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ORDINANCE NO. 3625

ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REMEDIATION AND RESTORATION OF SOIL BEHIND THE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING, IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$125,000.00 THEREFOR

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The remediation described in Section 2 of this ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, for the purposes described in Section 2, there is hereby appropriated \$125,000.00, now available in Capital Improvement Fund as further described in Section 2(a) hereof.

Section 2. (a) The improvement hereby authorized is to remediate diesel fuel contaminated soil behind the Public Safety Building, including restoration, NJDEP reporting, project management and all necessary work to complete this project.

(b) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made, therefore.

Section 3. The capital budget of the Township of Nutley is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 4. \$125,000.00 now available in the Township's Capital Improvement Fund is hereby appropriated for the purposes set forth in Section 2 hereof and shall be applied to the direct payment of the cost of such purposes.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated: The improvements or purposes described in Section 2 of this ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.
