile warning, launch operations, satellite control, space surveillance and command and control for national leadership. In 1991, Operation DESERT STORM validated the command's continuing focus on support to the warfighter through the use of GPS to enable the famous "Left Hook," proving the value of space-based capabilities;

WHEREAS, after the 9/11 terrorist attacks, the president directed military action against Afghanistan and Iraq. AFSPC provided extensive space-based support to the U.S. Central Command commander in areas of communications; positioning, navigation, and timing; meteorology; and warning. In 2005, the Air Force expanded its mission areas to include cyberspace;

WHEREAS, in July 2018, the Air Force cyber mission transferred to Air Combat Command, which generated the greatest capacity for an integrated Information Warfare capability within the Air Force. This move allowed AFSPC to focus on gaining and maintaining space superiority and outpacing our adversaries in the space domain; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners, in the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, thank our Nutley members of the Space Force and recognizes and celebrates the United States Space Force on its 1st Birthday.

WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between municipalities, counties, law enforcement agencies police, Emergency Medical Service, fire departments, fire companies or EMS organizations and fire departments are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26 and 40A: 14-156.1; and

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)- 5, directed the Secretary of The Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, and local governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, including but not limited to pandemics, a declared State of Emergency, a declared Public Health Emergency or a Presidentially Declared Disaster, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, "The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act" App.A9-33 et. seq. provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency giving the Governor control over the resources of each and every political subdivision to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency; and

WHEREAS, The Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules in accordance with the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act," N.J.A.C. 52:14E-11 et. seq., commonly referred to as the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations" N.J.A.C. 5:75A et. seq.; and
